Hughenden Valley Pumping Station

At a recent HSA Operations Group meeting the sewage issue in Hughenden Valley was discussed. As a result, enquiries were made with the Bucks Council Environmental Health Team. To say we were surprised at the response would put it mildly. Going forward it is vital that incidents are quickly brought to the attention of the **Environment Agency**. Details below show how this can quickly be done.

"After having checked our records, we have not recently received any information about a sewage concern in the Hughenden Valley area.

Also checked the Environment Agency website and there doesn't seem to be any way to find out on their website what has been reported to them.
