On the 2nd October the village hall committee met. There were 12 members present.

Naphill Tennis Club

Jenny Tench, the tennis club secretary, reported on the tennis club plans for lighting at the tennis courts. Jenny stated that a primary reason for installing the lighting was to enable their members, many of whom work full time, to participate in evening coaching sessions all the year round. The club plays in leagues so daytime playing is sometimes restricted. The club needs to offer good facilities all the year round to encourage and maintain membership. A survey was held and 37 people were in favour of the lights and 2 against. The club are currently awaiting a decision on their plans from the planning authorities.

Hall and Crick Maintenance

- A roofer has been contacted for a quote for repairs to the gulley between the two apex roofs.
- The ash tree has been made safe after a branch snapped. Whilst the tree surgeon was working, he noticed that there was a hole in the tree. He took a photograph and this information has been passed to the Wycombe council tree protection who require a survey by a consultant, before a decision can be made regarding any further action. A consultant has been contacted.
- The area at the back of the tennis courts has been completely cleared of trees, shrubs and

other vegetation. It appears there has been some dumping of various bits of concrete in this area and this will be removed.

- The football club have laid turf on one of the junior pitch goalmouths.
- Councillor Usha Prashar represented Hughenden parish council at the meeting and informed us about the problems the council are having with reference to the Parish Clerk's resignation.
- We are looking to replace the piano with a keyboard, which we think would be an improvement!

The next fundraising event for the Village Hall is the Fireworks on the 4th November. The fireworks committee has decided that NO tickets for the event will be sold on the day, so you will need to buy them in advance either from a local vendor or from the fireworks website. The last 2 firework events have been sold out before the day and it is anticipated that demand for the tickets will be as great as previous years, so make sure you buy your tickets early to avoid disappointment.

As always extra volunteers are always required for the night and if you think you could help us please apply via the website. We hope we will have a successful night and the weather will be kind to us.





There are fewer 'cattle calls' these days as crowds can be created easily with modern technology.

An amusing anecdote was about an extra who was supposed to be a dead body. He was lying supine on the floor when the director, number three perhaps, stood over him and demanded he' put a bit of life' into his performance!

Our next meeting is on November 13th when the broadcaster, Bill Hamilton, will preent his talk entitled "Man on the spot". Guests are welcome but it may be sensible to book a seat in advance, 1.45 for a 2pm start as usual.

Kohima Epitaph

Remembrance provides us with an opportunity to reassess our priorities and in the quiet stillness of November, a chance to reboot our lives.

For the Church, this month sees the end of the Ecclesia stical year, the new year beginning on the first Sunday of Advent. This period is known as Kingdom Season and its theme is of looking forward to the coming Kingdom of God, which will be a Kingdom marked by justice and peace. This is also the season of saints, beginning with All Saint's day on November 1st and ending with the feast of Saint Andrew the Apostle on 30th November. We often think of Christian Saints as those who have suffered a grisly end because of their faith, and sure enough, there are a good few of those commemorated throughout the month, but there are many others. St Martin who shared his cloak with a beggar is celebrated on the 11th, Queen Margaret of Scotland on the 16th with St Hugh of Lincoln being celebrated on the 17th and St Hilda of Whitby on the 19th. RAF High Wycombe

An Interview with Frederick Forsyth by Laurence Parker



He has sold more books worldwide than there are people in the United Kingdom – over 80,000,000 and counting. His 1971 novel 'The Day of the Jackal' stands as a yardstick by which modern thrillers are measured. Researching his books, he has interviewed everyone from mercenaries and Nazi SS officers to military dictators and psychopath drug lords. But did you know that Buckinghamshire resident Frederick Forsyth was also one of the youngest RAF pilots in 1958 to receive his wings at aged eighteen?

As I was ushered into his home, there is no sense of ostentation. Family portraits adorn his office wall, including those from his flying days as a Pilot Officer in the RAF during his National Service. The neat row of his novels peep from behind a cabinet, the only clue to his fame. He lives by his diary, and at nearly eighty-five he is still very much in demand for interviews and political opinions. I am ushered into the manicured garden, eagerly followed by his two Jack Russell's who favour running around more than quizzing the new visitor.

Peacetime conscription, or National Service began in January 1949 with the last conscripted men entering service in November 1960. Frederick Forsyth was one of the last intakes to serve Queen and country. The body may be older, the hair a little greyer but the mind is still sharp and the eyes a twinkle as we regress sixty-five years to those exciting RAF days. He welcomed the nostalgia, like meeting an old friend.

The only child of a shopkeeper, he was raised in Ashford, Kent, before going to prep school in 1948. Living in the heart of East Kent, the Battle of Britain had been fought over his young head in 1940. As a war-time welfare officer, his father frequently visited the local fighter base with his six-year-old son in tow. "I was dumped with the pilots and ended up next

to a parked Spitfire. One swung me up and dropped me in the cockpit. I was mesmerised and began to sniff the canvas, leather and oil. I also smelt fear because fear has a smell..... As I looked up into the Kentish sky I made a private oath – one day I would fly a spitfire."

The seed had been sown. Despite tutors at Tonbridge school trying to talk him out of it ("they regarded pilots as little more than mechanics with spanners") he left school at seventeen. At a time when many were trying to evade National Service, Frederick was desperate to get in. The "most rigorous medical on the planet" awaited him. For those one in a hundred who passed the night vision, colour blindness, aptitude, finger-tip dexterity tests and personality interviews, RAF Cardington in Bedfordshire awaited, followed by a three-month boot camp in Lincolnshire. As one of sixteen in a single dormitory, the grand title of 'Acting Pilot Officer' was bestowed – or "the lowest form of human life," chuckled the novelist.

Basic training followed at Turn Hill, Shropshire with one hundred and twenty hours flying in the propeller driven Provost aircraft. Known to be docile, obedient and above all safe, the simple and uncomplicated low-wing monoplane was the training aircraft of choice. For those who got through the destination was RAF Worksop in Lincolnshire. "There we walked onto the apron and saw it…we just salivated, we lusted after that De Havilland Vampire."

"You fly in it, or you die in it!"

The Vampire was a British jet fighter. It may have been the prize for eager young pilots, but unlike the Gloster Meteor, which was a bigger aircraft, the Vampire had little room for an ejector seat. ("It meant that if anything went wrong up there – bye!")

Despite its apparent flaw, the novelist still regards this as his favourite aircraft to fly.

Reality hit home when the dangers of flying became brutally apparent."We flew in it and two of us died in it,"said Frederick. But the bulldog spirit that is the emblem of Britishness shone through; "We had lost two, but we were not going to stop flying. We were raised in the shadow – being teenagers in the 50s – of the legendary few in the 1940s."

The burying of his two comrades remains a memory forever imprinted on the flyer's mind.

"In hindsight, the 50s generation were an okay lot. We were up to everything and afraid of nothing."

So, what was so special about the Vampire? "It was just the first jet. In 1956 I trained on a Provost. It was pedestrian. Ordinary. It didn't go that high. It didn't go that fast. It would do basic aerobatics. But the Vampire was a fighter. It was transferred from Fighter Command, Strike Command as it was called then, to Flying Training Command so although then called an Advanced Flying Trainer, it was still then a Vampire fighter. So, I can proudly say I flew fighters at eighteen. I think the only one who ever did."

Out of the fourteen who passed out on parade back in 1958, Frederick Forsyth is the sole survivor. The memory of these men is being marked by a new TV documentary, The Vampire Boys' to which the novelist has contributed his recollections.

For the pilot who thrived on the twisting, turning and spinning whilst in the air, what is the fascination with flying? The best-selling author is resolute with no flicker of hesitation; "Exhilaration. To be free of gravity, the bonds of the earth. Flying is twisting and turning, up there, looking down at the landscape or seascape and rolling in the clouds – huge cathedrals of white vapour – diving through them and out the other side."

However, there have been scary moments too.

"I remember in a Vampire I went out of control and plunged 25,000 feet from thirty to five, out of control. Why it did this I do not know but I was able to stop the twisting and turning, convert the motion of the spinning aircraft into a downward dive with level wings and then you pull out and see the ground rushing up and then sky beyond the nose cone. Then you are out of the dive and back to flight. I don't know why it went out of control. It just did. I was doing high altitude aerobatics and the wings just lost purchase, so yes, scary!"

To a person who had not been born in those times, those heady days of yesteryear were vividly brought to life by the novelist who considers having his Wings stitched on as being one of the proudest moments in his life, along with the birth of his first-born son, bowing in front of HM The Queen to receive his CBE in 1997 and finally fulfilling his boyhood ambition, at aged seventy-five to fly in a spitfire.

"At Duxford, I climbed into the rear seat (specially converted Spitfire with a seat behind the pilots) and took off. When the air marshall learned that I got my wings on Vampires, he said 'you have control.' So, I took the throttle in the left hand and then rolled her. I thought I am doing what so few people have ever done....I am flying a spitfire...It was ultrasensitive to the touch!"

What qualities do you think make a good pilot? "Staying calm when things go wrong is no 1, 2 & 3. That may sound easy, but surprisingly it isn't. Anyone can fly when things go right. In the flying training programme 80-90% was handling emergencies. In other words, if a sky is like this (calm) and you are flying straight and level and you are not climbing or diving and you are not rolling or banking, anyone can do that. It is when something goes wrong. You react and reflect. And you must not panic or lose it."

Though the memories are fond ones, the world-famous author has no regrets about not signing up for the long haul. He could have upgraded to a direct commission, adding six years to his tally, or even a permanent twenty-two year one, but for the boy who had two ambitions – one was to fly, the options were limited. "The Cranwell boys would get the cream of the squadrons. I don't think if I had stayed that I would have been airborne again. If I was lucky, I might have made co-pilot on a freighter flying milk and mail to Malta. More likely I would be flying a desk."

The other ambition? To travel – ably encouraged by his father, who wanted more for his son than be a shop keeper in a small Kentish town. "He was in a rut, but at least it was a fur lined rut," reminisced the author. "He said don't be trapped in this little, tiny one-horse town."

"Writing novels. That was another fluke. My life is full of flukes."

Had Frederik Forsyth stayed in the RAF he may never have embarked on a journalistic career that saw him fulfil that second ambition to travel the world. He may never have worked in France that sowed the seeds for a certain thriller being written.....Call it destiny, call it fate, Frederick Forsyth's life, just like his flying career, has been full of twists and turns.

Fame may have come with his success, but it has not blighted his life. "If you decline to be impressed by yourself you will succeed," he said wisely.

Our time in the sun drinking tea and recounting his earlier days is coming to an end. There is a wistful smile as he deliberates on my last question - how would he liked to be remembered? - whilst looking into the clear blue sky.

"Of all the adjectives, I think the one that I like is 'kind.' I hope I have been kind to other people. That I would regard as a compliment – to be thought of as a kind person. It is short but it takes in a lot. It signifies a lot."

Tackling Rural Crime

Rural crime encompasses a diverse array of illicit activities which occur in sparsely populated areas, typically outside of urban or suburban environments. These areas are characterised by small communities, farms, and open spaces.

Rural crime tends to fall into one of four categories:

- Wildlife Crime like animal cruelty, poaching, badger baiting, killing or taking of wild birds or damage of protected habitats
- 2. Agricultural Crime like theft of, or damage to plant vehicles, equipment or livestock
- Heritage Crime like lead theft from churches, damage to ancient monuments and illegal metal detecting
- Environmental Crime ranging from illegal dumping of hazardous waste to the pollution of water sources

Rural crime is an issue for large areas of the country, but it tends to go unreported. Its consequences include potential increases in insurance premiums, food prices with harm to local communities. By taking some simple steps you can help prevent crime.

 Equipment and tool security in rural areas is crucial because agricultural equipment, tools, and machinery are often valuable assets and are at risk of theft due to their high market value. Use lockable barns, sheds, or garages to store equipment and tools when they are not in use.

- Estate and building security: take a good look around your property boundary for any potential places where it could be made more secure. Consider CCTV or audible alarm systems, use gravel on driveways, keep fences and boundary hedges in good repair.
- Livestock and equine security: check your livestock and the security of boundary fencing regularly; if possible, park trailers in a well-lit location and secure them with wheel clamps, hitch locks or a ground anchor.
- Diesel and scrap metal theft is a problem for many farms and rural properties. Store diesel in a secure storage tank with a bund and good quality locks; plant prickly shrubs around tanks, regularly check fill levels, consider using a mobile bowser so that fuel can be removed from isolated sites and kept in a secure place when not in use. Mark valuable metal, such as lead and copper; paint a distinctive mark on gates and take photos.
- Fly Tipping: gates, fencing and CCTV cameras properly strategically placed can act as strong deterrents and provide valuable evidence for prosecuting illegal dumping.

Bat Walk - We were fortunate with the weather on 30th September, so there was a good turnout and plenty of bats to detect with the equipment on loan from the North Bucks Bat Group. We heard (and caught glimpses of by torchlight) both Pipistrelle (tiny, but with an 8"/20cm wingspan) and Daubenton's (slightly larger, but still lighter than a Robin) bats.

Annual Subscription - Ever since FoNC was founded 15 years ago (as a successor to earlier groups), subscriptions have been £5 per annum for adults and £2 for younger members (under 18). Although membership numbers have steadily increased over the years, this amount is no longer sufficient to cover our running costs (principally public liability insurance), so at our last committee meeting we decided to increase the sub to £10 for adults and £5 for under-18s. This will be ratified at the AGM next year.

Mower update - We have been very pleased with the performance of our new flail mower, which has now been deployed on the bracken growing over the Clumps (at the bottom, Bradenham end of the Common) as well as along Ladies' Mile (at the top end) to very good effect, and we've received plenty of compliments on this work.

The flail needs to be towed, and for this purpose we use our (rather ancient) ride-on mower, which can't last forever. We've been very generously offered another 'pre-loved' mower, which we would like to keep in reserve in case our existing mower fails. What we need is somewhere this mower can be stored in the

meantime, ideally somewhere close to the Common. If anyone has space in a shed or their garage, please let me know!

Meanwhile, we are continuing to pursue sources of funding that would allow us to purchase a new mower or quad bike to provide a reliable tow for the flail.

Activities - Our AGM will take place on Friday 2nd February at 7:30pm in the Village Hall. There will be a talk by Dave Brown from RAF High Wycombe on the history of the base in its various incarnations.

Our regular walks continue: first Wednesday of the month at 10:30 for a short (1 hr) circular walk; and third Monday at 9:25 for a longer walk followed by (optional) lunch – both starting from the Village Hall. If you wish to join in with either of our weekly working parties, on Tuesday and Thursday mornings, our web site (where our walking and other activities are also listed) has all the contact details:



Growing Your Own

Most readers will be appalled that the government continues with the mass culling of badgers – completely eradicating them in certain areas – to counter the spread of bovine TB. However, help may be at hand following a farmer's astonishing experiment, reported on the TODAY programme on Radio 4.

The farmer had a herd of 600 cattle. About the year 2002 he was in the same situation as neighbouring farmers – he lost stock to bovine TB and the local badgers had TB. Then, for reasons unconnected with the TB problem he decided to go organic. He was astonished to find that his cattle no longer went down with TB. In the subsequent five years he did not have a single case of bovine TB in his herd. All the surrounding farmers' cattle continued to be plagued with TB.

He decided that it was the change of diet which must have been responsible. Previously his cattle were fed largely on maize. When he went organic he fed his cattle largely on clover. He looked into this and found that maize was deficient in two vital trace elements – selenium and iodine. Clover was not deficient in those two trace elements. In other words, his cattle had previously been suffering from malnutrition and thus had reduced defences against an attack of bovine TB.

He therefore tried an experiment with his badgers. Badgers love maize and he felt there was a possibility that they also were suffering from malnutrition. He put buckets of feed rich in the missing two trace elements near their setts. His badgers no longer suffered from TB – but surrounding farmers' badgers continued to suffer.

If this "cure" for bovine TB can be substantiated there would be no need for the government to conduct the mass culling of badgers. All that farmers would have to do is to feed their cattle food supplements containing the two missing trace elements. They could do the same with their badgers and whole swathes of the country could be free from the scourge of bovine TB.

The farmers in our area started to grow maize for the first time about the year 1995. If cattle have been fed on maize ever since and have thus been suffering from malnutrition ever since, that could explain why the problem of bovine TB has been increasing exponentially, to the increasing frustration of the farmers, the government and badger-lovers. The "plague" could be down to the change of the cattles' diet on to maize. So the mass culling of badgers has just been an enormous mistake.

There is a lesson here for human health. About one third of the UK population is suffering from the effects of malnutrition. One example is that people on average consume only a quarter of the Recommended Daily Amount (RDA) of selenium and less than the recommended RDAs of the other 18 essential trace elements. By growing nutrient-rich food in our gardens and allotments and having a balanced diet we gardeners have a better chance of avoiding malnutrition.



Local Tales - Owen Dean, the last local bodger

As I feel sure everyone will know, Wycombe was once called "THE furniture town." It had an industry that gave it a very distinct character. It was rather a pleasant industry: It made very little waste apart from sawdust and enough offcuts to light people's fires; it offered employment to thousands and many of the jobs required skills from both men and women. Even Wycombe Wanderers football team had the nickname 'the Chairboys'. I suppose they still have but for how long will that survive? Will it disappear like (almost all) of the chair making?

Most families, including my own, had someone working in the furniture trade. I try to avoid writing about my own family but we do have one small claim to fame. My uncle Owen Dean was the last of the chair bodgers. The word 'bodger' suggests someone who is unskilled and who makes a poor job of all he/she does, but in the case of chair bodgers, the opposite is the case; they were very skilled. Owen Dean lived in Hampden and he worked in nearby woodland. He had to bid in an auction for standing beech trees of just the right size. He would then set up his pole lathe in the wood, fell suitable trees, cut them into baulks of just the right length (which explains the many small sawpits you find in woods around here) and then split them down into square billets of just the right size. The billets were then shaped with a drawknife to take the corners off and produce a shape suitable to be turned on a lathe. The lathe was of a kind first used in the Middle Ages. It consisted of a long, flexible pole

anchored to the ground at one end and with a cord at the other. The cord came down to a foot treadle. In turn, each billet would be entwined in a twist of the cord and clamped between the centres of the lathe. The noise of the turning was very distinctive: not the continuous sound of a modern lathe but a regular series of short bursts of sound as the foot treadle span the billet and the pole pulled the cord back up. The operator used a chisel to shape whatever was needed – the chair leg, spar or rail for a Windsor chair. The top of each leg had to be exactly the right diameter to fit the hole bored in the Elm seat and the legs had to be a matching set. All this seemed to be done by eye, as I can't remember seeing any measuring involved.

Being such an historical oddity – the last of his kind – Owen Dean eventually attracted a lot of attention. When working in the woods near Chequers the various Prime ministers would be brought out to see the spectacle. When Uncle Owen visited us in Stocking Lane he and my Dad would often argue about politics, but Uncle Owen could always cap any argument by saying "Well, as I said to Lloyd George", or whoever the latest Prime minister happened to be.

From the Vicarage - Rev Keith Johnson

One cannot help but be moved by the plight of the victims of the recent troubles in Jerusalem, Gaza and the surrounding region. At my time of writing, it is mid-October, tensions are high, the international community are seeking to provide humanitarian support and encouraging restraint on both sides, and events of the next few weeks appear uncertain.

Christians amount for 2% of the population in Israel, and yet their physical presence in the land where our Lord himself walked 2,000 years ago, and as peacemakers, cannot be understated.

The history of Jerusalem is bloody. From the Crusades to conflict in the last century, can there ever truly be peace on earth in a land considered holy by Jews, Muslims and Christians alike?

The first time I visited Jerusalem on pilgrimage in 2012, we heard a remarkable speaker at St George's Cathedral preach in English and Hebrew on the Sunday morning - Hosam Naoum, who at the time was the Canon Pastor/Dean of the Cathedral. I wasn't surprised in 2021 when his appointment as Archbishop of Jerusalem was announced. Our tour leader, the Bishop of Rochester invited him to come and speak with us at our hotel a couple of nights later, and we were able to hear more about his calling to become a Priest, coming from a Palestinian Anglican background, and his perspective as a Christian in Jerusalem. I was moved by his words that night, and have endeavoured to keep in touch with the Cathedral since, thanks to Facebook.

Archbishop Hosam has written in response to the terrible events in the area, and I have copied below an extract from his letter:

"Once again we find ourselves living through hard times in the Land of the Holy One, where we are surrounded by war, violence, hatred, and destruction. Many in our region now live with great fear and uncertainty.

Nevertheless, from Jerusalem, the City of the Resurrection, I send you all hope for the assurance of a better life: one with a brighter future, more blessed circumstances, and freedom from bloodshed, injustice, and death.


We condemn all acts of violence and killing, especially of civilians and the innocent. And we advocate for a just and comprehensive peace for all living here. In order to stop the vengeful cycle of violence, we exhort everyone to exercise self-control. Since everyone loses in war, we also call for all parties to pursue peaceful, diplomatic solutions towards a just and lasting agreement for both peoples in a two-state solution. Only in this way can we all enjoy freedom, justice, and peace."

Has there ever been a more critical time than now to respond to the words of Psalm 122:6: "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem: may those who love you be secure"?

I finish with the words of Archbishop Justin: "Pray for the people of Israel, Gaza and the West Bank. Pray for the future of the Holy Land. Pray for those who will weep, and fear, and die tonight.

Lord God, we pray, by your great mercy, defend your children from all perils and dangers of this night." Amen.





Remember, Remember.....

If you're a new dog owner, you may not have considered the potential impact that the Firework season may have on your pooch.

Many animals find fireworks scary. Owners will often see their pets struggling, either frozen with fear or, in the most dangerous circumstances – bolting when out on a walk.

Planning ahead can help dogs cope with the Firework season, which seems to get longer each year!

- Walk your dog during daylight hours if your usual routine involves a walk after dark, replace it with simple games, or treats indoors, so that your dog has some mental enrichment to replace the physical exercise.
- Classic FM have dedicated programmes for pets over 2 nights on 4th/5th November, playing calming music between 5-9pm.
- Provide toys and treats, such as kongs/lick mats to keep your dog occupied when the fireworks start and wherever possible, stay with your dog, doing usual activities, without making a big deal of the noises. If your dog can see that you are not reacting, this can help to decrease their anxiety.
- Create a safe space, this can be as simple as putting a blanket over a table, so that your dog can hide under it. If your dog is used to sleeping in a crate, put blankets over the top and on the inside.
- Keep the curtains and windows closed to muffle firework sounds and flashes.
- If you are planning on letting fireworks off at your home, consider your neighbours and let them know, so that they may make plans to minimise stress to any pets they may have.
- In the long-term, getting your dog used to loud sounds can be a better solution. By gradually desensitising your dog to loud noises over a period of time, you can teach them to associate these sounds with something positive, instead of something to be scared of.

Even if you have a totally non-reactive pooch, taking them to an organised firework display can cause your dog's senses to be hugely over stimulated. So do the right thing, leave them at home, switch on Classic FM and leave them with a chew or toy.

If you are going to a local firework display, have fun!

Last month we bravely went where your palates may never have trodden before and I think we all survived – thrived even! So, we shall do the same again and explore some more under-known, under-valued and under-appreciated grapes that could add a little variety to your shelves/racks. Only this time the focus is on whites rather than reds...

Falanghina

Something of an unknown quantity to your average drinker on the streets, this enchanting white grape is much loved amongst those in the know. Falanginha's arrival at the club is not the marquee name summer signing the Galactico seekers would welcome but it promises to bring some much-needed freshness, vibrancy and structure to the squad. Less Figo and Zidane, more Kante and Mahrez. Not exactly a £200m Neymar or £100m Grealish, but not dissimilar to a £1m Jamie Vardy or £60k Seamus Coleman.

So many of Italy's white wine grapes produce crisp dry whites, but they can be a little neutral with limited character. However, Falanghina has it in spades, with its distinct orange peel, cut cumquat and quince notes, distinctive herbiness and soft leafy palate which works well as an aperitif, light enough for a summer garden lunch, but also matches brilliantly with crab, mussels and barbecued prawns.

Assyrtiko

Fresh, full of flavour and with decent length and balance, the Assyrtikos on some of the value supermarket shelves bring way more to the party than they have a right to and are great bargains. They sort of remind me of Riyad Mahrez...

Greece is not in the upper echelons of the wine world's class system, just as Algeria are do not eat at football's top table. Also, when you enter £6.99 into the Wine Giant Booze-Football Price Conversion app (patent pending) it comes out at £450,000. The exact amount Leicester City paid for Mahrez; an unknown Le Harve winger who scored about 3 goals a season. Fast-forward a couple of

years and he was PFA Player of the Year as Leicester won the Premier League in the greatest upset in football history. Similarly, a year or two on from seeing this Greek wonder on the shelves and it's gaining quite a following.

Picpoul de Pinet

PdP is by no means a new region or grape but is sort of an up-and-comer in the UK who's quietly risen through the rankings like an unfashionable boxer before making the wider public realise that it is actually quite special. Tyson Fury on the eve of the Klitschko fight is not an obvious allegory for a light, delicate and refined French white wine but I feel I can make such bold claims!

Tyson's Gypsy upbringing needs no introduction, nor does the long history of prejudice this brings with it. However, I imagine few will be aware that for a long time Picpoul was viewed with similarly discriminatory views in the world of French wine. Picpoul is the name of the grape and the de Pinet part indicates that it is from one of a few communes in the Languedoc region of southern France. In the 19th century these communes specialised in dubious imitation Madeiras before moving into providing wine that was used in Vermouth. However, the plunging sales in Vermouth in the 70s and 80s meant it to reinvent itself to survive. This was no mean feat - who wanted an unexciting seaside white discarded by the vermouth trade, produced in a nondescript little zone one-eighth the size of Corbières? Well, everyone does it turns out. Like the current public clamour for Fury, the average man on the street is also calling for a bottle of Picpoul to lubricate their summers and provide the soundtrack to their seafood dishes. It is produced near the coast and one can almost taste the summery sea in every bottle.

Like Fury, Picpoul's secret is that is appeals to a wide range of palates with its upbeat freshness – it offers something straightforward and unpretentious but also zesty, zingy and steely with hidden depths.

I will not pretend that a rainy, November evening is the ideal drinking conditions for this bottle. However, if Tyson Fury can defeat Klitchsko for the first time in 10 years and follow it up with the most unbelievable of sporting redemption stories, I have no doubt that a Picpoul can win your hearts on a wet, windy, Monday night – if not, then wait until that really hot week in June and try it again then!






