



There was a meeting of the village hall committee on April 29th. It was decided that Peter Williams would become a co-opted trustee along with Dave Evans, Tanya Stevens and Judy Whitehouse. All four were unanimously elected to the committee. We have also decided that a programme of events that are presently carried out in the village hall would be put on the notice board outside. The trustee reorganisation is still ongoing with Judy preparing a draft for the next meeting. The audio system has been upgraded and new speakers have been provided. Three quotes were supplied for the new doors for Bon Ami, the committee made a decision on the supplier and the doors will be fitted in the near future. We are also in the process of obtaining three quotes for the soffits and guttering around the scout hut and the mens club, hopefully a decision will be made next month so the work can be done during the summer.

I have some great news about the playground equipment! Linda Clark has obtained a grant from Annington Homes which will enable us to buy an adventure trail and it is hoped that it will be installed by the end of June. This is a



tremendous grant of £10,000.00 and apart from spending all the money on playground equipment the only other condition is that a plaque should be attached to it that shows it was donated by Annington Homes. We did agree at the meeting that we would pay for any costs over the £10,000.00, which could be up to £2,000.00. With the installation of 2 benches, donated by Wycombe District Councillor Steve Broadbent from his community fund, the play area will be at full strength.

Napfest will be on 7th. and 8th. June with Classics on the 9th. The theme is circus, so there is plenty of opportunity to dress for the part! Weather permitting there will be a flypast and as it is HM Queen Elizabeths birthday on the day there could be several aircraft flying over. Come and have a great time, meet up with friends old and new, and enjoy yourselves.

Bradenham Parish Council

At its Annual Parish Meeting the Chairman gave a report on the parish council's activities in the last year.

National Trust and the RAF were thanked for their support, particularly during the heavy snow fall. We have decided to continue taking on devolved services from Bucks County Council and have also agreed to take on devolved services from Wycombe District Council involving grass cutting in Beech Park.

We have completed the renovation work on our assets thus preserving them for many years to come. This has meant that expenditure exceeded income in this year. A number of local charities were supported. Two dog waste bins have been installed and Bucks County Council carried out drainage works in Rectory Lane, which following recent rains are not wholly successful. We are pleased to note that the A4010 for HS2 has been downgraded to a reserve construction route. This may, of course, impact the road safety work to be carried out.

In the year 2018-19 income was £8,651 and expenditure £11,190, with the main expense being the refurbishment of the Lychgate, the Parish Council's War Memorial. We had budgeted for this and had been saving up over a number of years to be able to fund this expenditure.

Teif Jones was re-elected Chairman at the Annual Parish Council meeting and Paul Oborn was re-elected Vice-Chairman.

There is currently a vacancy on the Parish Council. If you are interested in this position, please contact the clerk or any of the councillors. We meet six times per year.

Our County Councillor gave us an update on progress for the new Unitary Authority.

Maintenance work around the pond is continuing. As the parish council does not own any land in the parish, it was decided that we could not help Scope with their request for a location for a clothes recycling bin.

The white centre line on Bradenham Woods Lane in Bradenham village is starting to show and Bucks County Council offered to cover it up, again. We hope this will be done this financial year.

Our next meeting is Monday 8th July @ 7.00pm at Bradenham Cricket Club. All welcome.

The Parish Council have responsibility to cut the grass verges around our parish, this is a service devolved to us from Bucks County Council. You will have noticed that our contractors have already been out and about in the parish cutting these verges. If you have any feedback on this service, or have any ideas on what we, as a council, could do differently, please get in touch with the office. We are always looking for ways to improve the service we offer, and if we can, we will do our best to make things better.

RAF Liaison

The Parish Council now has a direct contact with the RAF. This is an exciting development as this gives council a better mechanism to iron out any challenges in the local area. We know for instance that the RAF are now investigating issues raised with regards to faulty street lighting.

Templewood Open Space

Exciting news – plans to redevelop the Templewood Open Spare are moving forward. With proposals now received from three landscape/play designers, these have been shared with the local residents and a decision on the final design is imminent. Further updates to follow.

Heatherlands. Included in last month's Gazette was a question put to the District Council by a local resident as to whether the owner of MSC Development Ltd, agents for Heatherlands, was on any District Council advisory panel, The District Council informed him that MSC are members of a customer feed back group whose members are selected because they submit many applications to the Council and so have useful experience to feed back.

Community Speedwatch will be up and running again now that we have a new speed recorder called Sentinel. However, we need volunteers so that at least two, if possible three people can make up a team on each Speedwatch recordtaking. The task is easier than it used to be because the Sentinel does a more detailed record than the previous recorder we used, which means we can often sit in the comfort of a car for some of the Speedwatch hour if we wish. We are able to use the Sentinel once a month for 5 days if we have enough volunteers so do consider volunteering to help keep traffic speeds down. As we don't now need a Policeman in attendance, we can occasionally use the Sentinel after working hours when some of the worst speeding occurs on Main Road.

Neighbourhood Action Group. The Residents Assn. is a member of the NAG. We have been asked to include the following NAG advice note for Gazette readers.

Walkers Rights of Way When out walking in the countryside it is important to remember that it is a working environment where animals graze. So walkers should be mindful of their surroundings to fully enjoy the experience. Be vigilant, especially on entering a field or where you cannot see the whole field, and try to stay away from animals and to be aware of their movements. In the spring it's especially important to be sympathetic to farm animals rearing their young and give them space.Dogs accompanying walkers on public rights of way must be kept in sight and under close control and should not be allowed to stray off the path. Straying, or worrying livestock is a serious offence and landowners can take direct action.

- To achieve the best chance of a safe outcome to both you and your dog.
- Try to avoid getting between cows and their calves.
- If you feel threatened by animals protecting their territory or young, do not panic and run. Most cattle will stop before they reach you. If they follow just walk on quietly.
- Be prepared for cattle to react to your presence, especially if you have a dog with you.
- Don't hang onto your dog. If you are threatened by cattle let it go and it will run to safety.
- Keep your dog close and under effective control on a lead around cows and sheep.

Friends of Naphill Common

Summer is definitely with us and our Common is in full leaf, all very inviting for a stroll, with a particularly good show of bluebells where the grass has been shortened along Ladies' Mile. The chiffchaffs, blackcaps and swallows have returned from Africa and their cheerful song is worth listening for.

To experience all this, and much more, why not join in our regular walks? We invite you to join one, or both, of our monthly walks. The short walks are led by Chris Miller and generally involve the Common and they are between 2-3 miles, starting at 10.30am from the Village Hall on the first Wednesday of each month. The longer walks are led by Ron Collins and are about 5 miles, generally some distance from Naphill. Join Ron on the third Monday of each month; meeting at the Village Hall at 9.25am for a prompt start at 9:30am. Members and non-members are equally welcome. These are the usual arrangements, but as there is sometimes a need to make changes it would be wise to consult our website, posters or the two leaders to confirm the details.

By the time this article appears, we should be very close to the date of the Village Fete. Please come along and support our Silent Auction, which did such a fantastic job last year, raising £2,500 for FoNC and the Village Hall funds. Successful bidders, who don't stay until the end of the fete, will be contacted by Ron's team in order to collect the money (very important!) and arrange for collection of the auction item.

We now understand that the third and final phase of felling on that part of the Common owned by West Wycombe Estate will not take place before the Autumn of next year. As before, we hope to liaise closely with the contractors to ensure that we can preserve those trees that are beneficial and remove extraneous timber where appropriate. There are also archaeological remains that must be kept intact as far as is possible.

There have been reports of Red Kites harassing individuals in search of scraps of food. It's good policy (encouraged by the RSPB and the Chilterns Conservation Board) not to feed these magnificent birds by putting out food on lawns etc. By not feeding them, we encourage them to spread from the site of their introduction in the Chilterns so that other parts of the country can also benefit from their presence in our skies.

From Bradenham Vicarage - White Sunday

June 9th sees the feast of Whitsun, aka Pentecost. Always held 50 days after Easter, it is one of the 'movable feasts'. At its roots, this is an ancient Jewish celebration that looks back to when the Law was given to Moses on Mont Sinai. This day is celebrated by Jews worldwide as 'The feast of weeks' or Shavuot and occurs 50 days after Passover.

The Bible is very 'tidy' in how it relates Old and New Testament. Jesus died at the time of the Passover feast; maintaining the same 50 day time span, Resurrection Day to Pentecost sees the culmination of Jesus' promises. The new believers were in Jerusalem when, without warning, God's Holy Spirit descended on the disciples like fire and wind. Then stuff happened. They began to speak in other languages, boldly and with authority. Their tongues were literally on fire with the message they carried to the world. Christians often see this event as the birth of the church as we know it – indeed, in some churches, the service on the day of Pentecost/Whitsun may actually resemble a birthday party, often being followed by celebratory picnics and so forth.

In Britain too, Whitsun has an ancient root. Long ago it took on some characteristics of Beltane, which originated from the pagan celebration of Summer's Day, the beginning of the summer halfyear in Europe. Whitsuntide, the week following Whitsunday, was a holiday week for the medieval villain. On most manors he was free from service for this week, marking a pause in the agricultural year. Later, it became customary for the cotton mills etc., to close for Whitsuntide week to give the workers a holiday and 1871 saw the official recognition of Whitsun as a Bank Holiday in Britain. As the first holiday of the summer, Whitsun was a time for celebration, taking the form of fêtes, fairs, pageants and parades. Whit Monday, the day after Whitsun, remained a holiday in Britain until 1971 when, with effect from 1972, the movable holiday was replaced with the fixed Spring Bank Holiday on the last Monday in May.

The effect of this change made it easier to plan holidays and work schedules, but also had the effect of distancing this day of holiday from its spiritual roots. The word Whitsun comes from 'white Sunday' – a reference to the clerical colours that are worn that day. The word holiday comes from 'holy day', a day that was sacred and on which no work should be undertaken.

In our modern world, it is easy to neglect the spiritual aspect of our lives, yet so important is spirituality that religion/belief is one of the 12 protected characteristics under the 2010 Equality Act and the World Health Organization (WHO) discerns four dimensions of health, namely physical, social, mental, and spiritual.

This year, as we celebrate Whit Sunday, consider the millennia of spirituality that surrounds it. In a busy world populated by the clamouring voices of wealth, gain, consumerism and media, let us take time to step outside the hubbub and reconnect with the faith of our forebears and in so doing, reclaim the Whitsun holiday as a holy day.

May you know God's blessing at Whitsun and always.

I cannot believe that we have arrived at June already, the first month of Summer and half way through the year, a month which will see the longest day and sadly mark the progress of shortening days and longer evenings. I still ponder on that argument!

Many readers will not be fully aware that the new Unitary Council progress is well under way and the shadow cabinet is already working on next year's budget. May 2020 will see the first Elections to the Council. With the proposed numbers of councillors it will be difficult to find a venue which will accommodate all the members. In this first year any savings will be absorbed into the setting up costs of the new authority but in the longer term there will be savings which are much needed to fund the demands of Social Care, ever increasing by both the aging population and the increasing numbers of children and young people in the Council's care.

Finally, I must comment on the wonderful show of bluebells on Naphill Common, the recent work on the trees and the damage done to the forest floor seems to have stimulated them this Spring, they truly are a wonderful sight and I think they are the best I've seen in over 75 years of walking the Common.

Growing Your Own

One of my most delicious spring crops is "Asperge d'Argenteuil" asparagus, and it has been really early this year. Just like sweet corn, which must be cooked within an hour of being picked (because the sugars in the sweetcorn rapidly turn to starch), it seems to me that sugars in asparagus rapidly turn to starch also. That is probably the reason why supermarket asparagus, being several days old, is relatively tasteless. Warm weather benefits asparagus and in that exceptional spell over the Easter holiday the asparagus crop came fast and furious – the spears can grow at 6 inches per day.

I have had great success on the allotment this spring with forced rhubarb, pink in colour rather than red, and with a more delicate taste. I put 11 large black buckets over the crowns, each with a brick on top to stop the wind blowing it away, and had my first crop of forced rhubarb in early April. The next fruit crop will be strawberries. I covered the bed on the allotment with fleece early in February and by mid-April the first flowers had appeared. There is no need for insects to pollinate the strawberry flowers - the fleece is ruffled by the wind and the pollen is passed from flower to flower. If the weather is warm the first strawberries should be ripe at the end of May. My strawberry bed in the garden is not covered in fleece since I do not want all my strawberries to ripen at the same time. As for other fruit, we had lots of flowers this spring and not much frost, so I am hoping for good crops of soft and hard fruit in the summer and autumn.

My principal crops of potatoes, carrots and maincrop onions have been planted or sown, always a big effort in spring. I cover the "Charlotte" and "Desiree" potatoes with fleece to bring them on early and guard against frost. I grow "Carotte de Colmar" carrots between rows of "Centurion F1" onions to try to reduce carrot root fly damage. I usually fail to completely stop the carrot root fly by this organic method and have to resign myself to some damage, which I cut off the roots in the kitchen.

In June, the first frost-free month, I shall be planting out delicate plants such as dwarf French beans and the marrow family – and try to stop the Muntjac deer munching the latter by covering the plants with wire netting. On the allotment I shall be growing runner beans and climbing French beans up canes. French beans generally are superb when one adds some finely-chopped garlic to the pan towards the end of cooking. It will be time to plant out brassicas under ¼-inch plastic netting to stop cabbage white butterflies and pigeons which otherwise could take the whole crop.

The month of May was designated 'Make May Matter' but because May seemed to be a very busy month Hughenden Mothers' Union have decided on 'Make May Matter in June'!



Hearing Dogs

Difficulties with your hearing? We can help!

In last month's Naphill and Walter's Ash Gazette, we gave you an insight into how we carefully match our dogs with the deaf people they will help.

Now we would like to tell you about the other ways that we help people who are deaf or have hearing loss.

While dogs are at the heart of what we do, we also offer a variety of other personalised services that help make things easier for anyone who has difficulties with their hearing.

We understand the impact hearing problems can have on people's lives. Whether someone needs help with certain listening situations, feels isolated or alone, needs general advice on what support is available, or just needs someone to talk to – Hearing Dogs and Hearing Link (who we merged with in 2017) can help.

First, we talk to people to establish exactly what their needs are and what kind of tailored solution would work best for them and their lifestyle, as one size definitely does not fit all when it comes to hearing loss.

When we know how best we can help them we'll tell them about the service that we think would benefit them. These include a specialised Helpdesk for anyone who needs advice or guidance about their own - or someone else's - hearing loss; support groups and peer to peer support; and help with finding the right technology that will help them.

As well as our site here in Saunderton being our dog training centre - where our little life-changers learn how to become hearing dogs - we also run a special hearing centre, the Hearing Hub.

The Hearing Hub

The Hearing Hub is a service which offers help and support to anyone who wants to manage their hearing well.

It is perfect for anyone who wants general advice and guidance about communication and hearing aids; trying out a particular piece of hearing equipment; or just talking to someone who knows what it's like to have difficulty hearing.

At the Hearing Hub you will meet our team of trained volunteers who all have a sensitive understanding of the problems you face (most of them have a hearing loss), and a qualified, practising audiologist who can help you understand your own hearing better.

We hold a regular session on a Friday at the Hearing Hub, and booking is always recommended.

We hope you have enjoyed finding out about some of the services we offer to anyone who has any difficulties with their hearing. You can find out more about how these services could help you or someone who know by visiting www.hearingdogs. org.uk/helpingyou.

Next month we'll be back to talking about our life-changing dogs, and giving you an insight into the kinds of things we introduce them to during their training, such as public transport, busy shops and even cats.


