





The village hall committee meeting was held on 4th. September. There were 11members present. The committee was told that the lease for Bon Ami has now been completed and is now in place. The aertex covering on the kitchen ceiling has been removed and the ceiling has been replastered and a working party repainted the ceiling and then new lights were fitted. I would like to thank Jenny Tench, Linda Clark and Dennis Lynch for their help in painting the ceiling, it was noted that the whole of the kitchen needs redecorating and quotes will be obtained for doing this.

The committee are still receiving complaints about the dog fouling on the crick. We now have an extra 3 bins for the dog mess but it appears that a few dog owners ignore that their dog has fouled and do not clear up after the event. Please keep your dog on a lead at all times on the crick. Dog owners who ignore this will be asked to leave the crick. If you see an incident of this, let the dog owner know so that they can make amends. We do not want to ban all dogs from the crick but if the situation does not improve we will have to consider taking this action.

The tennis club has submitted a planning application for LED lighting on the tennis courts.

The next fundraising event for the Village Hall is the Fireworks on the 4th. November. The fireworks committee has decided that no tickets for the event will be sold on the day, so you will need to buy them in advance either from a local vendor or from the fireworks website. The 1st of July was the start of a new Rotary Year. Last year, amongst others, our main focus was the youth, the elderly of Princes Risborough (PR) and surrounding areas, and support to Ukraine. During the past 8 years we have donated over £240,000 to a range of projects, in the past 12 months we have donated over £33,000. Amongst other young recipients were the PR Youth Club, now also hosting Ukrainian youngsters, Bucks Young Carers sailing away-days, a number of local schools which entered 1300 children in our Art Competition (12 schools signed up for it), a Monks Risborough School play-area project, the Longwick School library, a Lane End Parish playground, Bledlow Ridge School and support to years 10 and 11 Interact Clubs at PR School and the RGS. We provided the town's "seniors" with a Christmas Lunch and a Coronation Lunch, and we made donations to the Princes Centre and supported the Bourne End Care Centre. We have continued to support the Lacey Green/Loosley Row Ukraine2Chilterns Charity, which is supporting over 200 Ukrainian guests, and we have been involved with a number of their social events and helped finding work

and accommodation for them. We have also donated to a Rotary International fund providing equipment for mobile emergency operating theatres in Ukraine. The Club is now examining where our help will be needed in the next 12 months.

In addition to all this work we are a fun, friendly Club of men and women, the concept of Rotary being friendship and companionship. Local Tales - Lost for Words!

I came across the accompanying illustration showing an assortment of the tools of Jack Hill the chairmaker. I think that included in it are all those necessary to make a Windsor chair, (less a saw and a lathe). I recognised the tools and I am sure that many readers will too, but despite being familiar with the trade I can't remember some of their names. The tools and their names fall into disuse as the trade dies. The same, of course, applies to words in general. Many become redundant or replaced by others. Some we may christen "dialect" words if older generations, or other communities still use them. We do hang on to some for a very long time – you may still hear 'hern', 'hisn' and 'yourn', (hers, his and yours), from Middle English dated c1150 to c1470.

The other day, when most of Europe seemed to be roasting and this country was rather on the cool side, someone told me that they were "pizzle-twisted". They meant, of course, that they were cold. Now, I understood what they meant and I'm sure many readers will too. 'Pizzled' is an old dialect word in old Bucks and probably other local, traditional languages and I have used it myself. this set me wondering how many other words of that sort I might understand if not use.

How many of us would understand if someone was described as 'ferrucking' or 'ferreting' about – that is, poking around looking for something? Would you say that someone "quilted the lot" if they ate everything? If someone said they had "gurt hommocks" would you look to check the size of their feet? If I 'poshed' an egg would you know that I had broken it?

Many expressions using dialect words seem much more modern. If I ambled would you say I just 'poodled' along? If I 'mozed' along it would be to move quickly. A tummy ache might give you real 'jip' or pain. If I am 'pimmocky' would you describe me as fussy? Most, I think would know what a 'Didicoy' was and would call the smallest puppy in a litter the 'dillen'. All these are dialect words, perhaps being lost but not yet and still echo in the memory. Personally, I would like to know if anyone else called a policeman a 'pibby' as I did as a boy?

We grew up to hear words that our family or social group would not use, or perhaps, with a different pronunciation. So, he wrote 'to Emma Chisset with thanks and best wishes' and signed it. She, however protested: Na Na emmachisit? emmachisit?-how much is it!

# Minimising the Risk of Fraud

Fraud protection involves safeguarding oneself against deceptive practices that can lead to financial or personal harm. Taking positive action to block the routes of communication often exploited by criminals is essential. Being aware of potential threats helps you recognise and avoid them.

Protect personal information: be cautious about sharing personal information online or over the phone. Only provide information to reputable sources and avoid oversharing on social media.

Be wary of unsolicited communication: confirm the identity of individuals or organisations before sharing sensitive information or making transactions.

Say 'No' to doorstep callers:they might claim to offer services, products, or assistance. Politely but firmly decline any offers or requests, and avoid sharing any sensitive details or signing any documents without thorough verification.

Criminals are experts at impersonating people, organisations and the police. They spend hours researching you for their scams, hoping you'll let your

guard down for just a moment. Stop and think. It could protect you and your money.

If you have been a victim of fraud, you should report it to Action Fraud, the UK's national reporting centre for fraud and cybercrime. You can call the Action Fraud team on 0300 123 2040 or use the online form on their website www.actionfraud.police.uk. Reporting fraud helps track down and stop fraudsters and can prevent other people from becoming their victims.

Remember, falling victim to fraud is never your fault. Scammers are skilled at manipulation, and anyone can become a target. It's essential to acknowledge that the experience of fraud, even if prevented, can still trigger feelings of vulnerability, anger, or anxiety. Remember, these emotions are natural reactions, and seeking support from friends, family, or professionals can provide a safe space to process them. 
We all appreciated the trouble that had been taken to prepare the game.

### Growing Your Own - Give yourself a 19.1% pay rise!

Give yourself a 19.1% pay rise. Now, that is quite an attention-getter for the start of an article! Let me explain. According to the retail industry data provider Kantar, comparing vegetable prices for May to July 2023 with two years earlier, prices had risen by 19.1%. So, your labours in your garden or on your allotment are now worth 19.1% more than two years earlier. A 19.1 % increase! (The price of seeds will have also risen, but the cost of seeds is very small compared to the value of the vegetables produced.) So that part of your daily labours will have been rewarded with a 19.1% increase in two years. GROW YOUR OWN!

How have my crops grown this year? It has been a crazy year, with that extremely hot, dry period in May/June followed by a quite cold and very wet July and early August. In the greenhouse, which has an automatic watering system, the Carmen F1 all-female cucumbers have been twice as productive as in previous years, the Corno di Toro peppers three times as productive and the Black Hamburg grapes four times as productive. Outside, in the vegetable plot, it has been a different story. Twice-sown carrots have been an absolute disaster, as have the strawberries. Sweetcorn is about average, radishes a disaster, poirée brilliant, beetroot brilliant, celeriac good, leeks very poor and butternut squash OK. Braeburn apples are about average and, as I have reported before, the two espalier peach trees have survived the drought but produced no peaches and the espalier apricot died. The climbing French beans are average (but delicious) and the elephant garlic has a reduced crop. I planted the Centurion F1 onion sets close together in order to produce smaller onions and what happened – the largest onions I have ever grown! What a year! How unpredictable!

A new menace has appeared in the garden - a large slug. There are on average in the UK about 60 slugs per square foot. Nearly all of remain them in the soil and



never come to the surface. In Naphill and Walters Ash we probably have more than 60 per square foot since our soil, a clay loam, is paradise for slugs. Nearly all of the ones which attack our plants above ground are nocturnal. I have spent over 50 years dealing with slugs here, but this new one is a real monster. They attack our plants in broad daylight and are very large, some 2.5 inches long and very fat (and they all seem to be about the same size). They are reddish-brown in colour and are everywhere, a real plague. I suppose the newcomers are out and about in broad daylight because their size must make it difficult for them to burrow down into the soil. It would be interesting to hear whether other gardeners in Naphill and Walter's Ash have noticed this new menace.





# Friends of Naphill Common

#### Minibeast Safari

Our safari took place on Sunday 3rd September, a warm day, and was well attended. We walked around Vincent's Meadow (at the bottom of Downley Road) and encountered crickets and grasshoppers as well as crab spiders. For me (and, I think, for others) one of the highlights was the discovery of Touch-menot Balsam (*Impatiens noli-tangere*, Latin scholars will spot the connection, and gardeners will know Impatiens species as "Busy Lizzie"). I was previously unaware of this native species, but was familiar with Himalayan Balsam, an invasive species now spreading throughout Europe. Both balsams spread their seeds in the same way, by seed pods that 'explode' on touch, when ripe.

#### Mower update

Our newly purchased flail is performing well, able to tackle longer grass and bracken that would have defeated the old mower – see illustration of work on the Clumps at the Bradenham end of the Common. The old mower recently suffered another failure, this time of the magneto. Fortunately, parts for the engine are still readily available, unlike spares for the mower deck (which is why we needed the flail), and the mower/tractor is now back in operation. We are still working to raise the funds needed for a replacement.

# Better health: Let's Do This

Strolling up to the allotments in Hughenden Valley it was great to see people busy harvesting their plants. As residents in Naphill and Walter's Ash will know being an allotment holder is hugely satisfying despite all the hard work! Hughenden Street Association is keen to help the Parish Council to encourage more residents to rent an allotment. The health benefits are many: physical and mental well-being are improved and the chance to natter with other allotment holders and passing members of the public are additional benefits.



Whilst on the subject of health, October is of course Stoptober, and many people will take advantage of the opportunity to stop smoking. There are plenty of useful resources available and it is good to know that the benefits begin to appear in a matter of weeks. These include:

After 20 minutes your pulse rate will already be starting to return to normal. Did you know that smoking raised it?

After 48 hours all carbon monoxide is flushed out. Your lungs are clearing out mucus and your senses of taste and smell are improving.

After 72 hours you may notice that you are breathing more easily, and your energy levels will be increasing. This is great news, isn't it?

Despite declining smoking rates, there are nearly 6 million adults in England who still smoke. Smoking remains the single biggest cause of preventable illness and death in England. It also costs the NHS £2.4 billion a year, with the wider cost to society in England being approximately £17 billion a year (GOV.UK)

Quitting smoking is not easy and having supportive friends and family members is important. Evidence shows that people are FIVE times more likely to quit for good if they can make it to at least 28 days smoke free. If you know someone who smokes and would like to quit, then you can help them. Encouragement and support is highly complementary to the medical and other professional support available.

Another factor is the sheer cost of smoking. HMRC reveals that the average smoker can save around £2,000 a year when they quit.

In Type 1 diabetes insufficient insulin is produced because the body's immune system attacks the islet cells in the pancreas that makes insulin. As a result, glucose (or sugar) in the blood can become too high. Its onset is not due to age or being overweight. Jo believes she contracted the illness through her first pregnancy where she was prescribed insulin. When she ceased taking insulin after the birth her weight fell to just six stone, "....and my body was essentially eating itself," said Jo in disbelief.

Living with an ailment that has no known cure is one thing. Accepting it is another. "I accepted it far quicker than I thought I would, but I have had moments of denial. With a busy life you don't always have time to check your blood sugars. I did become a little kamikaze about it which was foolish. But I do believe every diabetic goes through that."

A check-up at her annual retinopathy (disease of the retina) clinic last year revealed a proliferative diabetic retinopathy in her right eye. This causes the small retinal blood vessels in the eye to become diseased. Left unchecked it can cause permanent blindness. A course of laser treatment in her right eye has slowed down any deterioration. "My consultant said if the condition had not been found I would probably have had only five years of sight left. To help my eyes I take omega oils, mackerel and leafy green vegetables."

Diabetes UK annually run the One Million Step Challenge with over 15,000 taking part this year nationwide. Initially, Jo had no interest in doing it for fear that she would finally have to acknowledge her demons. "I have always been in that horrible frame of mind of never wanting to do something like this because it makes what I have real. To be honest I didn't want to put myself out there and say, 'I'm diabetic.""

However, Jo is a fighter and facing her demon within has been a cathartic experience. In accepting her illness and helping herself, she also hopes to help others. Running from 1 July 23 to 30 September 23, Jo has already walked 700,000 steps, with an average of 14,000 steps a day. A wall



chart helps her plot her daily progress and she admits to being obsessive about the number of steps she achieves each day.

So, what advice would Jo give to someone who has been newly diagnosed with diabetes? The mother of four suggests doing research into the illness and joining social media groups. "I didn't do that in the beginning, and I really wish I had," commented Jo. "There is a whole force out there - particularly younger people who are wearing all of their tech with pride. I read a lot of comments on social media from the younger people who have diabetes but they're still continuing to smoke, and I think it's silly. Don't do it! You have to look after every single blood vessel in your body because it will come back to haunt you. It is all about acceptance." The One Million Step challenge runs from 1 July – 30 Sept 23. 




#### Bradenham Parish Council

The parish council met as usual for its September meeting at Bradenham Cricket Club. Buckinghamshire Councillor Carl Etholen reported that three parish councils had petitioned the North West Community Board for speed reduction. The Lacey Green petition affects our parish. They would like the speed limit between Walter's Ash and Lacey Green reduced from the national speed limit of 60miles/hr to 40 miles/hour. The cost of getting this done is substantial, it involves considerable legal costs and several consultations. We have not been asked to contribute. We will keep you updated when we hear more.

A number of issues were raised with our Buckinghamshire Councillor about parking and the conditions of pavements in High Wycombe. Also Main Road, Naphill having been blocked by a vehicle delivering materials to the works laying the high voltage cables and Gigaclear not informing residents of works being carried out.

Hedges - We have received a number of complaints of hedges not having been cut back and obstructing foot/cycle paths. It is the landowner's responsibility to cut back their hedges and trees so that they do not obstruct foot/cycle paths. Some hedges concerned are Buckinghamshire

Council's responsibility others are privately owned. The clerk will be contacting those landowners asking them to clear the foot/cycle paths.

The dog waste bin in Bradenham village is often overflowing after the weekend, it does get emptied on a weekly basis. We are going to purchase a larger bin once our waste disposal company has confirmed they would be able to handle a larger bin. We are delighted that the dog waste bins are being used, but can we ask you, if the bin is full can you please take your dog waste home.

Buckinghamshire Council have launched a survey about the way they spend and intend to spend their money. This is the way residents can tell the council which areas they want prioritised in next year's budget please look at 'Money Matters'

## Gordon the Bird Man - A strange Year for Birds

So far it has been a strange year for a birder. Bramblings did not appear in the garden until March 19, reaching a maximum of 18 on April 11, by which time they will normally be moving North. Numbers gradually declined until last recorded on May 3rd which is twenty days later than previously last seen. This was followed by a very quiet May and June, probably resulting from first nest failures due to the cold and wet. July saw a large increase in numbers of Blue and Great Tits, which continues to this date. Highlights so far being a female Spotted Flycatcher on August 3rd and 4th although I was not happy seeing her feeding on butterflies from the Buddleias, the other being a male Bullfinch on August 10th, the first to be seen in the garden since 2019.

Further afield, birds which a few years ago would have attracted Twitchers from all over the country now seem not

to merit a glance. A visit to Wallasea Island produced Great White Egrets, a Cattle Egret, two Black Winged Stilts and a Glossy Ibis. At Dungeness, a Purple Heron and again a Black Winged Stilt all were given little interest. Every one was looking for a Black Crowned Night Heron (not seen when I was there). All these are birds associated with Africa and until recently Southern Europe was at the Northern edge of their range. Now, all except the Night Heron breed in this country and all have arrived through natural colonization.

A visit to the West side of Poole Harbour near Wareham saw a White Tailed Sea Eagle and two Ospreys. I know these are captive bred introductions, not natural colonizations, but on the "South Coast" and the only interest shown were a few holiday visitors asking if I knew what the huge bird was.

#### Hounds & Howl-o'ween

I started writing this month's article whilst we were experiencing our somewhat hot spell, so it has been challenging to get my head around this month's topic!

Halloween can be a scary time of year for our dogs. If you are happy to have trick or treaters, then pop a carved pumpkin, or other ghoulish item outside your house, this will let people know you are expecting visitors.

- \* Unexpected people at the door, dressed in costumes is confusing and at times, frightening for them, but there's lots you can do to keep your dog safe and content. Here's a few suggestions:
- \* Walk your dog before it gets dark. If this is not possible, think about fun ways to tire them out indoors, such as putting some kibble or treats in a towel and rolling it up for them to find. Take a look at the Bluecross website for ideas on indoor games for your pooch. (https://www.bluecross.org.uk/advice/dog/indoor-games-for-dogs)
- \* Prepare treats and games that you can give your dog when the doorbell goes, to keep them busy when trick or treaters arrive. Also, have treats ready to give visitors, to minimise stress to your dog.
- \* Keep your dog separate from the entrance to your home, either in another room, or put up a stairgate. Even the friendliest dog can get spooked by children dressed up in ghoulish costumes and some children will also be wary/not know how to act towards a dog.
- \* If your dog is nervous around people, pop a note on your gate asking trick or treaters not to knock on the door & leave Halloween treats outside. If doing this, be careful not to leave treats that are potentially toxic to dogs. There may be some who are dressed up and out trick or treating (with their owners!)
- \* Make sure your dog has a safe space to go if they are worried, with a treat toy, or similar & reward and reassure them at regular intervals.

This year's washout summer, followed by an early autumn heat wave has had us all scratching our heads. Just what is going on with our climate? With our planet?

My partner and I returned from Gibraltar just as the June heat wave ended. Things were boding well and we were excited for our fix of English summer before returning to Gibraltar in September. Hmmm....that went well. Garden jobs went undone as we were pinned indoors by rain and high winds. When we did manage to get out, the lawn took twice as long to cut as the grass had grown so much and there seemed to be three times as much deadheading to do. Don't even go there on maintenance. 'Ensure all woodwork is completely dry before applying' the instructions on the wood treatment tin said. As if that was going to happen! I could barely get my washing dry, let alone have the timbers of my raised beds dry enough for the regular anti-rot treatment they needed.

The September warmth was not so unusual. I remember as a teacher the children always returned to school in summer uniform for the first two weeks of term before switching to their winter clothing. On a number of occasions, this was extended, even as far as half term because the weather was still so warm. What was different this year was the height the mercury rose to, especially since the UK temperatures frequently exceeded those in Gibraltar!

The strange weather has had far more deadly effects elsewhere. I didn't even know there was such as thing as a Mediterranean Cyclone until the TV weather forecaster explained the weather science behind the catastrophic storms experienced in Libya. This coupled with earthquakes in Morocco – it's not just been our weather that has behaved in a disturbed way.

### A Wine Giant Essay - Off The Beaten Track

It is part of our evolutionary journey as humans to be a little bit suspicious of change – too much could literally kill you. There are many examples in modern society of things that cannot change: one's football team, a leopard's spots, political leanings and the exact grape, region and producer of a bottle of white that my wife will drink without pulling a disapproving face and saying it tastes like vomit.

The latter position is one of the modern world's biggest and most pressing issues, falling somewhere in between climate change and war, and we have a duty to address it. That's where this issue comes in - some of my tips for less common varieties that you should consider sipping in place of the standard fare that we fill our baskets with. This month the focus is on three reds that have recently improved my life...

Mencia – An up and coming little wonder from Spain. Suggested to me as the best pairing for pepperoni pizza by the Guardian's wine guru, Fiona Beckett – she wasn't wrong. Can come in a range of styles, but most I've tried have been tasted like a cooler, funkier and fun-loving cousin of Pinot Noir. Almost like a love-child of Burgundy and Beaujolais that has been raised surrounded by Latin flair.

**Saperavi** - An all-round 'turn it up to 11' sort of wine. Big colour, big flavour, big acidity and big tannins. You'd be forgiven for thinking it will be like drinking a Temuri Ketsbaia celebration, but the skill of a winemaker is in

harnessing these natural traits and crafting them into a beautifully balanced and intriguing palate pleasurer. Therefore, it will be bold, like a Ketsbaia boot through an advertising board and powerful, like a Gorgodze run from the base of a scrum. Yet, it will also be refreshing and sexy, like a Kinkladzhe dribble from half-way.

**Dolcetto** - Unlike many globe-trotting grapes who take Paul Young's approach to defining one's home, Dolcetto is almost entirely associated with one place – Piedmont. Not an easy region to hail from with uber talented and sought after brothers like Barolo and Barbaresco, yet Dolcetto is not to be sniffed at. Metaphorically speaking - obviously it is literally very much to be sniffed at or it just won't taste as good! It is a grape that is perhaps more similar to Barbera, in that it excels when young and does not need to be faffed with, pampered and stored for years on end until it becomes approachable. Dolcetto is a great pairing for most foods and brings generous berry fruits, hints of violets, an occasional undertone of savoriness, and enough tannin to balance richer foods but not so much weight that it's boorish. I know what you're thinking – talented and worthy in it's own right, but with more talented siblings; bold, no nonsense, but approachable and incredibly likeable; it's the Jack Charlton of red wine!




