Naphill Village Hall & Playing Fields Council Chairman'sReport

A meeting of the committee was held on the 5th October, there were 15 members online.

Reopening of the hall was discussed and a risk assessment has been completed. Some of the exercise classes and the dance class have restarted using the hall. The village hall has provided hand sanitizers and anti bacterial wipes to be used by the hirers. Due to the regulations the kitchen and the small hall have been closed and the chairs, tables and piano moved to enable the hirers to clean the hall. It has been made a part of the hiring agreement that the hirers are responsible for the cleaning prior to them using the hall and also it is their responsibility to adhere to the covid guidelines. A NHS Q code has been granted and is displayed in the hall for users to scan for track and trace. All users should abide by the current regulations on social distancing.

The playground is locked at the moment and although the government advice is that they can open, there are rules that must be followed, these include the cleaning of the equipment by the users. Each user of the playground would be responsible for cleaning after their children had used the playground, there would only be 2 household bubbles allowed in there at a time. The playground has still not been inspected by an outside contractor. This is delayed as they are trying to catch up with the backlog of inspections caused by lockdown. We have been told that we are near the top of the list to be inspected.

The good news is that the Christmas Fayre is being held, adhering to the current covid regulations, on the 4th

December. The Christmas tree lights will also be put up this year as Mike Mason has been able to reorganise the volunteers so they can operate within the covid regulations. The tree will be a welcome sight in these trying times!

The village hall has signed up to Amazon Smile. If you shop at Amazon we will be given a donation of 0.05% of your spend less VAT and carriage. The link to Amazon Smile is: https://smile.amazon.co.uk/ch/300309-0 from there select Naphill village hall. With the current climate, I would think many of you will be ordering online for Christmas from Amazon. If you sign up for Amazon Smile, Amazon will donate to the village hall at no cost to you.

Talking of money, the village hall normally spends between £27000 and £29000 a year to keep running. For the last 6 months we have been forced to close so apart from £200 from the pizza van, there has been no income. Whilst we did get a grant from the government and even with turning the heating down to 5 degrees and not using much electricty or water, we will still spend around £19000 this year, so there will be a shortfall of at least £7500. We do rely on the fundraising events which due to the restruictions, were not held this year, so your donations are very welcome please.

Dear Parishioners,

OVERGROWN HEDGES AND TREES BORDERING ROADS AND PATHS (Encroachment)

OVERGROWN HEDGES AND TREES BORDERING ROADS AND FOOTWAYS

You may not be aware that there are laws governing the encroachment of trees and hedging bordering footways and roads.

- 1. There should be clearance of at least 2.2m (7' 2") above a footway, pavement, or verge to allow pedestrians free passage.
- 2. Hedges/vegetation should be cut back to the property boundary line so as not to overhang or encroach onto the highway (meaning carriageway, footway or verge)

Hughenden Parish Council (HPC) only owns a small number of hedges, mostly around allotments, the Common in Great Kingshill and some of its open areas. HPC also looks after a small number of hedges on behalf of Buckinghamshire Council. The vast majority of hedges are owned by you, our parishioners.

We request that you check all of your boundaries to make sure that you are compliant with the above. Especially those with hedges bordering pavements and encroaching onto roads.

Hedges should not be cut within the period 1st March to the 1st September, to support our wildlife, unless they are causing a hazard and risk to health and safety, when they can be cut back regardless of date.

Should you be unable to maintain your hedges within the legal guidelines, please contact the office who will suggest a list of contractors who may be able to help you. If you aren't sure which are your boundary hedges, you can check them at:

https://mywycombe.wycombe.gov.uk/ by clicking My Maps option and ticking the Land Ownership category. This will take you to the website where you can purchase land registry details of your property which may help you.

COUNCIL COVID NEWS UPDATE

We are frequently asked how the emerging Covid situation will affect the ongoing use of playgrounds, halls and now, our Remembrance Day Celebrations. I thought I would share the latest information we have received following Mondays announcements to help you in your deliberations. Buckinghamshire is still within Tier 1, although our levels of positive tests have quadrupled in the last seven days, so should our status change, then guidance will surely be changed again.

For our part the Parish Office remains closed to the public and the officers are working predominantly from home. Even when we are not here to answer your phone calls, we do receive alerts on our mobiles and will return calls as quickly as we can. An email is probably the best way to contact us. Emails to Clerk@Hughendenpc.org.uk may be answered by Jill or me. Emails to our councillors at firstname.surname@hughendenpc.org.uk may only be seen by councillors and answered by them directly. We will continue to monitor advice on playgrounds and, knowing how much young families value this facility, we hope that we will be allowed to keep them open. Our signage does reflect the need for parents to clean touch points and their children's hands and not to eat or drink within the play areas.

Our Councillors will be attending the memorials in our patch, to lay a wreath as a mark of our continuing respect and remembrance whilst observing all the rules around social distancing. We are encouraging those who ask, to join us in the moments of remembrance from their doorsteps and driveways. I know that there are plans also to broadcast wreath laying from some organisations around the parish.

In the longer term, it looks like we might all be faced with rekindling the support networks which pulled together so well in Covid Round 1. Some networks have continued their support and operations without interruption throughout the summer. We hope to reacquaint everyone again via a virtual meeting early in November."

The Gregarious House Sparrow



As everyone who has House Sparrows in their garden knows, you rarely see one by itself. (I have not recorded one in my garden since 2013). They nest in gregarious colonies and in many areas will not wander or mix with other colonies, particularly if they can find sufficient food near their nesting site. After the breeding season in late summer and early autumn adults and juveniles from several colonies may congregate and roost together in areas with good food supplies.

Birdwatch counts peak at an average of seven sparrows per garden in August probably due to juveniles of the year gathering together around feeders. By November adults have faithfully returned to their nesting areas where they will remain all winter. Juveniles will either return to the colony they are originally from or go with other adults to a colony nearby. Once a bird has joined a colony as a juvenile it will generally stay there for life.

Natural nest sites include dense creepers, tree holes and rock cavities. They can also set up colonies in the foundations of much larger birds nests such as Storks, Crows and birds of prey.

In most gardens Sparrows nest within a roof space accessed under tiles or through holes in fascias. Nests are made with grass or straw and holes are stuffed full of material with fresh added between broods.

People are often surprised that House Sparrows are red listed birds of conservation concern, they are still one of the commonest birds in the UK and where they are found it is in large numbers. However, monitoring has shown we have lost 71% of our Sparrows since 1975, which means this species meets the criteria for red listing due to population decline.

Factfile on the House Sparrow.

Diet - seeds, berries and scraps, (insects for nestlings).

Longevity - Typically three years, max recorded 12 years.

Ecology – Clutch size 4-5 eggs, 2-3 broods.

Incubation 13-15 days. Young in nest 15-17 days.

Friends of Naphill Common

Because of Covid restrictions, none of our regular FoNC activities are taking place at present, except for our working parties on Thursday mornings. But we can still enjoy the attractions of our Common, whether walking, cycling or riding.

Naphill Common is the largest wooded common in the Chilterns at 70 ha (170 acres) – although there are larger commons, such as Dunstable Downs, those are mostly grassland or heath. But it was not always heavily wooded, grazing only ceased slightly less than a century ago. Grazing animals prevent small shrubs and bushes from taking hold, and prior to that date it would have been largely open with a few large trees and many juniper bushes, of which only a handful now remain.

How open the Common was may be judged from this 260-year-old newspaper advertisement:

To be Run for on Napel Common, near High Wycombe in Bucks, on the 25th of July Inst.

A Purse of FIFTY POUNDS, between a Horse of Mr James Warrel's, rising four Years old, and a Mare of Mr. John Barton's of the same Age, the best of three Heats on a Four-mile Course; to run Weight for Inches, and to start at Four o'Clock in the Afternoon precisely. At the same Place and Day will be a Poney Race. The Poneys to start at Three o'Clock.

And on the 26th of July, at the same Place will be a Free Prize for Horses that never won Five Pounds at any one Time, Matches excepted. To run the best of Three Heats Catch Weight: To start at Four o'Clock, and no less than Four to run. The Conditions to be seen there.

N.B. There will be Cocking in the Morning of each Day at John Ward's, at the Falcon Inn in High Wycombe for two Guineas a Battle; and two Pair of Shake-bags, at ten Guineas each Battle. Dinner at the same Place, to be on the Table at One o'Clock.

from The Oxford Journal 19th July 1760.

A helping hand with the terminology:

Weight for Inches – handicap weights were increased or reduced by 7 lbs for every inch above or below a standard height (usually 14 hands for horses and 13 hands for 'poneys')

Matches – head-to-head races between two horses

Catch Weight – no handicap weights applied

Cocking – cock fighting

Shake-bag – a larger and more powerful fighting bird

Horse racing would be difficult to arrange today – one wonders what this four-mile course would have looked like, it would surely have involved considerable climbing and descending! No other record has been found of this event, so we may never know whose horse was victorious.

Growing Your Own



What a marvellous year for growing your own! I have had my garden and allotment for 47 years and this was easily the best growing year I can remember. Usually gardeners, like farmers, moan about the weather. But not this year!

The gardening year got off to a good start. March, April and May were warm and sunny, and it was the warmest and driest spring on record. That start to the year was followed by warmth, sun and rain in appropriate amounts right through the summer, such that crops grew very well indeed. Unfortunately the weeds also profited from the excellent growing conditions and I, amongst others, found it hard to keep up.

Fruit was the high spot for my garden and allotment. Forced rhubarb was followed by a profusion of strawberries, then tayberries, gooseberries and raspberries, then the top fruit of figs, apples and pears. I had twice as many figs as in previous years, and three times as many eating apples. There was much bottling and freezing of tayberries and wrapping-inpaper of apples for the winter. The size of crop from my raspberries was not too good, so I shall be digging them out and buying new stock for next year. My Josta berries produced no fruit for the third year in a row so they are coming out also. Luckily, we did not have any serious frosts during my fruits' flowering time.

As for vegetables, my early potatoes were not too good, probably because the plants lacked rain just when the tubers were swelling. However, the maincrop potatoes were much better since we had good rain when their tubers were swelling. The asparagus in spring was pretty good and a welcome addition to the menu after the winter scarcity of fresh produce. Elephant garlic, planted the previous October, were very good as were the maincrop onions. However, overwintering onions and shallots were again a disappointment and I have decided against growing them in future (I have found that some modern sets are not as good as those in the past). I had a profusion of dwarf and climbing French beans – prolific and very tasty. Last year my turnips did not germinate, so I sowed thickly this year, with the inevitable result that they all germinated. I did not thin them and I have the most amazing crop. I had to water my carrots in the dry March, April and May but germination was very good and now, in the autumn, the crop is good. My sweetcorn was the best ever, grown in the garden rather than on the allotment to stop the badgers having an undeserved feast. On the allotment I suffered no losses through Muntjac deer because I fenced off most of my allotment with a simple plastic netting fence – which worked!

November is here, and the leaves are changing colour and falling. As autumn turns to winter, here are a few suggestions to help prepare your garden for the winter months.

Lawns should have had their final cut for this year in October. To ensure you have lush green grass in the spring aerate your lawn now. You can either use a lawn aerator or simply insert a garden fork at regular intervals to avoid waterlogging over winter. Next, edging. Nothing looks better than a neat and tidy lawn so don't forget to edge your lawn and lastly rake up any fallen leaves and petals to keep it healthy and increase light to the grass.

Once your roses and climbing shrubs finish flowering, prune them to reduce the height and so avoid wind rock damage over winter. Clear up any fallen rose leaves to prevent diseases such as black spot from over-wintering.

Make time to give hedges a final trim before the bad weather sets in, so they look neat and tidy for the winter. A good general tidy up! Clear overhanging plants from pathways to maintain access around the garden. Remove saucers from under flower pots and raise them off the ground for the winter to prevent waterlogging. Use the last of the dry weather to paint sheds and fences with preservatives before the winter arrives.

A last thought! I always enjoy seeing the gardener's friend, the robin. Please invest in a bird feeder to help our feathered friends through winter!

Dave Brown is awarded the British Empire Medal



British Empire Medal in Queen's Birthday Honours For services to the Royal Air Force and to Aviation Heritage

If you have ever taken the opportunity to visit the 'Bomber Harris Room' and the old tunnels at Air Command in Walters Ash, you may well have met our local military history enthusiast, Dave Brown. Dave is a born story-teller who uses his wealth of knowledge to bring history to life for visitors of all ages.

But there is more to Dave Brown than a contagious enthusiasm and 'scouse' accent! His commitment to serving the Crown has spanned more than 53 years, having been based at 13 different RAF stations, at home and abroad. Dave is justifiably proud of his 28year career in the RAF. Starting in 1967 he worked primarily in the catering trade as a steward in exotic places such as Gibraltar and Masirah (Oman). After finishing his regular service as a Mess Manager at RAF High Wycombe in 1995, Dave transferred to the Civil Service where he has become a mainstay of the station team.

In his current role as General Duties Coordinator at RAF High Wycombe, Dave helps organise all the major events on the station, such as Award ceremonies and the Annual Reception, as well as maintaining the Gate Guardian aircraft outside the base, painting offices and moving items around the 3 sites. He loves to go the extra mile to help people, often working outside normal hours to see a job done properly. The Harris Room is just one of the myriad tasks that Dave has taken on.

'Bomber' Harris's office has been preserved almost exactly as it was back in the days when he led Bomber Command during WWII. This historic record has been brought together by Dave's enthusiasm and hard work, researching and collecting the once-scattered contents (furniture, maps, pictures, etc) from venues all round the country. What's more, all this was achieved without any public funding. Over the past 6 years, Dave has welcomed some 5,000 people to the venue including HRH Princess Anne, Chiefs of the Air Staff (past and present) politicians, and many RAF veterans. These veterans have enjoyed sharing their own military recollections with Dave. All of this has added to his rich historical knowledge.



Dave has welcomed many local youngsters to the 'Harris Room' from schools, youth groups and Air Cadets. Most of these have been in the evenings and at weekends in addition to the normal working week. By using interesting facts and entertaining anecdotes to share details of Sir Arthur Harris's complex and somewhat controversial WWII campaign, Dave brings a light-hearted approach to visits giving a fascinating insight into events that shaped Britain's aviation history, passing on a historic legacy to future generations

The British Empire Medal (BEM) is one of Britain's most prestigious medals and is presented for meritorious civil or military service worthy of recognition by the Crown. Dave has been awarded the BEM for his massive, untiring contribution to the RAF and in particular his work to preserve military history and heritage.

An Old Soldier And Good Friend, Gone But Not Forgotten!



The mention, in the October Gazette about the Battle of Britain and that this November issue will coincide with Remembrance Day, got me thinking about my, not-solong, deceased friend and neighbour, Ron Crutchfield. Ron lived for over 60 years in Anne's Cottage, at the rear of the allotments. A lovely old brick and flint with original slate roof, which the Smiths would like to demolish, though that's another story.

Ron's father made Sergeant in the Great War. While fighting near Menen, Belgium, which later became the site for the Menin Gate, Sergeant Crutchfield took some shrapnel between his shoulder blades. The shrapnel stayed there all his life. He survived the war and thought that was the end of that, the war to end all wars. He was subsequently dismayed, to find just 21 years later, it all kicked off again and he had to see his sons go off to France, to fight.

Ron went ashore on D-Day, Sword Beach, second wave. Took weeks to fight their way to Caen. Fought his way beyond Caen, into Germany with the Kings Shropshires Light Infantry. Ron had many tales to tell about that time. He was driving a Willys Jeep a lot of the time.

Another period in Ron's war, he sailed to North Africa in a Liberty Ship. He felt terribly sea sick for the entire, 2-week, journey. After getting settled in Palestine, he was issued another Jeep and was tasked with driving an officer from Palestine to Cairo, a journey on poorlymarked, dangerous and lonely desert roads. A journey of some 500 miles, loaded up with 'Jerry' cans of fuel. It was a non-stop, overnight drive. At one point, on a long, straight monotonous section, Ron fell asleep but the Jeep carried on (crude 'cruise control' with a manual throttle, rather like a choke knob) There was a bend and a sandy dip and the Jeep careered off the track and in to the desert. This jolted him awake and he steered the jeep back to the track. The Officer also woke up with commotion and asked, "Were you asleep, Crutchfield"!? Ron replied, "No Sir, I was steering around a large pothole" and he never slept after that! He said that out of all the dangerous situations he was in, during the war, it was that one that often wakes him, with a similar jolt at night!

While waiting for the Officer in Cairo, some Military Police asked him to assist them with a fight at a local brothel. Some Scots Guards, who were in drink were out of bounds. Ron said "No fear mate" and made himself scarce. He felt that breaking up a fight between drunken Scotsmen was more of a risk to his life than the Hun!

Unimpressed with his reluctance to assist them, they checked his Jeep that was parked on the street and issued a ticket for not removing his rotor-arm from the distributor, which was standard operating practice when leaving the jeep unattended. He protested as he had, in fact, removed an HT lead from the distributor instead. When the paper-work made its way to his commanding officer, they checked it thoroughly and found that the MP's had written down the jeep serial number incorrectly. The Major told the MPs to get their facts straight in no uncertain terms!

Back from the war, he drove a Caterpillar bulldozer for many years, for the local firm, Smiths. It took him to a home in Chalfont for 'simple people, y'know, epileptics and such like'. He said that they kept rabbits to sell and to eat. They would always sell a Buck, knowing it would be given back to them in 6 months, when the new owner couldn't cope with its size or aggressiveness. The home would accept it back, freely. And then dispatch it for the pot! They earned from the initial sale, someone else pays to fatten it up and they get it back for free. Ron said, "perhaps they weren't so simple after all"!

I have a few more tales, but these will probably suffice for now!

- The kebabs in Istanbul probably are the 'best' in the world.

Just another five days to go before I can venture out. My car is due an MOT and I want to do a proper fruit and veg shop. Is it wrong to get inordinately excited about the prospect of this?

Letter from Bradenham Vicarage - The 6 month wall

This month, I would like to share with you a text from Prof Aisha Ahmed that was part of a church course on coping with Covid. Prof Ahmed is based at the University of Toronto and her text is a series of Tweets reflecting on her experiences in disaster zones and relating them to the pandemic.

The 6-month mark in any sustained crisis is always difficult. We have all adjusted to this "new normal", but might now feel like we're running out of steam. How can we keep going?

First, in my experience, this is a very normal time to struggle or slump. I always hit a wall 6 months into a tough assignment in a disaster zone. The desire to "get away" or "make it stop" is intense.

This time, our crisis is global and there is nowhere to run. That's OK. I've had to power through that 6 month hump before and there is life on the other side. Right now, it feels like we are looking ahead at long, dark wintery tunnel. But it's not going to be like that.

Rather, this is our next major adaptation phase. We've already re-learned how to do groceries, host meetings, and even teach classes. And we have found new ways to be happy and have fun. But as the days get shorter and colder, we need to be ready to innovate again.

This is my first pandemic, but not my first 6 month wall. So, what can I share to help you? First, the wall is real and normal. And frankly, it's not productive to try to ram your head through it. It will break naturally in about 4-6 weeks if you ride it out.

Of course, there are things we have to do. Work. Teach. Cook. Exercise. But just don't expect to be sparklingly happy or wildly creative in the middle of your wall. Right now, if you can meet your obligations and be kind to your loved ones, you get an A+.

Also, don't be afraid that your happiness and creativity are gone for the rest of this marathon. Not true. I assure you that it will soon break and you will hit a new stride. But today, roll with it. Clear away less challenging projects. Read a novel. Download that meditation app.

Frankly, even though we cannot physically leave this disaster zone, try to give yourself a mental or figurative "shore leave". Short mental escapes can offer respite and distance from the everyday struggle. Take more mental "leave" until you clear the wall.

In my experience, this 6 month wall both arrives and dissipates like clockwork. So I don't fight it anymore. I don't beat myself up over it. I just know that it will happen and trust that the dip will pass. In the meantime, I try to support my mental and emotional health.

Take heart. We have navigated a harrowing global disaster for 6 months, with resourcefulness and courage. We have already found new ways to live, love, and be happy under these rough conditions. A miracle and a marvel. This is hard proof that we have what it takes to keep going.

So, dear friends, do not despair of the 6 month wall. It's not permanent, nor will it define you in this period of adversity. Trust that the magic that helped you through the first phase is still there. Take a breath and a pause. You'll be on the other side in no time.

I hope you find the wisdom and insight of this text helpful.

May you be blessed by God's grace at this time.

Children can use tweezers to place cotton balls or pom poms on the tree.

You can also have cutting activities to cut shapes for a Christmas card, punch

Autumn Days

Autumn days. As the days get shorter, and the weather turns colder the temptation to head indoors and wrap up warm and cosy is very real! However, if we did that too often we would miss one of the most beautiful seasons we have here in Buckinghamshire! With so many woodlands right on our doorstep, Autumn is the time to get our wellies and coats on and head outside on a big adventure with our children!

Whilst for now we have stopped our outings here at Toddle In Group, we are still really lucky to have the school fields and grounds to explore and enjoy. Almost every session the children are able to head out to find beautiful leaves, conkers, fir cones and other signs of Autumn almost every session. When the adventure is done and we are ready to warm through, we all head inside for some seasonal food and spend time examining our Autumn treasure. If you need any inspiration to help you to make the most of this transformative season, I would recommend taking a look at the National Trust's website and read their programme called '50 things to do before you're 11³/₄. It is full of lovely activities such as star gazing, den building and biscuit making. We will be working through some of the activities with our children here at Toddle In Group to see how many we can achieve as a team! I'll update our Facebook page as we go along!

Sometimes, even we are beaten by the torrential rain or the bitterly cold winds. When this happens we make the most of our time inside and immerse ourselves in in lots of activities including sensory play, exploratory play and role-play. Our children make their own sensory playdoughs or soaps that they then get to take home. and they enjoy selecting the spices, the scents and the colours to add. All of these elements elevate playdough and soap to new heights, and really anything goes, so it is super creative! We also create little exploratory zones for the children to play and create. Our Autumn corner has opportunities for the children to introduce a narrative into their play, whilst developing their stacking and counting skills, and their knowledge of the world around them. Our Autumn corner is positioned in front of our full height windows so the children can still engage with the real world outside.

The children's play and experiences are always supported with a book. Books help to extend the children's understanding about the changes in Autumn that perhaps they cannot easily observe eg, things like hibernation, hedgehogs, and other environments.

We know it works, and as you can see, all this new information filters through in their play! We are particularly fond of 'The Scarecrow's Wedding', 'Pumpkin Soup' and 'Leaf Man' if you need any pointers!

Winter is Coming

Winter is coming! And with it a likelihood of more home time again – apart from beautiful walks in our glorious countryside – if the weather is truly frightful there is another activity which I would encourage anyone to partake in. Reading aloud to your children. I have always read to my children and we thoroughly enjoyed re-reading the Gruffalo and others a million times and getting excited when a new "supertato" book arrived. And then it came to the stage where they were learning to read and it became a nightly homework to sit and have them read to me and I still took pleasure in finding them new books and comics for them but I definitely didn't read to them as much.

Reading aloud to your children, no matter their age has been shown in numerous studies to have amazing benefits to their language, information retention and writing skills. Although my children can read – I of course can read faster and we can cover more ground.

There are millions of great books out there but some take a while to get into and your newly reading child may lose interest, as an adult you have more patience - so here are my tips for creating a readaloud environment in your home – you won't regret it.

- Set your space autumn is the perfect time to create a cosy area – blankets, cushions, mugs of hot chocolate and biscuits, low lighting - we are currently reading ghost stories by candlelight which adds to the atmosphere.
- 2. Start small one chapter a day unless they are transfixed
- Find things for them to do colouring, beading, lego, plasticine – all of these things keep little hands busy and they will still be listening – don't make them sit cross legged in front of you and expect entranced expressions - it will still go in.
- Go with their interest first let them help you choose – if they know they don't have to read it they wont be tempted by simple ones or ones they know – go by interesting illustrations or front covers.
- Get the whole family involved, my husband says he isn't interested in our latest book but strangely always manages to just make himself a coffee when I have just started.
- Don't be afraid to try things that seem above them

 you get reading levels drummed into you by school but this is you reading and them listening
 you will be amazed at what they do understand and can take part in we are currently reading medieval tales from the Welsh Mabinigion and despite my terrible welsh pronunciation my 9 year old understands and enjoys the stories.

- Discuss what you read while on your beautiful walks, get your kids to draw the characters – school will no doubt talk to you about "finding nuance" – this is it and is a wonderful way to grow your child's analytical skill.
- 8. Keep throat sweets on hand I have lost my voice on various occasions

Use the glorious autumnal weather to give it a go. And finally some of my best recommendations:

- Land of Stories series
- Wolf Brother Autumn Chronicles
- D'Aulaires book of Greek myths
- The invention of Hugo Cabret by Brian Selznick
- Puffin Classics
- Charles Dickens particularly with Christmas approaching, read the actual story of A Christmas Carol – light a candle and watch the films after
- Frostheart, Flember stories written by Phoenix and Beano comic authors
- Dara'O Brien series of space books.
