Keeping hackers at bay: 2FA



Enabling Two-Factor Authentication (2FA) is the recommended way of keeping hackers away from your online accounts, says Action Fraud

2FA is a way of strengthening the login security of your online accounts. It's similar to how an ATM works. You need both your debit card (first factor) and your PIN (second factor) to access your account and withdraw cash. The main objective is better security. If your card is stolen, they still need your PIN. If your PIN is stolen, they still need your card. Enabling 2FA will help to stop hackers from getting into your accounts, even if they have your password.
