During this period agencies come together to help make sure that people have the skills and knowledge they need to protect themselves from scams.

[Stop Scams UK](#) is a pilot scheme in conjunction with a number of UK banks and telephone companies seeking to prevent banking fraud. Here is some advice:

If you receive a phone call and you think that someone is trying to trick you into handing over money or personal details – STOP, HANG UP AND DIAL 159, to speak directly to you bank. 159 will NEVER call you but you can rely on it to get you through to your bank. Calls cost the same as national rate calls, usually part of the included minutes on most phone tariffs.
