Rural Policing Update

Rural crime continues to be a significant concern for communities in South Buckinghamshire, but recent successes demonstrate the effectiveness

of Proactive Policing and strong Partnerships with Local Landowners and Rural Groups. South Buckinghamshire's Rural Neighbourhood Teams have been working diligently to combat offences such as poaching, theft, and environmental crime, creating a safer and more secure environment for the region.

Recent Good News Stories

In a notable case of collaboration, officers charged two individuals for poaching offences on the Carrington Estate in Little Marlow. This success reflects the dedication of both law enforcement and estate gamekeepers in protecting the rural landscape from illegal activity. Additionally, several Community Protection Warnings have been issued for poaching incidents across the Carrington, Portman, and Hall Barn Estates. These estates have embraced the South Buckinghamshire's Rural Neighbourhood Teams philosophy, fostering a strong working relationship betw Officers and Gamekeepers. The partnerships built with these Estates are a testament to the shared commitment to preserving the rural environment and deterring criminal activity.
