Email Scam – an oldie but still clearly working

Do you ever wonder why scammers often return to earlier attempts to catch us out? Probably because it actually still works! We need to be continuously vigilant.

Browsing through my inbox after a few days away I came across an 'oldie but goodie' scam:

Hello.

I am Mr. Nelson Bile, a lawyer based in Lome, capital city of Tog republic in West Africa. I need your assistance to claim the sum of \$9.8 Million deposited in a bank by my late client who has the same surname as you. He died a few years ago.....

'Mr Nelson' then noted the death of his client's wife and only daughter. It was interesting that he did not tell which name his client and I had in common: my maiden name or married name? So obviously a scam especially as I 'googled' his name and an alert came up confirming this. Click <https://bit.ly/3OAKKvc> to read the fraud warning.
