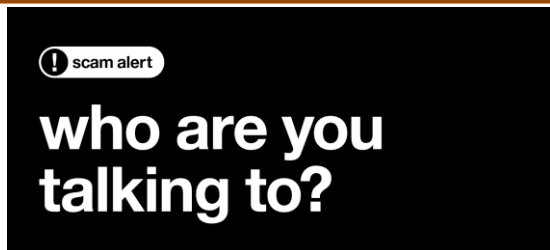

First Direct (part of HSBC) has recently issued some sound advice to help protect their customers from being scammed by people impersonating utility companies, emergency services or even banks. Click [HERE](#) to read the advice.

Here is an example of this happening in Hughenden:

'A scam call came on our landline today regarding suspicious card and international money transfer payments. Our phone speaks out the number and then allows the caller to leave a message. It appeared as a local call 01494 561463. I would usually answer one with this code and 56 prefix, but I was busy, and just listened to the message. This has happened before.

I thought it was worth a warning in your newsletter.'
