### Friends of Naphill Common



Because of Covid restrictions, none of our regular FoNC activities are taking place at present, except for our working parties on Thursday mornings.

I write this having just completed one of my regular 'tours' of the ponds on the Common, where I was pleased to find that most of them had one or two dragonflies in attendance. As well as being an indicator that the ponds are generally in good condition and free from pollution, these are fascinating and beautiful creatures.

They are fierce predators and would present a terrifying sight, if you were the size of a fly! They spend almost all their life in freshwater, where they take the form of a nymph and prey on small water creatures. After one or two years in the water, the nymph (which will have been moulting regularly as its size increases) climbs up the stem of a water plant and undergoes a final moult into the winged, adult form. The flying insect has just a few weeks to mate and lay eggs in the water before it dies.

The first to appear in spring (generally April to May, depending on the warmth of the weather) are the damselflies. These smaller cousins of the dragonflies are around 30mm in length (just over an inch in old money) and can be identified because at rest they fold their wings down along the length of their body – dragonflies rest with their wings extended. The two common species in Naphill are the Large Red and the Common Blue, in their contrasting colours. They can often be seen flying in tandem, with a male closely clasping a female while she lays her eggs.

Shortly after the damselflies, the earliest dragonfly to appear in Naphill is the Broad-bodied Chaser, named for its noticeably flattened body (around 40mm long), which in the male is brightly coloured – the textbooks call it 'powder blue', but I think it looks lilac. The female is golden-brown. The common names of our dragonflies relate to their methods of hunting – we have darters, chasers and hawkers. Darters will perch (very often in the same spot) waiting for a small insect to fly by, which they will attempt to capture. If they fail, they rapidly return to their perch. Chasers behave similarly, but will spend longer in pursuit of their prey, while hawkers spend most of their time in the air.

Our other two common species, found between July and September, are the Common Darter – bright red in the male, dull brown in the female – also about 40mm in length, and the Southern Hawker – the male of which has bright blue and green markings against a dark background, the female being brown and green – and is much larger at about 70mm long. The hawker can often be found well away from the ponds, hunting along woodland rides. It's a very inquisitive dragonfly and may well fly close to take a look at you, but be reassured that they are entirely harmless and can't bite or sting.

Keep a look out for these insects when you're on the Common in spring and summer.

### **Growing Your Own**



*Imagine!* Imagine yourself on your back with arms and legs waving in the air, uttering shouts of gastronomic joy!! That can be the reaction if you grow your own and taste the first home-grown tomatoes of the season, perhaps in a tomato salad with a dressing of a mustard sauce with olive oil, vinegar, basil, salt and pepper. Wonderful! After a long winter and spring of supermarket tomatoes, usually bland and without real taste, it is just so thrilling to experience the real thing. A similar gastronomic delight can be experienced with the first beetroot, served with the same sauce. Those feasts of gastronomic delight are the principal reason to grow your own.

Why do home-grown fruit and vegetables taste so much better? First of all there is freshness, and the fact that the vitamins, which are hydrocarbon molecules, will not have had time to deteriorate. A more important reason is that when we grow our own, in soil enriched with farmyard manure, the result is fruit and vegetables which are rich in the 19 trace elements which our bodies need. The presence of those 19 trace elements in adequate amounts affects the taste of what we eat and makes the food so scrumptious after a winter of supermarket food.

Unfortunately our farmland has been terribly degraded by the vital trace elements being taken away in the crops and not replaced. The application of the fertilisers Nitrogen, Phosphorus and Potassium results in a doubling of the crop, but the crops are evermore deficient in the 16 other vital trace elements, which are: Selenium, Zinc, Magnesium, Copper, Calcium, Iron, Manganese, Chromium, Molybdenum, Boron, Sodium, Chloride, Nickel, Cobalt, Vanadium and Fluoride. The UK Ministry of Agriculture tests in 1941, repeated in 1991, showed a 40% decline in trace elements in vegetables in those 50 years and that decline must have continued. Also, the failure to apply sufficient animal manures causes the humus in the soil to reduce – and one can foresee a time when farmers are pouring Nitrogen, Phosphorus and Potassium onto sand and expecting crops to grow – which they won't since the crops also need the other 16 trace elements.

Already a third of farmland worldwide is degraded, and it has been estimated that we could have only 60 harvests left. If that point is reached, the 9 billion or so people will have nothing to eat. Will that happen? Probably not, although we shall have to go through a prolonged period of mass starvation first, to galvanise governments into considering soil fertility as the number one priority and doing everything possible to repair the damage being done at present to our precious soil.

Finishing on a more cheerful note, look after the soil in your garden or allotment and reap the benefits of healthy, delicious food!

- 7. Social distancing outside of 1-meter plus is still required (please respect other people's space)
- 8. We are expected to control the flow/volume of customers within the venue (GUIDELINE to ensure social distancing)
- 9. No Shouting, Raised Voices or Dancing (GUIDELINE to ensure social distancing and to prevent the spread of airborne particles)

The parish council held its September meeting on Zoom and we are most likely to continue to have to do so for some time looking at new Covid 19 regulations, in general it works very well. Buckinghamshire Councillor Carl Etholen reported that schools have gone back and Veolia have taken over kerbside collections from Serco. This started 07/09/20 and it will be a gradual transition starting in the Wycombe and Chiltern areas. It is hoped there will not be too much disruption. We will start to see HS2 traffic on the A4010, that should finish quarter 4 next year.

Our Chairman reported that the HS2 traffic on the A4010 is for archaeological works at Stoke Mandeville. The use of the A4010 as a HS2 construction route has changed repeatedly over the years. These archaeological works were not in the original plans. They will be carried out before a new viaduct in Stoke Mandeville is to be constructed. Meetings of the Community Boards have now started, Bradenham is part of the North West Chilterns Board, each Board has 5 sub-groups: Crime and Antisocial Behaviour, Economic Regeneration, Environmental and Climate Change, Traffic and Road Issues and Young people and older residents.

Our RAF representative gave us a brief report.

Flooding on Rectory Lane, after heavy rain, was discussed as was the danger of parking on the grass verge on the corner of the A4010 and Bradenham Woods Lane. The cars parked on the verge reduce visibility for drivers.

Our next meeting will be held Monday 2nd November location TBC.

As much as I love mushrooms I don't have the courage to pick them raw from a field and toss them into a frying pan with some bacon and eggs. Call me old fashioned, but I have never really seen the appeal of 48 hours in a local hospital, hooked up to a stomach pump and a saline drip while a priest administers the last rites. I will leave that particular brand of living off the land to Bear Grills and Ray Mears.

Fruit however, is a comparatively safe option. If you know where to look, blackberries, apples, sloes and rosehips are in abundance. In terms of flavour, all the local apples I have found are probably best described as similar to the Braeburn variety. Not too sweet, more of a classic English eating apple, perfect for cooking without needing the addition of too much extra sugar. Blackberry brambles can be found in most woods and on the outskirts of common lands. For best results dig deep into the woods, away from roads, exhaust gases and other air borne pollution. Also pick your fruit above 3ft from ground level, best to avoid the attention 'Fido' payed to the bush.

With a good haul of apples and blackberries in our bag, my wife easily put together this tasty culinary creation...



### Apple and Blackberry Upside-down Cake

- 140g unsalted butter
- 140g caster sugar
- 3 tsbp caster sugar
- 3 apples, peeled, cored, and quartered
- 250g blackberries
- 3 eggs lightly beaten
- 200g self raising flour
- 1 tsp ground ginger
- 1 tsbp milk

Pre heat oven to 160°C / 325°F / G4

Grease your tin and line it, grease again. Swirl in the 3 tsbp of caster sugar to coat.

Arrange the apples and a third of the blackberries around the bottom of the tin.

Cream the butter and sugar together.

Gradually beat in the eggs. Sift the flour with the Ginger and fold into the mix.

Stir in the milk and the remaining blackberries.

Spoon the batter into the tin over the fruit.

Bake for 40 mins, until the sponge is springy, golden, and a skewer comes out clean.

Eat warm or cold. Enjoy.

We are now coming into the perfect time of year for harvesting sloes. I have been told that the best time to pick them is after the first autumn frost. The thinking is that sloes are quite a firm fruit and that the frost helps to break up the fibres, and soften the pulp. I have also read that the easy way to shortcut this is to pick the fruit when you want to, and then freeze it to simulate a frost. Either way, they are out there, plentiful and ready to go. Beware when picking them though, they are the fruit of the Blackthorn, which will defend them accordingly, not a problem generally encountered in your local farm shop, or Waitrose.

So now you have a bucket load of sloes, what to do with them? Sloe Gin, a winter staple for any country walk, bonfire celebration or Christmas gathering. Invest in a 1 litre Kilner jar and you are good to go. Make sure it is clean and sterile before adding the ingredients.

### Sloe Gin

- 1 Litre Gin any cheap supermarket brand will do
- 450g sloes
- 225g sugar

Wash your sloes and put them in the jar. Put the sugar in. Fill the jar with the gin Seal the jar, and rotate frequently. Serve between 6 weeks and 12 weeks later\* ...... .....\*if you can wait that long.

The recipe above can be easily replicated with other fruit. Rhubarb with gin (a particular favourite of mine), Blueberries with vodka...etc... you get the gist...

To write this month's article, I have just looked through my past four years of contributions to the October edition of the Naphill Gazette. What did I write last year? The year before? I don't have a word for my feelings because I do not have a frame of reference within which to place them. What frame of reference could there possibly be within which to place the past 6 months?

When I wrote those past articles, the world was a different place. Sure, there is always change – without change, things stagnate and die. There will always be some individuals for whom the world will have changed, but for most of us, it's usually a case of 'same old, same old'. When I wrote for the Gazette in October 2019, I could not in my wildest dreams have imagined the scenario we now find ourselves in. It's a shame we didn't get to sing the great harvest hymns, especially 'Great is thy faithfulness', but even if we didn't sing them, God still knows and understands the thoughts of our hearts. In spite of everything, God remains constant and it is a wonderful thing to know that the God who created the earth and everything in it knows and cares for each one of us.

May you know God's rich blessings at this season of change.

### Hughenden Street Association

The word 'community' means different things to different people. For Hughenden residents it might mean the area in which they live: Great Kingshill or Walters Ash. It could also cover a wider area: the St Michaels and All Angels community stretched beyond the historical boundaries of the parish. # Our Bird Man

Some of the most elegant of birds can now be seen around the wetlands of the UK. Some new to our shores, others previously driven to extinction. These exotic Egrets are very welcome – unless you are a fish, that is!

Until recently, well within the living memory of many active birders, to see any White Heron was a major excitement, an event of national significance. Now the Little Egret is commonplace and the signs are that the Cattle Egret and the Great White Egret will follow.

Back in the 1970s and 80s Egrets would occasionally appear in late summer. After breeding the young tend to wander in all directions. Egrets from Europe and Africa have been seen over the mid-Atlantic.

In the UK the first Little Egrets bred in 1996, the first Cattle Egrets in 2007, White Storks in 2012 and Great White Egrets also in 2012. Other Heron related species now breeding in Britain are Purple Heron, Spoonbill, Little Bittern, Night Heron and Glossy Ibis. all these species can turn up at any wetland in Britain, though more commonly, those nearer the coast.

#### A warm hello from Hoppers Pre-School!

Our dedicated and caring staff have been focusing on building self-belief, resilience, teamwork, tolerance and respect, within a nurturing environment for our children. We deliver the early years curriculum with an emphasis on the children's interests and often take our learning outdoors.

We know the last months have been challenging for us all, and for our pre-school children, this means they have started school without the opportunity to come and meet the teachers, have a settling-in session, and make new friends.

Less than two weeks into the term the children are already coming in settled and with a well-established routine. We believe that the way children come in and settle down sets the tone for the day ahead. One way we have achieved this is through sensory bins. Once the children arrive, they store their belongings away, wash their hands, self-register with an adult and are then given a choice of sensory play.

Sensory bins are hands-on tools for children to explore their world through senses. Sensory plan may calm, focus, and engage a child – exactly what we need when leaving mums and dads at the gates!

Sensory bins are great fun for young children as they love to scoop, pour, dig and explore many different materials. Here are two examples of the Hopper favourite sensory bins that we've had this term so far to try at home!

Pine Cones, seashells and some colourful feathers. Add twigs for extra texture. Spoons for scooping and pots for putting things in. Find the conkers with the spoon, scooping them up and put them into a little pot whilst counting how many there are.



Play-dough, sticks and dried pasta makes for a simple fine motor activity. Attach the sticks upright using play-dough, and ask your child to loop the pasta onto the sticks.



We'd love to know if you try any of our sensory bins, or have some ideas of your own you'd like to share with us.

#### Incredible Kids in Extraordinary Times! - Childhood.

A simple time, filled with hazy summer days, enduring friendships, happy memories and not a care in the world. Right? Well, not entirely.

The most recent survey of the mental health of children and young people in England found that 12.5% of 5 to 19 year olds had at least one mental health disorder when assessed (2017), and 5% met the criteria for 2 or more mental health disorders. There also appears to be a slight increase over time in the prevalence of mental health disorders in 5 to 15 year olds, rising from 9.7% (1999) to 10.1% (2004) to 11.2% (2017). Around half of all lifetime mental health problems start by the mid-teens, and three-quarters by the mid-20s, although treatment typically does not start until a number of years later.

And all of this prior to the inevitable stresses and strains of a global pandemic and the disruption to life that has brought. A whole generation of children are just now returning to full-time education after more than five months of lockdown and summer holidays.

Now, more than ever, it is critical to safeguard the emotional wellbeing of our children and young people. So, how do we go about doing that, whilst also rebalancing ourselves in this "new normal"?

In situations which may be causing some degree of anxiety, it can be helpful to stop the mind racing ahead by practicing some form of mindfulness. Contrary to popular misconceptions, this doesn't have to involve sitting quietly, which can prove challenging for some. One of the most popular mindfulness exercises on our Incredible Me emotional wellbeing and empowerment courses is one involving eating chocolate! Any activity can be mindful if we learn the right skills and tools to help us to focus on the present moment.

The Incredible Me approach focuses on equipping children, young people and the adults in their lives with the awareness, skills and tools to develop robust emotional wellbeing and to become happy, healthy and empowered global citizens. Each session incorporates self-awareness, neuroscience, resilience, coaching, higher-level thinking, relaxation and a good dose of fun, delivered through safe, engaging and creative activities.

### Lindgate

We are delighted to be able to start running some of our programmes this month.

Rest & Reflect continues to be a success, with over 750 visitors since opening our gates in the middle of June, offering anyone who has been affected by COVID-19, a peaceful environment, to take time for themselves.

Wellbeing Pathways, our weekly programme, for people with low to moderate mental health needs. We have started the process of enabling people to come back to Lindendate, based on nature based activities in groups, linked to our Five Ways to Wellbeing.

Nurture Pathways, for all care workers, looking after someone at home, in their home, a care home, or similar environment. Take part in arts and crafts activities or gardening, on the 1st and 3rd Friday of the month, between 10am - 12pm, those attending will need to register in advance.

Planted is a six week programme, for 13-15 year olds, starting on Friday 25th September, between 08.45am -10am, focussing on one activity each week, linked to our Five Ways to Wellbeing.



Healing Pathways is for adults and children aged 13-15 years, bi-weekly over 6 weeks. Again, using the Five Ways to Wellbeing, to provide hope, support and understanding, for those experiencing loss, grief and bereavement.

Minority Women's Wellbeing Group, for adults, taking place every month, starting 3rd October, supporting women from the BAME community, offering a safe and relaxing environment to build resilience and improve wellbeing.

We also have very successful kitchen gardens.

Our produce is used as part of our nature based activities for our Gardeners, for cooking projects and sold locally at BuckmoorendFarm, to bring additional revenue back into Lindengate.
