



#### Chairman's Report

On 13 May a committee meeting was held in the village hall, there were 12 trustees present. The main item of conversation was the playground. It was agreed that we would have the fencing around the playground replaced and a discussion followed about replacing the play unit that has the slide. The other item that was discussed was the updating of the trustees code of conduct, data protection policy, complaints policy and the financial reserve policy. They were all amended slightly to bring them up to date.

Unfortunately, the next morning after the meeting we received the latest inspection of the play area. There were several items that needed urgent attention. The main two being the unit with the slide is now considered unsafe as the poles that support it have rotted at ground level and also the larger swings also have a pole that has rotted at ground level. So, we had no alternative but to close the playground. This has been done, the gate is locked and the swings taken down. The fencing replacement has been put on hold until we have decided what course of action we should follow. We are now discussing ways of replacing the slide unit and the

one leg of the swings. We have looked at a couple of catalogues of play equipment, including one that uses recycled plastic that does not rot! On initial working of costs it looks as we will probably looking at £28,000. The committee hope that we can obtain grants and we are also considering setting up a "go fund me page" to help with the costs.

#### Chairman's Report Annual Parish Meeting

You will no doubt be aware that over several years including during the lock-downs, a backlog of issues built up, and subsequently progress has been limited by the rapid turnover of staff and councillors. We have just had another troubled year retaining staff, with the departure of our clerk Alice after only a few months in post. We had to employ another locum clerk, Philip Truppin, who is very experienced and has been a great help in putting our affairs in order. However, with so much disruption it has been barely possible to do more than essential and urgent tasks, leaving a number of important things that should have been done undone. Because of this lack of activity, reserves that have been set aside for long-planned projects has not yet been spent.

However, there is some good news. Thanks to the combined actions of staff and councillors we have made some real progress.

The Garden of Rest has been refurbished including new gates and the allotments put on a far better footing including the reintroduction of an allotment working group all thanks to our administrative assistant Marilyn Heybourn.

We have finally started to make progress on our significant number of open spaces as will be described later by the Chair of Environment and Services, Gareth Cadwallader.

We are also contracting to refurbish the two rather neglected playgrounds we own at Great Kingshill and Templewood.

The hedges, areas of grass and trees owned by the parish council have continued to be maintained by our experienced contractors.

The street lights the parish council have adopted in Widmer End now have policies drawn up for their maintenance and for the gradual replacement of ageing lights over the next few years.

Various grants have been awarded within the four wards and we are encouraging new applicants.

We are still short of councillors, having only 9 out of the 15 full complement. This means we might not have as wide a representation as we should, so would welcome any resident wishing to contribute.

We will continue to recruit a clerk and deputy clerk over the next few months, so our complement is up to budget. Then we can build on this base and provide the full service to our residents that they should expect.

**Friends of Naphill Common** 

The rain, which has broken records for the last 18 months, finally seems to be abating. The Common quickly becomes muddy in the wet, but also dries equally swiftly, so we're optimistic that we may soon be able to recommence the use of our newly purchased flail to keep bracken and brambles under control – particularly along Ladies' Mile. The results of last year's efforts have been a beautiful show of bluebells and forget-me-nots, particularly opposite the new 'Heatherlands' development, but also in the interior of the Common, where the Estate's thinning activities have opened up areas to sunlight and encouraged new growth of wildflowers.

#### **Open Spaces Working Party**

At their meeting on 7th May, Hughenden Parish Council agreed to set up an Open Spaces Working Party, under the chairmanship of Councillor Gareth Cadwallader – I am also a member, representing FoNC and our village. Hughenden Parish owns several important open spaces: the Cockpit Pond area in Great Kingshill; Little Burnham Field and Spinney (in Hughenden Valley, between the two football pitches adjacent to the Village Hall); Cockshoot Wood in Widmer End (Four Ashes);

and (most importantly for us) Vincent's Pond and Meadow in Naphill.

Work has already begun on developing environmental management plans for these areas, which have been sadly neglected in recent years. We'd welcome any thoughts and input you may be able to offer us.





#### How to Report a Crime to the Thames Valley Police

If you have been a victim of crime you can report it in several ways.

#### Is it an emergency?

Does it feel like the situation could get heated or violent very soon? Is someone in immediate danger? Do you need support right away? Is a crime still taking place? If so, you need to call 999.

If you have a hearing or speech impairment, use the textphone service 18000 or text the police on 999 if you've pre-registered with the Emergency SMS Service.

#### Non-Emergency

By Phone - If it's not an emergency, do not call 999. This doesn't mean the crime is not important – it just helps the police to make the best use of their resources. Call 101 for non-emergency enquiries. If you have a hearing or speech impairment, use the textphone service on 18001 101.

**Online** - Online reporting has been introduced to offer another option to victims of crime when reporting a crime or incident where an urgent police response is not required. Examples of crimes and incidents that can be reported online and also by phone include: criminal damage and vandalism, thefts from a vehicle, shed, garage, outbuilding and house burglaries when the reporting is after the event.

You should try to include as much information as possible about the crime.

Online reporting allows you the freedom to report non-emergencies at a time that is convenient for you. It means you are able to spend some time writing in your own words exactly what happened and there is no need to wait until somebody become available to take your call.

#### **Reporting Anonymously**

If you have information regarding a crime and don't want to talk to the police, contact the charity Crimestoppers online or call 0800 555 111. You will remain 100% anonymous.ALWAYS!

#### Naphill Neighbours

This week we had a visit from the charity "Ukraine 2 Chilterns". Several Ukrainians came, including a young man who spoke to us in English. We listened in admiration and sadness.

There are over 100 Ukrainian guests living with families in the Princes Risborough area. Over 10 million have left their homeland, and the menfolk in their families continue fighting. They manage to keep in touch by What's app. All these people are willing to work and some of them, though professional people, will do menial tasks in order to earn a living. One of those who came to visit us was a midwife but her English wasn't fluent enough for her to work in one of our hospitals.

Many of these families had been bombed out of their apartments, surviving by sheltering in the basements. We saw images of their attractive homes, now empty shells unfit to live in. The charity helps guests to find work, open bank accounts, go to school, attend English classes, etc. They have organised local events and run cookery classes.

#### Not from the Vicarage

Due to a calendar mix up, I found myself home alone for nearly a month. Someone was needed to look after house, garden and pets. So my husband pootled off to his dream role of Port Chaplain in Gibraltar, my daughter and her new husband pootled off to their dream holiday in the Far East and I pootled down to the local supermarket!

Did I have fun! Alone does not have to mean lonely. I didn't have to worry about planning meals that all four of us could eat (my daughter is a vegetarian, her new husband is not, hubby prefers veggie and I feel if we were not meant to eat meat, why did the good Lord make it taste so good!). No family consultations on which TV programme to watch. No queues for bathrooms or to use the washing machine. No games of Tetris with cars on our drive. I could do what I wanted when I wanted!

Cue binge watching favourite boxed sets until 1am, shopping for a whole morning at Ikea, bacon butties, chip butties, delicious salads with fennel (daughter and hubby think fennel is horrible!) and finally getting round to a host of jobs I had been meaning to do when I 'got around to it'.

Bathroom drawers, kitchen drawers, bedroom shelves, utility room and hall cupboards all totally transformed (with the aid of the storage systems I had spent all morning buying at Ikea). Contents were consolidated, out of date medications safely disposed of, things way past bbe dates chucked in the bin. The curtains we inherited on our move were re-homed using a local free stuff website and clothing I hadn't worn in years went to the charity shop. I rented a carpet cleaner and cleaned our rugs, carpets and

soft furnishings, taking a risk with the woollen oriental carpets. The carpets came up a treat, but there was an unfortunate side effect – the house smelt of wet dog for days afterwards! Even the weeds in the garden beat a retreat when they saw me coming armed with hand fork and trowel!

My time on my own was transformational. Not only was my home transformed into a more organised space, but having time to myself gave me space to be me. I was free from the demands of family and fitting in around the routines of others. I had time to read, pray or to simply be. I was almost sad when my daughter and husband returned and I flew to Gibraltar to join my husband (though now I'm here, the blue skies and 20°+ temperatures have dispelled even the slightest hint of melancholy)

In a busy world, it is important to have time and space to ourselves. The New Testament frequently tells us how Jesus would take time to be away from life's hurly burly and be alone. That's right - even Jesus, the Son of God, with all the power and resources of heaven at his command, took time out to be alone.



#### Year 4's trip to Woodrow High House

Recently, our curious Year 4's had the experience of a lifetime as they took part in a residential trip to Woodrow High House in Amersham. They had an amazing time over 3 days, taking part in lots of new activities including; becoming adventurous in archery, conquering fears in the high ropes course and many more exhilarating challenges! A favourite amongst the children was bush-craft, as they really enjoyed getting to learn new things about different plants and creatures around them. One of the messiest challenges was the rabbit hole, which was a maze of gloomy tunnels with mud, puddles and slugs in abundance!

The meals at Woodrow were a huge success with the only complaint being, "There was not enough of the cheesecake!" The children especially enjoyed breakfast as it consisted of: scrumptious waffles, pancakes drizzled in syrup and fruit - a bit better than cereal!

For lots of the children, it was a bit of a challenge stepping away from home for the first time, but with the excitement of dormitories and new opportunities, they soon overcame their fears. During their stay, it rained non- stop which meant that the mud was extra deep and they were surrounded by mammoth-sized puddles; which lots of the children loved splashing in!

One special night was spent round a campfire where everyone (including the instructors) sang silly songs whilst toasting marshmallows! Many jokes were told around the fire and after plenty of laughing and heaps of fun, it was time to head back to the High House, have showers (which were apparently freezing!) and get clean before going to bed.

Year 4 were disappointed when their Woodrow adventure came to an end, and were rather sad to say goodbye. However, they left with memories that would last forever.







On the Farm

The extremely wet winter weather is still having its effect on farmers in the region. On average we have had an inch of rain per week since mid-October. With breaks in the weather allowing frantic periods of work to get overdue tasks done. Spring cereals were planted later than most would have liked for optimal yields, these crops replacing the planned autumn planted crops that never got planted or failed to get established. Our maize has been planted in mid-May when we are usually aiming for the last week of April, this will push the harvest date back a bit. But good planting conditions should allow the crop to get off to a good start.

The cows have been turned out a month later as we waited for the grazing fields to dry enough not to be instantly churned up by their feet. We operate a hybrid system where the cows have top up feed indoors and also graze so we are more flexible. There are many farmers, more to the west of the U.K. that rely on grass only in the spring; with the cold wet weather in March and April these cows have not milked well, which has reduced the U.K.'s spring flush of milk. This is when the country peaks in milk production, and the milk price is often reduced. In the middle of May the U.K. were producing 44.13 million litres of milk per day which is 903,000 litres less per day than last year, 2.4% down on long term average. Arla announced this spring it is planning a new cheese plant in Devon, making mozzarella. Cheese making helps with the spring flush. Milk supply is finely balanced. The USA is 1% down in milk production which will probably lead to milk prices rising later this year.

Winter crops of wheat do not look good here, but also across Northern Europe and Russia (a major exporter) which will result in a smaller 2024 harvest and putting

pressure on wheat prices, something we will probably notice in food prices next year.

We did the first cut of grass for silage on 20th April, hopefully 2nd cut will be around a month later. If we can cut the grass before it goes to seed, the silage we make will be high in protein and highly digestible so the cows produce more milk from it, hopefully resulting in us needing to feed less of the expensive concentrates. See photos of grass being picked up in a field called 'Wathams'. (if you walk the footpath between Westlands and Church Lane you will recognise it). Also a picture of maize being planted in a field we call 'Moseley' in Naphill. Maize seed has got very expensive, now costing towards £100 acre, so you can't afford to make mistakes, or plant it in the wrong conditions.



On a positive note our herd has now been declared free of Bovine Tuberculosis (TB). We have tested all the cows 5 times in the last year, some have been culled but we have now had 2 clear tests, so a big relief. However we are a closed herd, which means we do not buy cows in, so the initial TB infection probably came from infected

wildlife in the area, making it highly likely to return. We try to mitigate against this but, with cattle now going out to graze, it becomes very difficult.



Construction has started of our new grain store. Hopefully this will be ready for this year's harvest. Our old grain barn is over 40 years old, it has been a subject of conversation during our Red Tractor Audits

and no longer really fit for purpose. The walls, being made of metal, are becoming weak with fatigue and the roof is not high enough to tip modern trailers so its replacement should be a big improvement. Also easier to clean and so keep insect and rodent free.

We will soon be planting up some areas to be left for nature as part of our Mid-Tier Agreement. These are field corners and less productive areas of the farm. We are planting 3 plots of nectar flowers and several areas to provide bird food next winter, that should provide food in the hungry months for various farmland birds. We have some hedge planting planned in for next year. We have done the 1st bird survey this spring, still with good numbers recorded despite not being the kindest of weather on the day. We will be doing another one shortly and a butterfly survey is being conducted throughout the summer so lots of things happening!



**Growing Your Own** 

Apparently, snails have a homing instinct. So those of us who are a little squeamish about dispatching these garden pests, and lob them over the fence instead, are likely to find the snails return. Similarly, those on allotments who throw them as far as they can are unlikely to lob them 65 feet, which has been found to be the range at which the snail's homing powers run out. Also, neighbouring allotment holders, when you are not there, could lob them back onto your allotment so a trick is called-for. To find out who is returning snails onto your allotment, put a tiny drop of quick-drying paint onto the Gastropod's shell, green for ones you lob to the left and red for ones you lob to the right. That way, you will be able to keep tabs on which of your neighbours is "at it". It would be useful, for snails which are returned by your neighbours, to paint a second mark before throwing them again, then a third mark for a third airborne journey. The reason is that after three solo flights the snail qualifies for its wings and a Private Pilot's Licence.

How does one address a Gastropod snail? One cannot use Mr, Mrs or Ms, nor Monsieur, Madame or Mademoiselle since they are hermaphrodites, having both male and female reproductive organs. This gives them a deep complex and makes them shy in company. They need another snail to reproduce, but as I have never seen them in the act I cannot tell you how they do it.

Gastropod snails are not the only small creatures with homing instincts of course. Frogs have an irresistible urge to spawn in the pond they were born in. The house at the back of my old allotment had a pond into which a frog, many years ago, exuded a mass of frogspawn. Thereafter, in spring, the frog babies returned, but by this time they were fully grown measuring about 3 inches head to tail. They literally filled the pond and my neighbour scooped them out with a net into dustbins and transported them a few miles away to release them – but they still came back. One year I persuaded him to let me have the dustbins full of frogs to let loose in my garden, since they consume Gastropod slugs. I had three dustbinfulls and tipped them over together on the lawn at the back of my house. I was amazed that they all shot off in the same direction - the direction of "their" pond. I had a rickety fence in their way at the time; they found holes in it and continued on their trek. My immediate neighbour, all unsuspecting, was very surprised to see an army of large frogs crossing the lawn in the direction of his house – there were hundreds.

A story to dine out on!

# RAF High Wycombe New Year News and Events





**Gunning for success** - "If I were to do it again, I would just eat chocolate wraps!"

On 3 January 2024 Gary Binns, Phil Angus, Justin Wallace & Dan Martin – the 'Atlantic Rocks' team - set out in the 'Sentinel,' a purpose-built eight metre long, two-foot-wide boat complete with state-of-the-art satnav and its own water maker. The mission? To cross from the Marina Rubicon in Lanzarote, Canary Islands to The Jolly Harbour, Antigua. To put it in context on how tough this challenge is, more people have climbed Everest than have rowed across an ocean, temperatures can reach up to forty degrees and you can burn up to 4500 calories a day. If that isn't amazing enough, teams can row in excess of 1.5,000,000 oar strokes during the crossing.

A rowing schedule was set from the outset to discipline the crew. "We changed pattern a few times, with two hours on, two hours off during the heat of the day and two times three hour shifts during the night," said Gary. But boredom with each other during the endless hours of monotonous rowing was never allowed to happen: "We made a conscious effort to socialise. We never rowed with just one person. During a two hour shift we rowed with two people – one for an hour and a half and one for half an hour. It worked! It also helped us

mentally. We had quiz nights whilst rowing, and at times we had the phones on watching Band of Brothers. Time seemed to go really fast."

Four days into the voyage repairs to the boat meant that a new compartment had to be made for the life raft. Water crept in, causing pressure to build and it seeped into two of the ration compartments, one of them being Gary's. A third of his rations were lost, including all his snacks. As each man needed his rations it was virtually impossible to share.

Whilst battling mother nature the Gunners also had more man-made difficulties. The electrics powering the Sentinel were intermittent meaning there was not the luxury of having power 24/7.

If you thought the food was going to be tasteless freeze-dried lumps of unidentified meat, you would be wrong! Rations were set at four meals a day per man (equalling 4500-5000 calories a day) and was split very much fifty-fifty between freeze dried and wet food. The luxury item travelling with them is something we can all relate to: "We all bought Nestle chocolate – a godsend! The wraps last for four months and we had two each night. It gave a real energy boost."

With such a huge task in front of them and with the numerous setbacks the inevitable question had to be asked: Did they ever feel like giving in? "We all spoke about it. Every time we saw a ship sailing by, we would say let's get on it. It became a bit of a joke," said the Cpl in good humour.

Reaching The Jolly Harbour in Antigua after a feat of endurance few will experience in their lifetime was understandably overwhelming. "It was very emotional. All the families had arrived two days earlier. I knew I would be emotional seeing my son again. I was even more emotional for the fact of actually achieving the goal," said a clearly tearful Gary. The local people also welcomed the gallant Gunners carnival style with steel bands and a ticker-tape.

With the benefit of hindsight, would the team have done anything differently? "Everything," said the plucky Cpl, cheekily. "From the training onwards. We would have had different food, no dry rations."

So far, the RAF crew have raised over £22,000 for five worthy charities including The Centurion Fund, Tough Enough to Care, Mental Health Research UK, SSAFA & The Veterans Charity.

#### Message from Padre Andi - Grief after the loss of loved ones.

I'd always considered myself as someone who could deal very easily with death, as many would expect, a clergyperson should have a developed understanding of what happens when someone dies and the impact that may have on themselves and those around them.

However, over the last year I have experienced numerous significant deaths of those around me. This has ranged from losing all three of our dogs (two from old age), a number of friends as well as relations, including my father-in-law who came to live with us in the final weeks of his life. During this period, I came to recognise that all the training and experience I had of working with others and their grief, came as little comfort when death came to visit. I spent time reading through C.S. Lewis' 'A Grief Observed', as well as The Revd Richard Coles"The Madness of Grief, both offering me perspectives that helped me to begin to make sense of 'feeling' the deaths of those who I lost. One of the key things I took away, was the relationships that had developed with those around me during this time. Truly authentic interactions with people I work with, those in the wiser community and the local churches which I serve within.

Of note is the wonderful care that my father-inlaw received from the Rennie Grove Peace Hospice and the local NHS Trust, having the opportunity to work with other professionals meant I was able to locate myself in part of their story, for me to recognise them, helped me to place myself. Yet, through this process of grief, I am constantly reminded that it is being with others that helped me make sense of how I was feeling. It is as if they were way makers on my journey from pain into acceptance.

I do not believe that we ever 'get over' losing someone, rather we adapt to their absence and learn to accept we won't see them again in this life. There are many trite phrases that are used around grief, yet one that I took to heart came from her late Majesty:

> "Grief is the price we pay for love." Queen Elizabeth II

This was used by her late majesty in response to the 9/11 attacks. If we don't love, then we won't have the pain of losing someone, yet where there is grief, there must be love. For me as a priest, I believe that God is love, therefore that love that I grieve for, is encapsulated within God as well.

If you are someone who has experiencing grief, it is my hope that you have someone you can speak to. If in doubt, you can speak to one of the local clergy, or perhaps a bereavement charity... or indeed Samaritans.





Here's a snapshot of our favourite pooches and what they were bred for, which may explain some of their traits and characteristics (good and bad!)

#### **Cocker Spaniel**

Originally thought to have been called "cocking spaniels" (or "cockers") from their job of flushing woodcock and other birds, for hunters. High energy, happy dogs that need mental and physical enrichment.

#### **Labrador Retrievers**

Also known as Labradors or "Labs" were traditionally used as gun dogs and many still are. Labs are very popular family pets due to their reputation for being a good all-round dog. This is true if, like with any young dog, appropriate training is given from an early age.

#### **German Shepherds**

Developed as herding dogs for sheep and are now often used as military or police dogs and can be perceived as aggressive. German Shepherd puppies, like any breed, can grow into loving dogs if they are given the appropriate training and socialisation.

#### **Border Collie**

This ancient breed is linked to the history behind all working dogs in Scotland. They make fantastic companions but like to be kept busy and were originally bred to herd sheep. They are fiercely loyal and tenacious and as working dogs, can keep going all day long.

#### **Dachshund**

"Dachshund" is German for Badger dog. Being low to the ground to follow scents and small enough to get into burrows, they were also used to sniff out other prey.

Today, there are many new hybrid breeds, which are a mix of 2 recognised pure breeds, that whilst not recognised by the Kennel Club, regularly appear in the top 10 most popular dogs breeds. Many of these hybrid breeds, such as the Cockerpoo and Labradoodle were bred to combine the best traits from each breed. For example,

Poodles are non-shedding and mixed with Labrador Retrievers, make excellent assistant dogs that are highly intelligent and make fabulous companions.
