

#### Naphill Village Hall & Playing Fields Council Chairman's Report

On the 8th January the village hall committee held a meeting. There were 15 members present. Among the items that were discussed were the maintenance of the hall. The heating system was discussed and although it is working well there have been a couple of small problems. These appear to be connected with the brain of the system! The google nest that runs the system via the thermostats uses artificial intelligence to make the most efficient use of the heating system. We have found that in certain scenarios it will turn the heating down on its own initiative, this appears to happen when the thermostats do not detect any movement and apparently the nest thinks the hall is empty. We have now asked the heating engineer to move the thermostat in the main hall to see if it will cure this problem.


The probation service are being asked to provide labour to paint some parts of the hall. This is part of their payback scheme. The first areas will be the toilets. The work will be carried out under supervision by them. If the work meets a satisfactory standard we will use them for more work.

The football pitches need work on them to get them in good condition, they are going to be spiked and levelled up and the goal areas will be relaid and the whole pitch will be weeded and reseeded. A budget of £2000 has been agreed for this work.

The Christmas tree lights have been taken down. There was a problem when a skip truck exited the car park and took some of the lights off the tree, the lights were made safe and Mike Mason and his team will make good the lights before they are put on the tree next Christmas. It is good to see that the fund for the Christmas tree lights has been well supported this year.

The village Fete appears not to be taking place this year. There are various reasons why the Fete will not be taking place, among them shortage of volunteers on the fete committee and also on the day. We all seem to be disappointed that the village Fete cannot be held in the same context as years past but times have moved on. The procession down Main Road has not taken place recently as the cost to comply with red tape would run into at least £4000. The stalls need quite a few people on each stall to run them and the enthusiasm appears to have waned. The children who come to the Fete need modern ideas to encourage them to partake in the event. The committee is open to new ideas, so contact us via the website, naphillvillagehall.org.uk and hopefully we will have a new event!

#### Update from the Chairman

The Council held a very successful Christmas gathering at Church House on the 14th December. It was great to see so many people from the Community who are out there delivering services and support for local people throughout the year.

We hope to repeat this on a yearly basis. It was particularly special as the 14th December 1894 was the day he council was formed by Coninsby Disraeli – and first met at Church House.

The Environment & Services Committee has been catching up on some long-standing backlog issues, and setting the future agenda for the Parish. But let me begin by acknowledging a couple of areas where we have still not quite got on top of things. First, we have a strong desire to address the long outstanding renovation of the playgrounds at Great Kingshill and Templewood. The Clerk is currently seeking proposals for a Project Manager to pick these projects up and provide continuity and professional project management. Second, on the sometimes vexed question of clearing, trimming or cutting verges, hedges and pavements, we need to provide better clarity as to when this is a Parish Council responsibility, and if it isn't, whose it is. We also need to tighten up our oversight of requests being made to our contractors compared to jobs being completed. Both playgrounds and the maintenance of hedges, verges and pavements affect the daily lives of many parishioners and we recognise that these are important things to get to grips with.

In terms of backlog issues, we have installed more secure electric gates at the Garden of Rest. As you may know we suffered a spate of thefts of the batteries out of our speed monitoring units. After many months of negotiation with suppliers and

experimentation around different ways of securing the units, thanks to the Road Safety working Group we finally have six back in action, with a seventh going up soon in Naphill. After a bit of drama, we now have the Streetlights situation in a happier place. The Parish has adopted the streetlights, and thanks to the Streetlights Working Group, has carried out needed maintenance and has secured a reduced electricity contract, saving £1,600 per annum.



Looking ahead, the Council has approved an Open Spaces strategy. This relates to the approximately twenty plots of land controlled by the Council. The strategy is to develop an appropriate Site Management Plan for each site. Some sites, such as Little Burnham Meadow and Spinney and Vincents Meadow and Pond, have tremendous ecological heritage and future potential. Others, such as Cockshoot Wood, Primrose Hill and the Old Allotment on Common Road, have amenity value. So far, we have approved a site management plan for Cockpit Hole, working with Chiltern Rangers, and are well on the way to implementing the plan, with the fantastic support of local community volunteers. We expect to present plans for Little Burnham Meadow and Spinney, Cockshoot Wood and Vincents Meadow and Pond to the Council for approval in January. The Plans have received a lot of invaluable input from interested local residents, for which we and our consultant, Mike Deegan, are immensely grateful.We hoping to receive plans for Hatches Field, Primrose Hill among others during the first half of next year. The strategy is to incorporate the ongoing management of these sites into our future Grounds Maintenance contracts, starting in the Spring of 2025.

Activities - Our annual walk in support of Children in Need, led by Ron Collins, raised £475. This brings the total we have donated to this charity to £2,823.

Our regular walks continue: first Wednesday of the month at 10:30 for a short (1 hr) circular walk; and third Monday at 9:25 for a longer walk of around 5 miles, which may be up to 30 minutes' drive from Naphill, followed by (optional) lunch – both starting from the Village Hall. Because both working parties are dependent on the weather, it's always best to check with the organisers before setting off: Tuesdays – Peter Davis (HW 569303); Thursdays – Ron Collins (HW 562240).

Owl and Bat Boxes - Around 4 years ago, the Naphill Brownies made some bat boxes for us to put up on the Common, and Caroline Oxnard kindly donated an owl box. Siting these items is quite tricky and we don't have ready access to the tools necessary to erect them at an appropriate height – at least, not ones that can be taken easily into the middle of the Common! Our friends at the National Trust's Bradenham Estate have come to our rescue, and the boxes are now all in place, close to the Clumps at the Bradenham (bottom) end of the Common.

Felling - The work on behalf of West Wycombe Estate to remove ash trees in the area around the Dells on Downley Common has now been completed – some timber remains to be extracted via Hunts Hill Lane. The small number of ash trees near Daisy Pond on Naphill

Common have not been removed. As we've experienced after the thinning work on Naphill Common, the heavy machinery running over wet ground has churned up a lot of mud, but as we've also found, this doesn't take long to settle down once drier weather returns.

It's certainly been a wetter than normal autumn, with close to 24 inches of rain. The notorious "Stocking Lane Marina" – the flooded patch on the sharp bend, about 200m down from the Village Hall – has rarely been empty. It's not always appreciated how much water this involves. Farmers may talk of an "acre-inch", the amount of water produced when an inch of rain falls on an acre of land. It amounts to around 100 tons (100,000 litres or 22,000 Imperial gallons), by coincidence very similar to 1 cm of rain on a hectare of land (because an inch is roughly 2½ cm and a hectare roughly 2½ acres).

The field adjoining Stocking Lane is 16 acres (7 ha) and the natural lay of the land means that much of it drains via the 'marina', so an inch of rain falling on already sodden ground could produce as much as 1,600 tons of water – for comparison, an Olympic-standard (50m) swimming pool holds 2,500 tons. Even the extended soakaway created by the council a few years ago can't hold anything like this quantity, and most of it eventually overflows via the fields on the other side grazed by the Horse Trust (Home of Rest for Horses), but inevitably a few inches remain to flood across the road surface.

Jonathan Chats with Matthew Styles

Living as we do some 600 ft above sea level you can understand why some people regard it as mountainous! One previous resident whose mother still lives in Naphill on Downley road let this drive him on to become a para-athlete in climbing.

Meet Matthew Styles-West, a head gardener on a private estate following in his mother's footsteps, she was Sir Frances Dashwood's Estate Gardner. 12 years ago, Matthew was introduced to the world of competitive climbing, and it was love at first sight. There are 5 Blokfest National climbing competitions per year and for the last 5 years Matthew has been the lead climber at each of these taking the overall title. This has led to his selection for the British climbing squad. A new section of AU3 in the world championship which had its first outing in April 2023 saw Matthew placed 10th in the world.

So, what is a wall like? The first 2.5 metres is at a 10% angle the next 10 metres is at 40% and The Head is at 15%. You are allowed 4 minutes to plan your route before you climb and Matthew says its 80% physical and 20% mental. With the concentration on where you are going being the key to success. He compared it to chess where you are planning your next 5 moves whilst undertaking your current one.

My thanks to the Wycombe Climbing Wall team lead by Ryan Tritton who let me come and take pictures. They would love anyone who fancies trying a little climbing to pop in and see what they can offer.

A word about British Climbing Team members who work hard to represent their country who in turn give them no support. All competitors are self-funded and must pay for everything 5 pairs of climbing shoes per year, 6kg of chalk etc and all the travel costs. So, they are always looking for sponsors who could help them stay at the top of their game. You can follow Matthew on Insta: matt westy styleswest

Mr Haines (I think that is how his name was spelt) deserves to be remembered because he was a kind, generous and thoughtful man. Eighty years ago, when I was a child, my twin brother and I were sent to Sunday school every week, perhaps to give our parents some peace on a Sunday morning. We went to the little Mission Hall made of corrugated iron. (see photo above) It stood well back from the road in its own graveyard. In recent years it was demolished and a large rather plain brick building has been plonked on the site and over the graves.

The Mission Hall was run by Mr Field but he used Mr Haines as an assistant preacher in charge of the children's services. Mr Haines was, as far as I know, a devout Christian evangelist who spent his week working in a furniture factory and his spare time distributing religious tracts on Frogmoor or keeping us children in order. It was a thankless task. We boys delighted in playing up, knowing that he would be reluctant to expel us because we would then throw stones up onto the corrugated iron roof. When they rolled down, they made a noise that was delightful to us and dreadful inside the hall.

Mr Haines was a mild-mannered man who conducted his hopeless task with great patience. He was also generous. Every now and then he would take a band of us boys and girls on an outing. At no cost to us but considerable cost to himself we would go on a bus to some "treat" or other; perhaps Beaconscot, or a boat trip on the Thames from Marlow or Henley. He would be disappointed to learn how little of his religion rubbed off on me but I do hope he realised how grateful I was, and how much I admired his kindness.

In a discussion about Adam and Eve on one Sunday I mentioned evolution and claimed that I had read Darwin's 'On the Origin of Species' (I doubt if I had, although we had a copy at home.) This clearly upset Mr Haines and he even went to see my father about it.

I still feel a small flicker of shame about one incident. A group of us boys – about six in number – were walking though the woods near Hampden when we came across Mr Haines sitting on a fallen log, eating his lunch. I had never seen Ryvita and it looked rather tasty. We stood around him in a circle watching him. Eventually he asked if we would like a bite to eat and offered up his sandwiches. We ate the lot in seconds.




#### Naphill Neighbours

Our speaker this week was worth waiting for. Bill Hamilton, BBC Newsreader and correspondent, gave a most entertaining talk this week. A good start to the new year. He was due to come in November but this was the week the hall was closed for pipe work and his visit had to be rescheduled.

He has just written a book entitled 'Man on the Spot' and his talk focused on his career as a journalist for the BBC in various parts of the world. Bill began by talking about the differences now in comparison with the ways in which communication methods have changed in recent years. His talk was

illustrated with photos of people on trains, in pubs, walking along the street, in restaurants, in picture galleries, etc. All were reading their messages on tablets and not looking at each other at all; 60% of us are reliant on our tablets nowadays. His observations were very amusing and resonated with his rather elderly audience.

Bill referred back to his early days as a journalist when he had to record everything using Pitman's shorthand and type his reports correcting errors with tippex; those were the days. He started his varied career in the north of England, worked as a football reporter, became a referee, and nothing changes because he had to slip out of stadiums unnoticed if the crowd objected to some of his decisions! He went on to read the news on Tyne Tees TV when he was 22. He recalled being very nervous but was aided by an experienced newsreader who spotted that he was shaking and told him to look straight at the camera and pretend it was



a beautiful girl! This worked apparently even when he was told over a million people were watching him.

He moved to London and got a job as a BBC newscaster. Like many who have made it to the top, he had some lucky breaks. He was waiting to do an interview with an MP at the House of Commons on the day that Airey Neave was blown up in his car. He had a camera crew with him and reported the aftermath, interview forgotten.

One of his last assignments was to Albania where the poverty and the agricultural nature of the economy were prevalent. The film he made resulted

in 10 million pounds being donated in one week by a generous UK public who were shocked by the sight of starving children in orphanages. A new school was built as the result of this.

Bill met many famous people in his time and was obviously greatly respected. Having listened to his achievements, presented in an amusing way, it was easy to see why he had been so successful.

We were glad he had come to us, and for cheering up a cold January day.

Our next meeting will be on February 12th when our speaker is Jennifer Shrags, Thames Valley Police, on the subject of Crime Prevention. The delayed AGM will also take place.

#### Windswept Lights



### From the Vicarage

Did you know that Ash Wednesday and Valentines Day both fall on the same day this year? We naturally associate Valentines Day with love, although its origins are uncertain, and come from multiple sources.

One possible origin was the pagan festival of Lupercalia which celebrated fertility, until Pope Gelasius put an end to it in the late fifth Century. Soon afterwards, the Catholic Church declared that the Christian martyr Saint Valentine would be remembered on 14th February each year.

Whilst some will be enjoying an evening in, we will be marking the first day of Lent at St Michael & All Angels Church, with our Ash Wednesday service, which starts at 7.30pm. Many attend church regularly, but have never been to an Ash Wednesday service.

Lent recalls the forty days and forty nights which Jesus spent alone in the wilderness, being tempted by the devil. Christians use Lent – the period between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday, as a time for personal reflection.

In order to start as we mean to go on, during this solemn season, a time of extended personal confession is included within the service liturgy, and all who wish are invited to come up to the altar rail, to be marked with the sign of the cross in ash, as an outward sign of an inner desire to follow Christ, and to walk the path of holiness and self-sacrifice.

Many who have attended a service for the first time have commented how moving they have found the experience - especially the marking of their foreheads with the ash taken from last year's Palm Sunday crosses.

Before individuals are invited to come forward to be marked with a cross, the following words of invitation are said:

"Dear friends in Christ, I invite you to receive these ashes as a sign of the spirit of penitence with which we shall keep this season of Lent. God our Father, you create us from the dust of the earth: grant that these ashes may be for us a sign of our penitence and a symbol of our mortality; for it is by your grace alone that we receive eternal life in Jesus Christ our Saviour. Amen."

As we are then marked with the cross, the following words are said over us:

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ."

Confessing our sins and shortcomings has always been a foundational principle of what it means to be a Christian. We are encouraged to keep short accounts of our wrongs,


so that they do not become an overwhelming burden to us, and in order that we might be unencumbered as we seek to follow in the footsteps of Jesus Christ.

**Growing Your Own** 

In the December/January edition of the Gazette I gave a list of the 19 essential trace elements we need in our diet, and mentioned that the nutritionists have specified a Recommended Daily Amount of these trace elements. I said that supermarket food is deficient in those trace elements because the soils in which the crops are grown, whether in the UK or abroad, are deficient – therefore the only answer is to grow your own.

But it is not sufficient to grow your own if your soil is also deficient in the vital trace elements. Therefore, apply copious amounts of farmyard manure and gradually improve your soil. I had my soil measured for trace elements by an approved laboratory and found that the application of farmyard manure over many years had raised the trace elements by 157% and that my soil met the DEFRA guidelines.

But there is one more thing I should mention. It is vitally important for the soil to be healthy and have plenty of soil micro-organisms, for three reasons. Firstly to break down minerals in the soil to make them soluble for plants. Secondly to cluster round the roots of plants in order that the transfer of nutrients to the plants can take place. Thirdly to transport trace elements to the roots of plants. Soil micro-organisms are our friends and we must look after them. However, we kill them if we apply chemicals such as herbicides, insecticides, fungicides and, yes, artificial fertilisers. We also kill them if we dig, so stop digging! Digging breaks up the soil structure

and will actually slice in two the vital mycorrhizal fungi. DON'T DIG!!

It is the start of February so it is time to get going with growing your own this year. If you can, obtain some farmyard manure for your garden plot or your allotment from a local friendly farmer. Pore through seed catalogues to select what to grow this year (most seeds will keep in their packets for a few years, the main exception being parsnips - you need new seed every year for parsnips). If we have a few dry days give your plot a little very shallow hoeing to knock off small weeds and to produce a fine tilth for seed sowing later in the year. Onion sets and broad bean seed can be started off in seed trays in the greenhouse. Towards the end of February tomato, cucumber and pepper seeds can be started off in a warm dark place such as the airing cupboard, moved to a sunny windowsill as soon as they have germinated, then planted-out in the greenhouse when they are big enough. Hand-pollinate peaches and apricots with a cotton bud when the flowers open (there are usually few insects around to do the pollinating at the right time these days). The past two years have had long, hot, very dry periods so you will have to have a plan for keeping your plants alive - Global Warming is upon us!

### Keeping your dog healthy during the Winter months

Whilst we are in the midst of the Winter months, the weather is, as ever, varied, which can have a huge impact on our dogs' behaviours. Some dogs absolutely love the rain and generally getting wet and muddy, whereas others won't even step out the back door! The very cold weather can also have an affect and there are a few things you can do to keep your dog happy and healthy at this time of year.

### **Wet & Muddy Conditions**

- Positive attitude if you're warm & dry, in appropriate clothing, this can encourage your dog to get out in the rain.
- Not all dogs need waterproof coats and there
  is so much variety available, which can be
  overwhelming, so ask around for advice. Spend
  time getting your dog used to new clothing.
- Pick walking routes that may be less muddy/wet, which can be tricky, but the occasional on-lead road walk can mean less mud. If walking in the dark, consider either reflective clothing for you and your pooch, or a reflective lead or flashing collar so that you can be seen by others.
- Hose/wash down muddy pooches after every walk & dry off as much as possible to avoid skin getting sore/infected. If you are short of time, don't rush the cleaning of your dog as this can turn into a negative experience if you're in a hurry. Cut your walk down to make time.
- Brush/groom your dog regularly, to check skin for any sores and keep coats clean and free of mud & matted coat. Again, try to make time so that this is a relaxing activity.

### **Extreme Cold Conditions**

- Consider keeping your dog on a lead if it has been snowing, as they will be unable to see any ditches or debris hiding in the snow if they are running around.
- Ensure that they have appropriate bright collar/ harness/coat on so that if off lead, you can always see them.

 It's easy to think there's no need to wipe our dogs down when the weather is not wet or muddy, but road grit can be an irritant for dogs' skin. Antifreeze is also extremely toxic and has a sweet taste, so wipe paws after every walk.

Remember, if the weather really is awful, you can always plan indoor games with your dog for their mental enrichment, which is equally important as their physical exercise. Cycling her way to success

The life of 22-year-old Royal Marine John Thornton was tragically cut short in Afghanistan in 2008. A high achieving student, he lived for the military and service to his country. To honour his voracity for life the John Thornton Young Achievers Foundation (JTYAF) was set up that encourages young people to 'climb as high as they can dream.' Inspired by his work, local Cadet FS Evie Collins from 332 (High Wycombe) Squadron supported the Foundation with a sponsored 24-hour cycle challenge.

Held over two days at the RAF High Wycombe gym, Evie, together with three other cadets pedalled in rotation for forty-five minutes for twelve hours each day between 20-21 Jan 24.

"Iam raising money for the John Thornton Young Achievers Foundation as part of the course, Junior Leaders (JL), that I am currently a student on. JTYAF helps fund the JL Course, as there are very close links between the two. John Thornton was a student on JL before he joined the Royal Marines and was awarded 'Top Student' in 2004. As a way of giving back every student plans and runs a fundraiser for the charity. This year, I am one of over seventy JL students raising money for JTYAF," said the impassioned cadet.

Along with a group of other cadets, Evie took part in the recent Race For Life and in 2021 entered the Air Cadets 80 in 80 challenge for the RAF Benevolent Fund. However, the 24-hour challenge is the first charity event that the seventeen-year-old has organised.

A member of the cadet forces since she was thirteen, FS Collins has the RAF in her blood. Her grandfather started

his career as an engineering apprentice at RAF Halton. "My dad found an air cadet squadron near us, and suggested I go down for one night, to see what it was like." Five years later Evie is the NCO IC at that same squadron.

"I have learnt so much from cadets, and whole-heartedly believe I am a better person for joining them."

With aspirations to enter the RAF Police after completing sixth form, the focussed teenager is an advocate of the cadets and in particular, the Junior Leaders course; "I would say the best thing about it has been the journey I have gone through in terms of learning more about myself. I know a lot of courses or opportunities say that you'learn a lot about yourself', but with JL you really do.... I have learnt how to develop myself in the future. I know where I want to be, and how to take the steps to make that happen. I would absolutely recommend Junior Leaders to every cadet I know, it's a truly brilliant course."

They say youth is wasted on the young, but this could never be applied to this tenacious teenage cadet whose zest for life and quest for personal fulfilment is palpable. Here is to a brilliant future in the RAF, Cdt FS Collins!

The Royal Auxiliary Air Force is 100 years old this year! And RAF High Wycombe's Wg Cdr Alfie Hall has found a 100 good reasons to celebrate this amazing milestone: 100 10K runs over 100 days!

"I have done marathons, even ultra ones, but people who sponsor want you to do something out of the ordinary," said the Wg Cdr. "Not many can do or have done 100 x 10K runs. I thought it was a good one.....partly to get people interested in RAF Aux 100 and partly to raise funds."

The motivation for the seasoned runner is to raise interest in the theme of 100 and to get people active. "Everyone spends a lot of money on gym

membership after Christmas and stop using it after a few weeks.... But if you add up how far you walk each year it easily beats 100kms," commented Alfie.

The RAF veteran is well aware that we are living in some tough economic times but believes that the British people are a generous nation and want to support good causes. Enter the one penny challenge.

"I am asking for just one penny for each of the 10Ks that I do. Literally every penny counts. If you have a penny, you



can support me.....For me the target is all about participation rather than just fundraising."

Any monies raised are being split between the RAF Benevolent Fund – who support any member of the RAF family – even if they have only served one day and The Royal Auxiliary Air Force Foundation whose job it is to record the history of reserves and signpost people to sources of help.

"If I get given one penny then you are invested in the aims – awareness of the RAF Benevolent Fund and the comradeship that we all share."

Foundation Memorial will be on the Wg Cdr's shirt to remember those who are no longer with us.

A thought that has been in my mind since the beginning of this New Year came via an online lecture from a Franciscan priest who was considering Revelation 3:15-16. The thoughts were around mediocracy, and should we fear this concept?.

When we make a mug of coffee, we like to ensure that the liquid is good and hot so the taste comes out... likewise with an iced coffee, it is something that is enjoyable. However, the taste a lukewarm coffee is not much good for anything except for going down the sink.

For me, this allowed me to think about my position in the world and what I bring to the communities in which I serve, and whether it makes a positive impact. I came to realise that in some areas I am like hot, where I have passion in something that drives me, while in others there are things that just don't infuse me which means I'm cold. Yet it was those things that matter where I showed indifference that caused me some distress and prompted me to respond.

Being mediocre can mean being average, or indeed just being normal; and there should be no fear in that, yet for those things that matter, how do we respond to these? If you're a parent, there is the hope that you have/would respond well to children on those things that truly matter. By disregarding issues of no consequence, more time and value could be given to those things that matter

So, are you hot or cold? Are there areas where being lukewarm on something is causing discomfort? Considering these, means that we have a clearer thought process and can develop those things that are good, while dismissing those that are of no consequence.

On the Farm ~

Finally, as we got into the new year, we have had some drier weather. The Autumn has been particularly difficult with such high rainfall. The wet weather has caused us several problems, we have been unable to plant all the Winter Wheat that we planned, and some that we have has yet to fully emerge and may need replanting. We planted 60 acres of grass seeds before it started raining. This seed has rotted in waterlogged soil and will need replanting, this was for grass we hoped to silage at the end of April so another plan will have to be made. We have also ended up with more water in our dirty water lagoon so this has needed spreading, earlier than we would have liked. Being shut down with TB we have more stock on farm, meaning more cattle are being outwintered so drier conditions would have been preferred. No doubt it will not rain again and by summer we will be crying out for rain it's the way the weather seems to go at present!

The TB rumbles on with one reactor in our November test. We are testing again at the end of January. We need to have 2 clear tests to be declared TB free. We are quite over stocked, every barn is full, so we will have to look at selling some cattle at an Orange TB market. This is a market where only DEFRA registered TB fattening units can buy the cattle. Probably not very local to here and at quite a discount.

With the challenges farmers face there has been more interest in the government's environmental schemes, with quite a bit of land coming out of production. With large scale solar projects and house building also taking out land, land for food production is getting squeezed. I hope food security is a priority for the Government, it feels that it should be with the uncertainties in the world.

We have had an 8 % milk price rise since the New Year, this is very welcome as we have been running under the cost of production for a few months. The price had been dropping for us for the last 12 months. I notice when the slow down in inflation is talked about food prices are mentioned as though they are just coming down, for us they have been low for 9 months at least.

Princes Risborough Young Farmers, which most of our staff are members of, have been busy in recent weeks, with 2 charity events. They have organised a tractor run back in mid-December. This involved a large convoy of tractors that went from Thame via Chinnor, Princes Risborough, Haddenham and back to Thame. 225 tractors took part. Then after Christmas they did a Christmas tree collection and disposal. This was done with all the takings going to charity and any costs involved were donated by the Young Farmers. They supported two charities the Royal Agricultural Benevolent Society which received £4625 and the Rennie Grove Hospice which received £10125. So, if you were held up in traffic by 225 tractors or had your tree collected by them it was in a good cause.

In 2025 Princes Risborough are holding the YFC countryside rally again, so preparations for this have already started. This will be in early June and is being held in Bledlow. Young Farmers is open to anyone (you don't have to be a farmer) from early teens up to the age of 26. They always welcome new members, so if you are young and at a loose end its worth looking them up.
