





Naphill Village Hall & Playing Fields Council Chairman's Report

The Village Hall committee held a meeting on the 5th February, there were 17 members present.

- It was reported that the probation service had not replied to our email detailing the areas needed to be decorated. There could be a problem with making the hall available when they could do the work.
- A business has approached the committee with an offer to sponsor the Christmas tree lights. Due to the very high level of support from the community in support of the lights it was decided that it would be inappropriate to accept their offer.
- Due to a computer problem the financial statement from Paul did not arrive by e mail in time for the meeting, so Paul read out the accounts for January.
- Tanya Stevens, the lettings secretary, told the committee that the hall was becoming well booked for the weekends for at least a couple of months.
- The football pitches are having work to improve their drainage and will then need topsoil added to certain areas to level them. They will also be weeded and fed. The relevant areas will be taped off while this work is carried out.

- Bartha Pitman has been reviewing the village hall constitution and some changes could be made at the AGM. Bartha and Jo Keattch have also been looking at and in some areas clarifying what the committee needs to do for the safeguarding policy of the village hall. You do need the correct accreditation if you are using the hall or playing field and it involves children. All the current organisations ie, Football Club, Scouts and Guides, Ballet classes comply with the regulations.
- I made the proposal that we should think about making an area above the current storage areas into a permanent storage area and I have undertaken a feasibility study.
- We have had a person contact us who would like to run an event on the crick, probably later this year. The details of this event need to be discussed before a decision is made. This would be a hiring of the playing field so a charge would be made for this event.

Update from the Chairman

The Parish Council has set its budget for the year from April 2024 to March 2025. The budget covers items that the Parish Council has a statutory duty to carry out, and some activities that it has the power to undertake beyond its duties. As parishioners will be aware, the Parish Council was effectively reformed almost two years ago inheriting many long-standing issues that had not been resolved during the Pandemic and a period of disruption affecting the Council itself. The Council has made great progress in bringing these issues to a resolution, and the current budget addresses the final two open issues; the potential renovation of the playgrounds at Great Kingshill and Templewood, and the restoration and management of many meadows, ponds and woods owned or leased by the Council (more on this below).

In summary, the Parish Council is setting the local precept, or tax, at the same level as the past three years. For a Band D household the precept is £53.42. Different Parishes can be of very different sizes and shapes, with different demands, but it might be helpful to know that nearby Parishes such as Downley, Great Missenden, The Lee and Chenies had Precepts between £52 and £60 this year. Little Missenden and Little Marlow were between £65 and £70. Penn was a bit lower, Lane End was much higher. Hughenden is bang in the middle. We know a few residents would like the Parish to do less and reduce the Precept, and that others think we should be doing more - and better - without increasing the Precept. We would welcome new Councillors to join us and challenge the balance that we have struck, and believe is about right.

Among the long-standing issues that we have resolved are the land ownership dispute with Hughenden Community Support Trust, the repair and securing of vandalised speed monitoring equipment, adoption of the streetlights in Widmer End, the installation of secure gates at the Garden of Rest, the replacement of defective play equipment at Hughenden Valley Village Hall, the lease of the cricket pitch to Great Kingshill Cricket Club and the pruning or felling of a number of unsafe trees. In recent months the Parish Council has made grants to support the Ward newsletters and gazettes, a defibrillator at Hughenden Valley School, ongoing work at Bryants Bottom Community Trust and Grange Area Trust and resurfacing of the car park at the Village Hall at Hughenden Valley.

As mentioned above, we have budgeted for two substantial projects next year. The Council has long intended to to refurbish the playgrounds at Templewood in Walters Ash and Great Kingshill. Some Community engagement took

place several years ago, but the high turnover of Clerks and administrative staff have meant that this work has not been taken forward. The Council hopes to consider options and practical proposals for the playgrounds with a view to installing any approved facilities in Spring 2025.

The second large project is to develop Site Management Plans for the almost twenty sites around the Parish that the Parish Council is responsible for. Many of these sites have been neglected for ten or more years. The policy for managing them has not been reviewed for even longer. Some of the sites will have simple plans - to continue grazing, or use as sports or amenity fields. Others, such as Little Burnham meadow and spinney or Vincents Pond and meadow, are of considerable ecological value and require more imaginative and careful management. Our strategy is to feed these Plans into our next set of contracts for Grounds, Field and Hedge Maintenance in the Spring of 2025.

The Council has held reserves for these projects for several years. If plans are approved, reserves will be used to fund the work, and the reserves in our balance sheet will be drawn down. These projects are included in the budget, and some planning activity has been approved, but the main activities have not yet come to Council for approval. Other than these projects, the budget reflects the ongoing maintenance of our allotments, Garden of Rest, open spaces, road safety and streetlights, as well as grants to local organisations. Staffing costs cover a Clerk (currently a part-timeLocum), part time Deputy (currently advertised) and a Burial and Allotments Administrator, and part-time Responsible Financial Officer. We have two vital objectives for the coming months. We must stabilise the executive team, which has suffered high turnover, and which has been covered by several interim appointments. Councillors give direction to the Clerk and other officers, but it is they, not Councillors, who are the executives who carry out the work. A stable team is a prerequisite for a fully effective and efficient operation. A second priority, closely related to the first, is to improve our management of basic services like trimming hedges, clearing footpaths etc. We know that many residents are frustrated by slow turnarounds for this work. It is also the case that there is a lack of clarity about who is responsible for what. We need to address both issues. Improving these services goes hand in hand with establishing a stable administrative team."

Update from the Parish Clerk

At its January meeting the Parish Council set the 2024/25 budget and precept, the money we ask for from Buckinghamshire Council, to pay for the functioning of the Parish Council, which you will see on your rates bill. We have had to ask for an additional £1172 over 2023/24, £9059, which means the Band D property charge will be £40.26 per annum.

The increase is mainly due to increased charges for the grass cutting in the 30mph zone, for which we are mostly responsible, and the uncertainty of the contribution Buckinghamshire Council will make towards the cost of this. We need a third dog waste bin in the parish, which will need emptying every week. This is a service the parish council has to pay for.

We have budgeted for a village fete again, always a popular event. We need to put money aside for maintenance and the parish council is aware that in recent years it has kept it's precept little or unchanged thereby reducing our reserves. The clearing of the footpath/cycle path along the A4010 in our parish remains a priority allowing for a safe cycle/walking route from Princes Risborough to West Wycombe.

The Council decided that it will put a Biodiversity policy in place, even though we don't own any land, but we do maintain the pond and will take it into account when commenting on planning applications.

Our next meeting is Monday 11th March @ 7pm at Bradenham Cricket club.

Guarding Against Rooftop Fraudsters and Van Tool Theft

As spring approaches (hopefully!), many homeowners eagerly embark on renovations and maintenance projects, including essential rooftop repairs and upgrades. However, when having work done on your roof, you should keep the following in mind:

- It is possible, that a minor repair is all that is needed. Always get a second opinion and a written quote if someone suggests you should have your whole roof replaced.
- If you ask for quotes on the internet, you open yourself up to being contacted by anyone reputable builders and roofing companies, but also fraudsters. It is better to ask friends and neighbours, who had work done in the past, for recommendations.
- Do not rely on a photo that seems to have been taken of the damage on your roof.
- If you are elderly and are in any doubt about work that is being offered, ask your adult children, friends or neighbours for advice before agreeing to expensive work being carried out on your property.

Any fraudulent activity from gross overcharging or doing work that doesn't need doing, should be reported to the police on 101 and to **Trading**Standards on 0808 223 1133

There has been a spike in tool theft in the Thames Valley area, including south Buckinghamshire, specifically targeting the property of tradesmen by breaking into vans.

This crime can be particularly harmful as it can have severe effects on businesses and livelihoods, due to loss of time, revenue and expenses to replace tools. Thieves are usually opportunists above all else and will take advantages of easy steals, so it is crucial it is not made convenient for them.

Lock your tools in a secure van, aim to vault bolt the tools to the floor of the van; remove them at night and store them in a safe place. Always lock your van and close your windows, possibly investing in a good quality alarm. If you do have an alarm, make sure it is always set and in working order.

Mark your tools by using ultraviolent pens and permanent markers and record your serial numbers and identifiable markings. You can register your tools on "Immbolise", which is the national property register and it is integrated into the police system. Security solution companies like Smartwater, SelectaDNA and datatag are very effective in helping you protect your property.


- 1. the relief of persons resident in the area of benefit who are in need, hardship or distress.

AGM - There was an audience of 60 at our AGM on 2nd February to listen to a fascinating talk on the history of the RAF at Walters Ash, given by David Brown, BEM. We agreed our annual fees should increase from £5 to £10 (the first such increase since our founding over 15 years ago), which will help to cover our regular outgoings for insurance and equipment renewal and maintenance.

Our committee, who contribute so greatly to the success of FoNC, all agreed to stand and were duly re-elected. But I must reiterate the plea I made at the meeting: we're all getting a year older every year and would really like to recruit some younger members. The 'duties' are not onerous, 3 or 4 committee meetings a year, held in the congenial surroundings of The Wheel, thanks to the good offices of Claire & Mark and their team.

The Common - I'm writing around St Valentine's Day, so the sap is rising, catkins are out, birds are nesting, and amphibians are returning to the ponds (listen for the frogs 'humming' on sunny days). Our dew ponds (seven of them on The Common) are looking their best at this time of year, in no small part due to the efforts of our working parties. The rain that has filled the ponds over the



Local Tales - "Sometimes things are just not fair!"

We know that the Post Office scandal has resulted in thousands of people being unfairly treated and many persuaded that they committed a crime when in fact they were innocent. The injustice against them was gross and beyond anything that happens to most of us. However, many of us may well remember times when we were blamed for things we did not do, or, if we did, it was for reasons that were more complicated than the accuser knew.

As a schoolboy, I remember playing in the snow on the way home from school and my mother asking on my arrival, "where is your cap?". I could not think and said that someone must have taken it. I then remembered repeatedly sticking my head in the snowdrifts and had to retrace my steps looking in the indentations until I found the cap. My mother rebuked me, not for losing the cap but for lying.





Remembering this, reminded me of an event at Naphill School when the headmaster, Mr Easton, became exasperated with a boy in my class who was very often late. "You're late again" he said, "and you live opposite the school!" (this was when the school was at the end of Louches Lane). "Look at Johnnie in your class, he lives right up at Walters Ash and he's never late!". The offending lad dropped his head, desperate for an excuse and stuttered that it wasn't fair. "If, if, if Johnnie's late he can hurry but if I'm late I can't because I'm already here". I though the excuse was brilliant, if desperate, but Mr Easton didn't, although he was speechless for a second. The whole class seemed to agree that the lad was blame-worthy. But did we or the teacher know or care about the circumstances?

I think that often, through lack of knowing or not wanting to know all the facts, blame may need to be mitigated. I know now and probably knew then, that the lad who was late, lived on a smallholding and had to feed the chickens and collect their eggs and was given other tasks to do before he could go to school, which he no doubt accepted without question.

This made me think of the old monologue you may remember by Stanley Holloway. It was about a chap who committed the dreadful social faux pas of wearing brown boots to a funeral. Each verse ended with the refrain 'brahn boots, I ask yu, brahn boots!'. Meanwhile, the final verse explained: 'But we didn't know, he didn't say, he'd give his uvver boots away' – to a chap who hadn't any boots at all.



Of course, social mores change over time. As a boy, I remember that public houses were largely the domain of men. 'Respectable' women would not go in unless taken by a man and then only into the saloon bar if there was one. They and the children, would often sit outside in the summer with soft drinks, or perhaps a Babycham, if the woman was adventurous. Behaviour was then, as now, largely socially regulated by chat and gossip. One thing for certain, it was for men to propose marriage.



I remember that there was one middle aged couple who were often seen together walking on the common or through the village and maybe having a drink at a pub. They were not married and did not live together but 'kept company', perhaps of an evening, in a relationship that was long established and did not raise eyebrows. However, although their long-term association was accepted as part of village life it was not entirely without stress, an unspoken stress one of the couple felt. I was told that one evening, after having a drink in the pub in their usual silence, the lady finally gave vent to her frustration. She looked at her friend and burst out with: "Billy, ain't it about time we two got wed?" Billy, genuinely perplexed, frowned and looked at her and replied, "don't be silly woman, who'd have us at our time of life?"

Fasting has often been associated with the season of Lent. When we think of fasting, we naturally associate that with abstaining from food for a meal, or two, or on occasions for a more prolonged period of time. Many have testified that abstaining from meals, in order to devote ourselves wholly to prayer and worship can lead to a time of profound blessing.

However, in the time of the prophet Isaiah, the nation of Judah were going through the motions of fasting. Whether the practice had become more of a cultural than a religious one, or was perhaps not taught well by the religious leaders, we cannot be sure, but what was clear to God, was that the people who chose to fast, were not producing fruitful lives which one would have expected, if their fasting brought about a more godly lifestyle.

The people became disillusioned with God, complaining that their prayers were not being heard. Through the mouthpiece of his servant Isaiah, God set the record straight and called them out for their hypocrisy.

Many choose to give something up for Lent, but have you thought this lent instead about taking up a new practice or hobby, which helps to address the injustices we see all too often in the world?

Although Isaiah's words were spoken thousands of years ago, they could equally apply to the world we live in

today – one full of injustice, exploitation, the hungry and the homeless, and many anonymous people suffering in silence, without a voice.

Why not set aside one day this Lent as a fast day as proposed in Isaiah 58:6-9? Just imagine what difference you could make to the lives of many. Campaign for the release of those unjustly imprisoned by signing an online petition or writing to your MP, offer to volunteer at one of our local charities which help the most vulnerable members of society – set aside a day to pray for them, and invite a friend around to join with you, make a donation to support their work.

Church News

We have recently had a defibrillator fitted alongside the hedge in the carpark, which we hope will be unnecessary, but provides a community resource accessible to park users and others. A defibrillator is, of course a machine able to deliver a high energy shock to someone suffering a cardiac arrest.



The Resuscitation Council of the UK states:

Public access defibrillators are designed to be used by the public. When you switch the defibrillator on, it will provide clear instructions and talk you through what you need to do.

A defibrillator will not harm the person suffering a cardiac arrest and will only give them a shock if and when it is needed. There's no reason to feel nervous about using a defibrillator - just follow its simple instructions and know that using it could save someone's life.

The defibrillator can be operated without training, since as stated above, operating instructions are provided (and an ambulance called) by dialling 999 from the machine.

Please check out the position of the defibrillator when you are in the park: you may be able to save someone's life.

Other news is that we are looking to appoint a full time Children and Families' minister to support our work in the parish. Full details for interested parties on the Church website: www.hughendenparishchurch.org.uk.

On the 11th February we welcomed Heather Stanley from Wycombe Homeless Connection to talk about the charity's work. Whilst most of you will be familiar with that sadly necessary work in helping rough sleepers, you may not be aware of its work to avoid evictions (some of which are illegal), to help with setting up people in accommodation and to provide guidance through the difficulties of applying for benefits.

It was shocking to learn that the charity was founded as a result of the discovery on Christmas Morning in 2006 of Josie, a local rough sleeper, found dead in Easton St carpark. The charity originally provided the Winter Night Shelter, but now as mentioned above, its work is now much wider.

Mothers' Union News

The MU held the AGM on the 6th February, which was presided over by the Vicar, and very well attended. New members were enrolled, and a long-standing member's birthday celebrated. Reports were given of the work of the MU both nationally and locally, the latter including Tiny Tots@St Michael's, baptism and wedding support, MU garden and social outreach. Information was given about the considerable sums raised for charities.

The next meeting will be on Tues. March 5th at 2:00 pm when the speaker will be from Wheelbase, a charity that promotes sporting activities by wheelchair users.

Not from the Vicarage - The Wine Bar

One of the delights of going abroad is immersing oneself in local culture. With our regular to-ing and froing between the UK and Gibraltar, we have lost little time in finding out what makes Gibraltar tick. As you would expect in an area of high rise/density housing, public parks and spaces are vital to the wellbeing of all. In addition, living spaces are often small, offering little opportunity to entertain at home – being asked out 'for dinner' frequently means being treated to a meal at a local eatery. It is also standard practice to share a glass or two of wine with friends in a local hostelry.

Losing little time in embracing this way of life, we soon found a tiny wine bar nestling in a local parade of shops. The Wine Bar (not its real name in case I infringe advertising rules) is little bigger than a domestic lounge and has just 20 covers. A few bar stools and modified wine barrels serve as outdoor seating whilst indoors is one single, large, glass topped table running almost the length of the shop. Lining the walls are hundreds of bottles of wine, spirits and liqueurs. You can select and buy wine as in any wine shop, albeit slightly over supermarket prices. Do bear in mind that our favourite supermarket wine out here costs £3.45/bottle, so a modest markup is not going to break any piggy bank. For a small corkage fee, we can sit and drink wine at the table. Xabier, the bartender makes you feel like you are his honoured guest in his private dining room. No fancy sommelier could give you better attention. If you

don't drink the whole bottle, you take it home or Xabier puts it in the fridge to be drunk the next time you come.

The wines range from time honoured favourites to unusual grapes and rare vintages. When I checked for this article, the most expensive wine on offer was £406.60 a bottle (that's right – four hundred pounds a BOTTLE!) But the best thing of all is the company. You quite simply never know who you will be sat next to, which friends will drop by or who will be the next person to prove the adage 'strangers are friends you haven't yet met'.

Everyone is welcome. No one judges you if you are alone – indeed, it is expected that if someone is alone, you at least offer a greeting and ask how they are. People happily engage in conversations on all levels, ranging from weather to quantum physics with everything in between. Theology frequently features. It is a wonderful place of meeting and belonging.

Jesus spent much of his time eating and drinking with friends and strangers, indeed, his first recorded miracle was to change water into wine. When we share food and drink, we share a common human experience; these experiences were one very real way in which Jesus shared our humanity.

Gordon the Birdman - The Dangers of Lead Shot

It is now two years since a ban on lead shot in and around wetlands came into force throughout Europe.

It is estimated that a million water birds a year are poisoned by lead shot, the impact of which has been hidden to the wider public but painfully clear to wildlife organisations.

In the UK, thousands of tonnes of lead ammunition are discharged during the hunting season each year. Foraging birds often eat spent pellets, mistaking them for seeds or grit and suffer the results. Ingestion of lead can affect the reproductive and nervous systems, plus muscles and other organs. Tests and post mortems reveal that a substantial proportion of wildfowl in the UK have significantly high levels of lead in their blood. In the UK alone research indicates that up to 100,000 water birds perish annually and the welfare of several hundred thousand more may be compromised. Focus must now be on achieving a complete ban on

the use of all lead ammunition in outdoor settings. A ban in wetland is not enough, because many birds, as well as wildfowl, spend much of their time feeding on farmland outside wetlands. Research has also shown that compliance with the partial restrictions currently in place in the UK can be poor.

It seems that locally Spring has almost arrived. I have been blessed by a pair of Bullfinches between 14-25 Jan and now have Siskins and a pair of Goldcrests. Also, a flock of between 18 and 24 Waxwings entertained a lot of people on the Rose Avenue estate, Hazlemere around the same time. On eighth of February Lesser Celandine was seen in flower and frogs were observed being active in Willow Pond, with two Brimstone butterflies recorded in the garden on the 15th of February.





Growing Your Own

It seems to have rained virtually every day since last September. So now is the time to prepare for the drought! The last few years have seen long, dry periods in the late spring/early summer. I can remember one summer recently where we had no rain for three months and it was very hot. It may have rained elsewhere, but not here in Naphill and Walter's Ash. There have been many times when, on a parched allotment, I looked at the dark cumulus clouds dropping enormous quantities of water on High Wycombe, and another such cloud dropping a deluge on Princes Risborough, but not here. I surmised that, with the prevailing wind coming from the South-West, and the Chiltern Hills in roughly the same direction, that the hills diverted the large rain clouds to each side, leaving my allotment devoid of water. So, what is YOUR plan for the likelihood of a long, prolonged drought this year? It is a matter of saving your plants, and saving your crops. There might be a hosepipe ban!

I have been experimenting for a few years following a discovery I made in a very hot, very dry period. I have not heard anyone remark on this phenomenon before. My discovery started with a brick on my allotment. The soil was like dust to a depth of about two inches. I picked up the brick and it, and the soil underneath, were soaking wet. I then turned to a piece of black plastic – it too revealed water underneath. I then realised that moisture is rising from the depths all the time and, on reaching the surface, evaporates and is lost. However, if one stops the water evaporating,

with a sheet of black plastic, the moisture can benefit the plants. Furthermore, I noticed that a row of carrots grown three inches from a sheet of black plastic was twice as high as a row of carrots grown a further six inches away, so the carrot roots had reached into the moist soil under the plastic.

So I thought that, if I divided my plot into six-inch-wide strips, with black plastic six inches wide (see photo), and sowed seed in the centre of each strip, the row of seeds would be three inches from plastic on both sides and would benefit from having moist soil both sides. The strips of black plastic would also lessen the risk of weeds taking precious moisture – as well as halving the chore of weeding! (TIP - damp course membrane from builder's merchants, 150 mm x 30 m and wire ground pegs 6 inches deep to hold the membrane down, are relatively cheap.)

Before I gave up my allotment I tried out the above method, but was confounded when the heavens opened in summer and we did not have a prolonged scorchingly dry period. What will happen on my vegetable plot at home this year? I'll let you know.





Classics on the Crick Sunday 9th June 2024

Once again, the Crick will be full of fabulous Classic cars and bikes.

The 2024 show is being held on Sunday 9th of June, starting at 10am and finishing around 4pm.

As normal all profits from the show will go to the Thames Valley Air Ambulance.

This year is the 25th anniversary of the Thames Valley Air Ambulance and they are seeing an increasing demand for their services. In 2023 there were 3,293 call outs, of which 1,095 were in Buckinghamshire.

The most frequent type of call out was for cardiac arrests. Crews responded to 1,212 cardiac arrests in 2023, which works out as more than three per day.

The TVAA paramedics and doctors bring hospital-level care to people whenever and wherever it is needed, from the oldest members of the community to the youngest. Last year, 213 seriously ill or injured children were treated by the expert crews, including 86 children under the age of five.

Classics on the Crick started in 2014, and due to the inevitable break in 2020, this is the tenth event. This year we are hoping that we can bring our total donations to the Air Ambulance to over £100,000.

As well as hundreds of classic cars and bikes we plan to have great live music throughout the day. The village hall

team will be providing their usual excellent bar, and we have an exciting range of food outlets lined up.



How to Help Children Talk

Listen Actively.

Take time to listen when they're ready without pressure. Often a child will open up in the car or in bed when other distractions have gone away. Avoid the temptation to advise but offer to talk through what they think would work and discuss solutions together.

I love you, no matter what.

It's so important to be reassuring, especially if their behaviour is difficult. They may need reminding that they are enough – regardless of grades or other issues. After an argument, have a moment of 'resolve' where everyone can apologise without blame. Parents can apologise if they lost their temper too. It's better to model 'sorry' than being right.

Acknowledge feelings.

Ask your child about their feelings and repeat what you hear back to them, so they feel heard and understood. Try not to judge whether they should feel that way but acknowledge that they do. This helps them to know all feelings are OK. If your child is disappointed with their grades or didn't make the team, acknowledge how hard that must be rather than trying to jolly them along.

Look out for stress.

Stress for one child might manifest in sleep difficulties (too much or too little), a change in eating habits, feeling unwell or lacking in energy or interest in seeing friends. If you notice your child is behaving differently to the norm, ask them what they need. This is very simple but powerful question!

Open questions.

We have all experienced the grunting 'yes' and 'no' conversations with children, especially teenagers. Asking more open questions can help, such as, "What was the most interesting thing about today" or "Tell me more about how it's going in Maths".

Share your stuff!

Children often like to hear your stories of your 'bad' behaviour or how you overcame a challenging subject at school or failed exams. This makes them feel less judged. Many parents like to be seen as 'perfect' but this does not help the child feel connected, valued or understood.

Seeing the funny side.

Finding humour in situations when you can as this helps build connection and trust. Sometimes, just spending time hanging out and not communicating together is important.

Respect Their Privacy.

Like adults, some children are naturally private and may resist sharing things. If they begin talking, really listen until they have finished rather than jumping in with comments. Teenagers in particular need to know you're there and at least trying to understand them.

Don't take things personally!

The hardest challenge of all as we all take far too much personally. Take a step back, distract yourself and let the wave of fury pass. Save talking until things are calm.





Naphill Neighbours



Our visitor this month was Jennifer Shraga on the subject of 'Crime Prevention'. She lives in Naphill and is a police officer; a community officer based in Princes Risborough and covering a large area from Aylesbury to High Wycombe. She gives talks to various groups on request, including to schools.

One of the biggest problems in this area is 'Scams'.

We were advised not to give Bank numbers over the phone, or your name. These fraudsters are very articulate\ and convincing, sounding charming and helpful over the phone and even ordering a taxi to take you to your bank to collect cash. One person who was taken in cashed £5000 and handed it over. She did eventually get her money back from the bank and found it hard to believe she had been taken in.

Naphill is a very pleasant area and there are few burglaries. Those that do occur tend to beopportunistic rather than planned. It is a good idea to make your house look occupied if you are away, having lights which go on at different times, or a radio. Security lights are adeterrent even if they are not connected.

Police officers will not come to your door unannounced; if one does, take their number and Ring 101 to check if they are genuine. Do not let them in the house until you have done this.

Another suggestion was to keep hedges and other boundaries low so strangers cannot 'Case the joint", or hide easily. I'm on a loser there. The officer had many useful leaflets and volunteered to put them through people's doors when the supplies she had brought ran out. I think we all felt well informed and protected; a worthwhile afternoon.



A Wine Giant Essay - Nebbiolo - The King of Italy

This month we move our attention to one of the world's greatest grapes: Nebbiolo. A grape whose spiritual home is in the Piedmont in Italy's north and is used to create the reassuringly expensive Barolo and Barbaresco. If you're ever looking for something distinctive and a little bit different to your usual Malbec or Merlot, then Nebbiolo is a must try.

Whilst listening to 'The Stadios', one of the world's most venerated awards shows (for fans of hipster football podcasts!), over the Christmas period my mind was strangely drawn to Nebbiolo as I had a sudden realisation: Nebbiolo is a Catfish! Obviously, I don't mean it tastes like a bewhiskered sea creature, but it is the grape version of someone with a fake online identity who is out to trick you. Bear with me here...

When you open it up and pour a glass you will inevitably notice it's lighter colour, almost ethereal in it's beauty, with soft shades of garnet and even a slightly orange tinge. You'd be forgiven for thinking it might be a subtle Pinot Noir. Then you take a sniff and think of violets or even roses. This is going to be like Princess Diana you say to yourself. Then, after you've let it breathe for a good hour, you take a generous sip and realised the Nebbiolo has emptied your bank account and sent embarrassing photos to your spouse – you've been 'catfished'! This is no

gentle wraith or wisp, this is a wine that turns the amp to 11 in every area: intense flavour, intense tannins and intense acidity and high alcohol. Your senses are thrown into overdrive as your brain tries to catch up and process what has just happened!

Having alternated between 19 Crimes, Jam Shed and a Trivento Malbec you thought you knew what red wine tasted like, only for Nebbiolo to shatter that with its rustic and savoury profile. Flavours of raspberry, cherry and cranberry sit alongside rose, herbs and violet, whilst there's more beneath it all that you can't put your finger on – 'Is that anise? Tar? Leather?'. Quite possibly so. This was not what it looked like in the glass!

I appreciate this description may not be a classic sales pitch, but if you've never before supped this regal and historic grape, you must. It's a wonderful experience that makes you try and convince yourself that drinking it is actually an intellectual and moral pursuit. 'No, my darling, I'm not drinking tonight – Nebbiolo doesn't count, this is educational, a spiritual awakening even!'

Make 2024 the year to have your say and to get involved!

There is such a lot of splendid work being done locally to ensure that our Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty remains attractive and accessible. Climate Groups and Litter Pickers work hard to raise awareness and to mitigate for the thoughtless few. It is sad that some people seem determined to undo this work. Chucking empty drinks bottles, wrappers and hot drink containers on the ground is dreadful however, there is one piece of 'rubbish' that is more dangerous: dog poo. A recent stroll in Hughenden Valley revealed a snapshot. Two bags of poo were placed at the foot of a tree is there some sort of Poo Pixie waiting to collect it when the humans and their dogs have left? Another was chucked over a fence to nestle in the overgrowth. Another hanging on a tree. There are bins readily available, so why just dump the bags? A bigger issue is the poo clearly visible on the ground. Too often a small minority of dog owners are not being vigilant, or they simply do not care. Either way, it is not acceptable. It is annoying for humans, interesting for other dogs to sniff (lots of information can be gained apparently if you are a dog!) and downright dangerous for wildlife and our rivers and streams. A recent article in the Guardian newspaper explains the impact:

Dog faeces and urine are being deposited in nature reserves in such quantities that it is likely to be damaging wildlife, according to a new study.

The analysis found that the resulting over fertilization of the ground with nitrogen and phosphorus by footpaths could reach levels that would be illegal on farmland.

The scientists reached their conclusions by counting dog numbers over 18 months in four nature reserves on the outskirts of Ghent in Belgium. They said the situation would be similar across Europe, which is home to about 87 million dogs.

Dogs are fed at home and then excrete nutrients while on walks, leaving an annual average of 11kg of nitrogen a hectare and 5kg of phosphorus, the research estimated. That is a similar level of pollution known to be transported through the air from farming, industry and traffic fumes, which ranges from 5kg to 25kg of nitrogen, meaning the impact of dog faeces and urine is significant.

Many dog walkers think that leaving their pet's excretions in nature will not do any harm. But most ecosystems are naturally low nutrient environments and over fertilization reduces biodiversity by allowing a few thriving plants, such as nettles and hogweed, to drive out others and the wildlife that depends on them.

"We were surprised by how high the nutrient inputs from dogs could be," said Prof Pieter De Frenne of Ghent University, who led the research. "Atmospheric nitrogen inputs from agriculture, industry and traffic rightfully receive a lot of policy attention, but dogs are entirely neglected in this respect."

The researchers estimated the illegal levels of nitrogen and phosphorus in situations where dogs must be kept on leads and can only stray 2 metres either side of a path. "Those levels are quite staggering, as our study concerned nature reserves," he said. "Of course, there are a lot of beneficial effects [to walks in nature], both physically and psychologically, for owners and their dogs but the drawback is bringing in significant amounts of nutrients."

De Frenne said the level of dog ownership is very similar in many countries in western Europe, so he saw no reason why the situation would be different elsewhere to that in Ghent. British charity Plantlife has warned that nitrogen pollution is "one of the greatest threats to our wild plants, lichens and fungi, yet little is being done to tackle it."
