## Naphill Village Hall & Playing Fields Council -Chairman's Report

Registered Charity No: 300309 www.naphillvillagehall.org.uk



A zoom meeting of the committee was held on the 6 July, there were 16 members online.

Reopening of the hall was discussed and at the moment it was decided to keep the village hall closed as the use would not be possible within the current regulations on social distancing and cleaning and the actual numbers of hirers would be small due to no exercise classes or dancing classes, so making opening very costly with fewer lets and low income.

The Napfest committee has sadly agreed not to hold this years event on August bank holiday weekend. Classics on the Crick has also cancelled the event. The Fireworks committee held a meeting on the 1st. July, at the moment it looks doubtful that the fireworks will be held this year but the committee are holding another meeting mid August to decide whether to hold the event or not and that will depend on the restrictions in place at the time.

We do have some good news. We are going to hold a Scarecrow competition throughout the village. The entries will be judged at the front of the houses where they can be seen from the road/path. It is also the same format for classics on the drive where the cars will be judged on the entrants drive from the road. There will also be a virtual dog show with entries via video..

The playground is locked at the moment and although the government advice is that they can open but there are rules that must be followed, these include the cleaning of the equipment twice weekly and this alone would cost £400. Each user of the playground would be responsible for cleaning after their children had used the playground, there would only be 2 household bubbles allowed at a time. The playground has to be inspected every 3 months by an outside contractor and it is overdue as they are trying to catch up with the backlog of inspections, due to them also being in lockdown. With this in mind we have decided not to open the playground until we are certain it is safe and all the rules can be met.

Now due to the lockdown there has been increased use of the crick but unfortunately there are a few people that do not consider the playground is closed. They have clambered over the fence and taken their children and dogs into the playground. This is completely against the rules and when this was pointed out to them their response was to swear at the person pointing out their error. We will not tolerate this behaviour and any person being abusive will be asked to leave. The car park gates have been locked as the hall is closed and it will add to the security of the hall and make sure that no meetings of cars late at night are taking place or any unwanted visitors are using the car park for dubious activities.

I hope you are all well and keeping safe.

#### A Point of View

We are now in the eighth month of the year which seems to have come about very quickly, presumably because of the prolonged period of the corona lock down which has affected much of the holiday period and enforced the "stay at home" message promoted by the government. How fortunate we have been, living in such a beautiful place, with ready access to the extensive woodland on our doorstep. I was concerned that the increase in footfall would lead to an increase of littering which fortunately does not appear to have materialised. However, a recent drinking party of young men left behind several beer cans and some glass bottles. This action is totally irresponsible as broken glass bottles, hidden amongst leaves, is a serious problem to both children and dogs and can cause serious injuries. Are the culprits, who will know who they are, so uncaring that they put others in serious danger of injuries?

This past month has seen the demise of the Chiltern Woodland Project, originally formed to protect our beech-woods from the danger of fungal disease and the prospect of clear felling. Fortunately this didn't happen and our aged beech trees have not succumbed, although some oaks have not survived. A greater danger has been the grey squirrel and their activities can be seen on the ring barking of young saplings which will now never make maturity in a healthy state. The Project was thought to have served its purpose and its director John Morris was approaching retirement, having given sterling service in protecting our woodlands and his knowledge and experience has been of immense advantage to our heritage in the Chilterns area. He is maintaining his association in a consultancy operation which will be of some help.

The Buckinghamshire Council is now fully operational together with its area committees, with High Wycombe being our nearest contact point for local services. I would advise readers to acquaint themselves with the council website for all detailed information from refuse collection to planning matters. Council meetings are being conducted "online" and can be viewed on the website using the Zoom App. The inability of not holding last May's elections means that the total combined district and county members are too large for all to meet in one chamber, had the elections taken place as intended the new member representation would have been one hundred and could have been accommodated in the new Aylesbury offices.

Despite the progress that's been made, I know that residents of Naphill and Walter's Ash will be disappointed that Napfest is not going ahead this year. This is a reminder that unfortunately coronavirus continues to impact our daily lives. But having witnessed the brilliant community spirit in our area since the start of the crisis, not least through the fantastic efforts of so many volunteers, I am confident that together we will find our way towards a "new normal".

## Parking - Message from Hughenden Neighbourhood Action Group

Dear Residents,

follows:

We have received a number of complaints regarding the parking in Naphill and Walter's Ash and would like to remind residents of the law and their responsibilities in relation to this issue.

Vehicles that are causing an obstruction can be issued with a fixed penalty ticket and in some cases removed. An obstruction occurs when a vehicle is parked as

- Sufficiently on the pavement, preventing a pedestrian with a wheelchair or pushchair from using the pavement. Blocking a driveway, preventing another vehicle from exiting.
- Two vehicles parked opposite each other preventing other vehicles from using the road.

- Too close to a junction and obstructing movement and visibility onto a main road.

## Friends of Naphill Common

We have heard from Wessex Woodland Management – the company contracted by the owners to carry out the felling on Naphill Common – that the third phase of felling will not start this autumn as originally intended. It seems that people with trees affected by the ash dieback disease need to have their trees felled while the timber is still in saleable condition, and this has given Wessex Woodland Management so much work that they cannot complete our felling until next year.

We have been informed by the West Wycombe Estate (who own most of the Common) that they are trialling a new type of humane squirrel control. These are black and orange units installed a few feet above the ground. Grey squirrels are very destructive, both to young trees and birds' nests, and have few natural predators (as there are, sadly, no longer pine martens in the Chilterns), so their numbers must be controlled by humans. Numbering trees is a surprisingly difficult activity. Several years back, when we surveyed the trees on the Common, we numbered some of the significant specimens using small, round aluminium discs, as is the usual practice. We nailed them at about eight feet from the ground and kept a record of these numbered trees, see: http://naphillcommon.org.uk/mapTable%20trees.html

Many of the discs disappeared over time. It seems likely that the grey squirrels ate them, leaving only fragments and the nails. Recently new aluminium discs have started to appear on some of the trees but with different numbers. Enquiries are being made but, at the time of writing we do not know who is doing this or why. If you have any information please let us know.

As you may know, there are three species of newt in this country. The smooth newt and palmate newt are both quite common, but the great crested newt is rarer and declining fast. It is an endangered species and protected by law. Its numbers and distribution are measured each year. Two of FONC's members are licenced recorders. Each year they set (harmless) traps in a selection of our ponds to see which species are present.

In the past, great crested newts have been found in Pickup's Pond and samples of water taken from one other pond have also been found to contain great crested newt DNA. This year's survey was rather late because of Covid-19 preventing cooperative work. The result was rather disturbing. Traps were placed in three ponds, but no great crested newts were found in any of them. Of course, failure to trap any does not prove they are not there. However, what was more worrying was that no newts of any species were captured in Pickup's Pond and Daisy Pond, which is most unusual, while Dew Pond produced an abundance of palmate newts. More positively, palmate newts have also been seen in Willow Pond and most of the ponds have plenty of tadpoles.

Although newts leave the water in mid-summer and move out into the surrounding grass and undergrowth until the following spring, it seems unlikely that they had left at the time of the survey. A more serious possibility is that they no longer frequent these two ponds. While out of the water, newts have several enemies including mowers, cars, dogs, some birds and perhaps cats, but the other possibility is that the ponds have become polluted. One of the sources of pollution are dogs. If dogs have been treated with flea powders and then go into the ponds, they can introduce insecticide into the water, killing the small invertebrates that the newts rely on for food. If you are a dog owner, please try to keep your pet out of the ponds.







## **Growing Your Own**



Spring and summer fruit can be a delight. After the winter months, when we cannot have home-grown fresh fruit, the new growing year is eagerly awaited. For me, the first fruit is forced rhubarb. In February when the first buds appear I place a large black bucket over each crown with a heavy brick on top. The bricks stop the buckets being blown away during strong winds. After a few weeks, the first crop – wonderfully pale pink delicate rhubarb stalks. From then on it is a race to crop the rhubarb before their vigour throws off the buckets, bricks and all, and daylight converts them to ordinary rhubarb, not as tasty as forced rhubarb.

Then come the strawberries. I put fleece over the plants in February to bring forward the crop from 4th July, the usual date in the past for me, to 25th May this year. We had a large bowlful nearly every day until late June. By then the large black tayberries were ready. The canes, once the plants are three years old, can grow 20 feet in a season and I drape them over my gooseberry bushes at a height of about 5 feet. The total length of my tayberry plants is about 35 feet and the crop is huge. The tayberries fruit only on the previous year's canes so one of the winter jobs is to take out the old canes. Black tayberries are also a firm favourite for freezing and bottling for the winter.

Whilst the tayberries are in full swing the raspberries ripen. My "Glen Magna" summer-fruiting raspberries can grow 9 feet high and, like the tayberries, fruit on last year's new canes. My plants are now past their best so I shall have to remove them at the end of the season and buy new canes. One has to purchase new stock of some soft fruit every few years since the crops dwindle, possibly owing to a virus. I renewed my strawberries two years ago. As well as raspberries we had a few very welcome cherries from a small cherry tree in the garden. I had to net the tree to stop birds taking the crop. I also netted the three blueberry bushes growing

in ericaceous compost in large pots in the garden. When the soft fruit have finished we shall have the top fruit to look forward to. Fruit blossom did not suffer from frost damage this year and the plums, eating apples, cooking apples, apricots, flat peaches and pears are looking good, as is an excellent crop of figs. I store some eating and cooking apples and they keep until the end of February when wrapped individually in newspaper and stored in boxes in the garage. Pears are bottled in red wine and stored in Kilner jars – great on a winter's night!

#### Nature Letter

After one of the wettest, most dreary winters I can remember April came with blue skies and sunshine. With this came the butterflies and summer migrants. Chiffchaffs, Willow Warblers, Black Caps, with Swallows, Swifts and Martins passing through the Saunderton Valley.

Then at 15.10 on 9 May, on the edge of the common and Cockshall Farm, the sight and sound of a Cuckoo, heard again on five more occasions, the first I have heard on my patch for seven years.

Then on 27 May looking for early Adonis Blues on the BBOWT reserve at Yoesden (half a mile opposite The Boot, Bledlow Ridge), at 20.15 a Nightjar flew over, the first I have seen in Bucks since 1979.

We normally expect to see Siskins in gardens during February and March but this year they were noticeable by their absence, appearing in only 7% of gardens during January to March compared to 12% last year. In fact the first few months of 2020 showed some of the lowest garden birdwatch counts not only of Siskin but also Chaffinch, Greenfinch, Collared Doves and Starling. Reporting rates from Birdtrack are also low indicating early spring numbers were low across the country.

#### NOTICE ABOUT REOPENING THIS PLAYGROUND

The Government has issued safety guidelines for the reopening of playgrounds from 4th July 2020.

The Village Hall Committee met virtually on 6th July 2020 and unanimously agreed that due to the following reasons this playground will have to remain shut until the guidelines are relaxed further.

- 1. As a charity, run by local volunteers we cannot ensure only one child plays on an item of equipment at a time.
- 2. The cost to deep clean the playground would be over £400 per week and only reduces not eliminates the risk of infection.
- 3. We are following closely what Hughenden Parish Council is doing with their playgrounds which at this time remain closed.
- 4. The company carrying out the quarterly safety inspections has not been able to conduct any playground inspections and we will need an inspection and to carry out any remedial work BEFORE the playground can be safely reopened.

#### WE HAVE YOU AND YOUR CHILDREN'S SAFETY IN MIND

The Village Hall Committee will review this decision monthly or if the Government guidelines for playgrounds change significantly. ## Chiltern Hills Arboriculture – Post Lock-down Sanity







It's been a strange few months of late. Queueing to get into the supermarkets, OK in the blistering sunshine we had in April, not so nice in the rain. No pubs or restaurants to visit. No non-essential retail therapy, except online. No cinemas or theatres open to provide a welcome distraction for a couple of hours. No sport. No close contact with friends or family. So, what to do if you are not essential or working from home?

Although restrictions have now been relaxed, it can still be a challenge to find activities and venues to keep yourself from going completely bonkers.

We must have hiked every inch of the common over the last few months, so we thought we would venture further afield to combine two of my favourite pastimes, walking and photography.

Under normal circumstances most of my pictures are travel related. But there is not much of that available at the moment. I'm also interested in architectural photography, but that involves travelling into towns and cities, and again, I am not keen right now. So I thought I would turn my hand to capturing nature.

Once I had taken pictures of every flower and bird in my back garden we took a trip to Weston Turville Reservoir. It's located in Worlds End Lane just the other side of Wendover (call in to Dobbies Garden Centre, they have a fantastic butchers, Walter Smith, with some superb offerings). It is also a nature reserve (other nature reserves are available, Black Park at Iver Heath, Wilstone Reservoir, Spade Oak Gravel-pit at Little Marlow, and College Lake at Tring). Some of these have timber bird hides with information about which species you are likely to see and great cover from the elements. What they all have is the opportunity to get some fresh air and see some wildlife, with space for kids to run around without compromising social distancing

At Weston Turville there is safe roadside parking and a trail around the water. We Saw Mallard ducks with ducklings and some Coots. I caught a Great Crested Grebe catching a fish, and some Common Terns perching on a buoy. Shooting pics of wildlife on water is like "fishing with a camera". Lots of sitting around while nothing much happens, then a frenzy of activity. Constantly questioning yourself, "What settings am I using? Is my shutter speed fast enough? Have I compensated the exposure". After about an hour or so I had collected some shots that I was happy with. Normally I generally don't have much patience when taking photos. With buildings or cities that is fine, they don't move around at will. But animals do. Maybe this will be an education for me. A parable for lock-down, we are not always in control.



## A Message from Saint Michael's and All Angels Hughenden Vicarage



Our news cycles over the past year have included the General Election, Brexit (do you remember Brexit?!), Cov-19, to the most pressing and compelling footage over the past few weeks, which has grown from the shocking death of George Floyd in Minneapolis, USA, to a loud cry for an end to injustice and racism in all parts of our society.

Perhaps you have watched some of the raw footage online of alleged police brutality, reflected on the growing call for justice, often found collectively under the Black Lives Matter banner, and not just from across the Atlantic, because there have been many protests in the UK, and sadly some accompanying violence towards the police and against counter demonstrators, by a small minority of those who have been amongst the protestors.

Local protests in High Wycombe & Marlow recently, peacefully took place, and over 600 people took part. As the Bucks Free Press reported:

"There were also many positive stories of healing and beneficial sharing between Caribbean, African and Asian cultures, along with a reminder that removing the "ism" from race underlies the fact we are all members of the same race – the human race."

Following the tearing down of the statue of the slave trader Edward Colston in Bristol on Sunday, Vivienne Faull, the bishop of Bristol, said Floyd's death had "brought the issues of racism, oppression, inequality and injustice once again into the spotlight, where they should be. These are issues that the diocese of Bristol, like many organisations, has been aware of, discussed and attempted to address. However, while we have taken some positive steps, it is clear that we have not done enough."

Bishop Vivienne hits the nail on the head, in my mind. Racism is wrong. It is an evil blight upon our society. Whether consciously, or unconsciously it impacts upon the lives of many, and must be challenged, rooted out and eradicated from our society. But what can you or I do? Surely, we can play our part, and that begins with our own lives, views, language and behaviour. It should also stir us to stand up against this evil blight if we witness it in others, gently, respectfully, and appropriately.

As the famous quote, attributed to Edward Burke goes "The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men to do nothing."

Friends, it is not enough for us to shake our heads in dismay in front of our television screens in the comfort of our living rooms, if we are not willing to call out racism, and be a force for change.

All people are created in the image of our heavenly father, and all are equally loved and precious in the eyes of God.

Let us be a force for good, for love, for equality, for justice, and for the kind of society we would wish our children and their children will inherit, where such inequality and racism is a thing of the past.

Since my family and I have lived in Naphill, there has been an ironmongers and three general shops, prior to the present one at 19 Main Road.

The arrival of the Coronavirus has influenced many local people who normally shop at say supermarkets in High Wycombe to shop at Naphill Local because it was and still is safer to do so.

There is no doubt that trade has increased which the proprietors, Nadeem and Shabana Akhtar, would no doubt be pleased about on the one hand, however, support staff could not work because of fear of infection. The pressure on them was clearly intense.

There is no doubt that the shop is better managed and stocked with a greater variety of products than ever before, with the added service of house deliveries.

I am not aware of any Post Office in this area which is not attached to a general shop and therefore, unless the shop makes a profit, it and a Post Office would not commercially survive.

Hopefully, in the foreseeable future the virus will be defeated and normality return. May I suggest to the people of Naphill and it's surrounds that we continue to support, as now, Naphill Local so that Nadeem and Shabana can further develop a community shopping service.

During this very random time we are operating different opening times for both food and drink and these will keep being adapted until we are up and running properly. So, it is best to call for information and to book a table inside whether it is for food or drink. All our outside areas are not being booked and is on a first come first served basis. Our next addition to the pub is going to be pizzas as we have bought a pizza oven and will be able to offer takeaway as well as eating in. We will attempt to let you all know when this is going to start (we use Facebook to advertise the most up to date information)

I truly hope all this helps a little and we wish all our local businesses the best in their future and with their reopenings, we fully understand how hard it's been and the work involved getting started again. (Good Luck to you all).

#### From the Vicarage - Saint Botolph's Church Bradenham -Potatoes and a change of heart

Regular readers of the Gazette will be familiar with my prowess in gardening. To say I am inept is an understatement and seasonal garden jobs are truly the most loathsome of chores for me. I aim to do the absolute minimum work possible in the garden – just enough to stop social services or the police being contacted on the suspicion of there being a deceased person on the premises due to the overgrown nature of my plot!

The one thing I can do quite well is grow herbs and tomatoes in pots, so at the start of lockdown my attention was caught by an advertisement promoting a potato growing kit for 'only' £17.99. Thinking about the deliciousness of fresh new potatoes, I explored further, discovering that this 'amazing' kit consisted of a plastic bin, seed potatoes, fertilizer and instructions – a poor bargain to my mind. But it got me thinking, and when a few days later I was offered some seed potatoes for free, I decided to have a go.

I searched the internet for growing instructions and found I already had everything I needed apart from compost. The seed potatoes arrived, I lovingly planted them in the required depth of compost and started to keep watch over them. And that's when the miracle happened! They began to grow! ME actually growing stuff!

Since then, I have been tending my potatoes with the same level of care as a mother hen tends her brood of chicks and they are rewarding me with their luxuriant growth. How many potatoes I end up with remains to be seen, but I am loving tending my 'brood'. Moreover, it hasn't stopped there. Cavolo nero is growing in a little bed I made using the sides of a banana box as edging, and some more potatoes (these had lain forgotten in the bottom of the veg rack and started to sprout, so I thought I'd plant them rather than compost them). I have dug out a border and planted flowers, cleared a rough area at the edge of my lawn and seeded it with grass, trimmed overgrown bushes and planted a little Mediterranean bed. I have discovered all sorts of things growing in the jungle that was my garden, including a beautiful pink standard rose. My daily reading now involves scanning the RHS website to check I am doing things properly or find out what might be ailing my plants (mainly my previous neglect!). I had no idea gardening could be so enjoyable.

When they ask me 'what did you learn during lockdown?' I will proudly answer' the joy of gardening'.

Another answer might be 'it's ok to have a change of heart'. The New Testament tells the story of a young man called Saul who loathed Christians with a passion. On a mission to exterminate them, he had a sudden encounter with the presence of the risen Jesus that turned the passion of his hatred into love. That young man became St Paul – one of the greatest saints of the Christian church.

May you know God's blessing in your life – and may your gardens be lush.



Coronavirus can open our eyes to new opportunities in education, for children and adults alike.

"What do you want to be when you grow up?". The look of bewilderment on my children's faces is astonishing. They flounder for a suitable answer – how do they pick one thing? A builder, a zoologist, a Minecraft you tuber, (oh no!), are the answers on different days. Why do they need just one answer – are our careers supposed to be so straight lined?

We recently studied Ibn Al Haytham – the Father of Optics. Before him, it was believed that light came out of our eyes and this allowed us to see. During a lengthy incarceration, Ibn Al Haytham discovered that actually light is reflected off objects into our eyes. Clever man! He is remembered for his science but he was also a mathematician, a philosopher, an astronomer, a poet. If we look at other great people they are often a mixture of great skills. Leonardo da Vinci was not just an artist but a scientist and inventor. Albert Einstein was an accomplished musician. Does it encourage greatness when you combine a variety of skills?

Has this foray into home-schooling, or at least some version of it, albeit pandemic induced, encouraged parents to consider their children's skills. Watching your child learn for the whole day can be enlightening – do they work better in the morning or afternoon? Do they need to run around a lot before they can sit still? Do they immediately favour certain subjects you didn't know they enjoyed? Have you found a way to encourage them despite the stress and anxiety you may all be under?

The coronavirus epidemic has perhaps also made us consider this for ourselves and our own working habits. It has undoubtedly given a very large part of the population of the country a wake up call, a good shake and opened our eyes to not only new dangers

but new possibilities as well. People are suddenly having to do jobs they never intended, parents are dabbling in home schooling their children, small businesses are changing their way of working or indeed creating whole new strands of income via delivery or click and collect, large businesses are having to rearrange their ethos and working environments. Companies are realising that despite the pyjamas and biscuits, home working is actually quite efficient. Have you suddenly launched yourself into new technology or areas through need?

Rarely do events come along that affect a change for every part of society, but this pandemic has certainly given us all food for thought and perhaps a new direction.

As we begin to tentatively step out of our homes and dip our toes in to our old lives, we do so with a strengthened desire to live a healthy, strong, and fun life! Here at Toddle In Group, most of our families have now rejoined us, and the children's reactions have been that of immense pleasure that friendships can once again be enjoyed. We celebrated the children's resilience and the part they have played in keeping each other safe by staying at home with an invitation to come back to Nursery, and a medal to keep.



From our first day back at Nursery we have strived to spark the children's curiosity with beautiful invitations to explore, and to play together.

A simple way to do this is to start with a good quality, and engaging story book! Children enjoy books so much more when they can be a part of the story. We engage the children in story telling with puppets and props, by linking reference books to the story, and by creating activities to develop themes that the book introduces. 

#### Announcing the Death of Elsie Hussey

12 August 1923 - 23 May 2020

It is with great sadness that we announce the death of Elsie on 23rd May 2020, she was the much loved mother of Diane, Robert and David, Grandmother and Great Grandmother

Elsie was born on 12th August 1923 in London. She lived in Kilburn until she was around 3years of age. Her father then purchased 1.5 Acres of land at Marlow Bottom. He subsequently built a home for them and used the land to keep pigs and chickens and also grew fruit and vegetables. Elsie had a sister several

years older than her, a brother several years younger and a second brother born when she was 19 years of age.

She went to school in Marlow until she was 14 years of age, travelling into Marlow with all the Marlow Bottom Children on the back of a lorry. It was a long walk when you missed the lorry, as she found out one day.

When she left school she worked in a furniture factory and then in Lyons Tea Rooms in High Wycombe. She was 16 when the Second World War started and by



this time was working at Ernest Turners Electrical in High Wycombe, producing parts for Aircraft Dials. After the war she continued working there and met her future husband, a Naphill boy, John Hussey.

They married in September 1951 and moved into a caravan in Walters Ash, their daughter Diane was born July 1952, and not long after that they moved to Princes Risborough where they lived for about 3 years. they were then able to move to the house they lived in for the rest of their lives, in Stocking Lane, Naphill,

next door but one to Johns parents. They went on to have 2 sons, Robert born in 1955 and David in 1961.

Elsie became part of village life and various village organisations including Naphill Neighbours and WI. She learnt to make lace in the late 1980s and attended various lace groups until very recently and had many friends through her love of Lace making.

#### Old Lace-Makers Never Die, they just keep bobbin' along

That is what it says on the kitchen magnet given to me by my dear friend Elsie Hussey a few years back and it was certainly true of Elsie. You may recall an article about her entitled 'The Story of Naphill's Most Senior Lace-maker', in the Gazette' March 2019 issue. She was thrilled to feature in our village magazine and to share her memories of our community with so many of us in

person at last October's Heritage Day in the village hall too, when she came along to help demonstrate lacemaking ... she was still making Honiton lace having celebrated her 96th birthday just three or four months before .... and very willing as well, to pause the work in hand to draw on her bottomless stock of fascinating stories accrued during her lifetime in this area.

It was with a very heavy heart that we learned of Elsie's passing towards the end of May. For some time her



body had struggled to keep pace with her mind and early this Spring, the day their doors closed to visitors due to the pandemic, she moved into a care home at Holmer Green, having lived in the same house in Stocking Lane on the edge of Naphill since 1954. It was very sad that thereafter both family and friends were only able to keep in touch with Elsie via phone calls due to

Lockdown but I know a part of her is still here among us in our hearts ..... and doubtless if it is possible Elsie is bobbin' bobbins wherever she is now, making Honiton lace and keeping all entertained there.

#### A Message from Padre Chrissie Lacey - Fruity

Our teaching series at church over the next few months is the Fruit of the Spirit. It's a bit in the Bible where this guy Paul (who wrote a lot of letters to the new churches that were forming after Jesus had died and resurrected) describes what living out the Christian life is like. Sure, he writes about highs and lows...he himself went through some pretty crazy stuff, in fact he wrote a lot of his letters from house arrest, basically in lockdown! But, when Paul is writing about the Fruit of the Spirit, he is explaining that when Christians root themselves in God, by reading the Bible and imitating Jesus' example, some pretty epic 'fruit' grows.

Now, I'm not an avid gardener, but may parents are. I grew up on copious amounts of home grown produce and they froze, bottled and jammed things to keep them throughout the year. We would often take carrier bags of courgettes, runner beans or spinach to church for people to take at the end of the service. But this harvest didn't simply happen. My mum and dad were often in the garden. They would rotate the different crops round the different plots, add chicken bone (ewww) and manure (pongy) to the soil in preparation, nurture the seedlings in every available sunny patch in the house (genuinely, it was like living in a scene out of the jungle book!), put netting over the plots, beer out for the slugs and the watering seemed relentless. And all of this was important, because to nurture the best fruit/ produce, the plants themselves and the soil they were in, needed attention and intentionality.

And if you are so inclined to grab a Bible or google it, in Galatians 5: 16-26 we find the bit in Paul's letter where he writes about how what we root ourselves in will determine the fruit in our lives. He explains that yes, the Christian life is hard work, because we might need to say 'no' to some temporarily enjoyable things and to a lifestyle which kind of goes with the flow...but, if you choose to root yourself in God's teaching then with a little nurturing, tending, protecting and nourishment the fruit we produce not only blesses us but those around us too. So, what are these fruits? They are 'love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.' 
