





Chairmans Report

The village hall committee meeting was held on 1st. October. There were 17 members present. The treasurer reported that the lettings working party had met during September and new hire rates had been agreed. We are now having two types of hire. One is term time hire for 38 weeks of the year with no hire sessions in the holidays and half term. The other hire is for 50 weeks of the year or annual hire. The new prices will be put into effect from the new year. A small increase was also agreed for the WI, the NAWARA and Naphill neighbours with the luncheon club being exempt from charge. The one off hire rates have also been changed and a minimum booking of 3 hours before 5pm will also come into place. The terms and conditions have been slightly changed. All of the changes will be posted on the village hall website. We still appear to be the best value village hall in the area!

The radiators in the main and small hall have been replaced and the only means of increasing or decreasing the temperature is now by the thermostats in each hall. The new doors for the changing rooms have been ordered. Paul Webb has been asked to re-cement the path and wall around the war memorial.

The play area was discussed at length and it was decided in principle on one of the three quotes but we are trying to negotiate the financial terms with the supplier to give the village hall best value. The funding is around 70% and I have received monies from individuals totalling £300 with the promise of £1000 from a local business. The my donate page linked to the village hall website, www.naphillvillagehall. org.uk has received £80. I have had a couple of emails offering help and ideas to fundraise and we are in contact with these people. It was pointed out to me that if we had £5 from each household in the village we could buy the equipment straight away! A Christmas Fayre is being organised and will be held

on Friday 30 November at 6pm. Please come along and get into the Christmas spirit.

The other fundraising event is the Bonfire and Fireworks display on the 3rd. November. This year there will be live music before and after the display. Tickets are available from the local shops and pubs or you can buy them online at www.naphillfireworks. co.uk There is a limit on the amount of tickets this year so buy them before the event to avoid disappointment. We hope to have good weather!

Remembrance Sunday is on the 11th November and there is always a good attendance for this event. I hope you can come along and support all of the events, there does seem to be a good atmosphere at the events and they bring the village closer together.

British farming is facing the most far reaching reforms for nearly half a century. In recent meetings at the County Show in August and more recently with the local NFU at their Aylesbury office, I've been listening to the views of farmers and land managers about their hopes and fears for the future.

Inside the European Union, we've been part of its Common Agricultural Policy (CAP). That's meant not only paying significant sums of taxpayers' money in farm subsidies but also structuring those payments in particular ways and following various regulations applying to farms throughout the EU.

Now, with our departure from the EU a few months away, the Government is planning changes to be phased in over the years ahead. Subsidies will continue, but will be linked in future much more directly to farmers providing public benefits such as looking after the environment, public access or making fields available to absorb floodwater in winter and spring.

Farming and conservation have always been intimately linked. Our traditional hedgerows were planted in order to contain livestock. Sheep grazing on the Chiltern hillsides stopped scrub from growing and maintained the ecology of chalk grasslands.

While some businesses, especially the big arable farms, would be able to compete in the market without any subsidy, there's a lot of farmland, particularly in upland areas, which is much less profitable. There, without some kind of subsidy, farms would soon go out of business and those landscapes would rapidly change.

If I look beyond the next few years during which the new system of farm support will come in, there are some big questions to all of us as a country about the future of farming.

Do we want subsidies, even if paid in return for public goods, to continue at their present level? There's a case for saying that we should switch resources from agriculture to education or health or transport. But would we be willing to accept the closure of farm businesses that would follow, and the knock-on impact on the landscape and the wider rural economy?

Should we import more food - from countries like Brazil, Australia, Thailand and the USA? Food would be cheaper: I can see a lot of families wanting this. But at the cost of driving our own farmers to the wall and losing the food security that comes from home production?

What do you think?

Growing Your Own

Just after the Second World War people in the UK spent about 35% of their disposable income (ie after tax, etc) on food. Nowadays people spend 9 to 11% on food. That is a remarkable reduction, largely because of a 2% per annum real-terms increase in wages enabling the purchase of other things than food. (That 2% per annum increase was the average until the past 10 years when the average dropped to nil.) So growing your own is not so important these days to feed hungry stomachs. One grows not so much as to provide quantity; one grows to provide quality. We grow our own in our gardens and allotments to provide freshness, hence fruit and vegetables which have not lost vitamins in transport or in storage. We grow our own to avoid manmade chemicals. We grow our own to ensure our crops contain adequate amounts of trace elements (provided we have incorporated plenty of compost and farmyard manure in the soil to replace trace elements taken away with previous crops).

November is the month to start planning for next year and for ordering seeds etc. One can purchase online these days of course, but it is still a joy to leaf through seed catalogues. Here is my list, in alphabetical order, of websites to order catalogues: Dobies (www.dobies.co.uk), Kings Seeds (www.kingsseeds.com), Suttons (www.suttons.co.uk), Thompson and Morgan (www.thompson-morgan.com), and Tuckers Seeds (www.tuckers-seeds.com). Sometimes my regular supplier stops selling a

particular variety so I do a search on Google to find a different supplier. I have to confess that I buy many of my seeds in France where, for the same money, the packets contain 3 to 4 times as many seeds.

November is not a good month for sowing vegetable seeds since they would just rot in the cold, wet soil. However, early November is the ideal time for planting out fruit trees and fruit bushes. I seem to lose some every year through disease or whatever so have to purchase a few, taking the opportunity to try out newer and better, varieties produced by the plant breeders in recent years.

Regarding taking the crops, I leave root crops such as carrots, turnips, parsnips, celeriac, salsify, swedes and beetroot in the ground and put fleece over if severe frosts are expected. The slugs cause some damage but, since I grow so much, I can afford to cut out the damaged parts. My sprouts, purple sprouting broccoli, red cabbages and cavolo nero seem to withstand any amount of frost. (I protect them from pigeons by covering them with fine plastic netting which stays on until I have finished cropping in spring.)

It's time to dig up my chicory plants and place the roots in soil in large buckets in a warm, very dark place to produce their delicious "chicons". And to tidy up!!

Friends of Naphill Common

Good news! David Hunt of Wessex Woodland Management has told us that the third phase of felling on the Common will not start this autumn. It will probably begin in autumn 2019. This is good news because, as we are sure that anyone who walks on the Common will agree, it needs a rest. There has been very obvious and damaging disturbance to the wild life and the soil, and it will be sensible to let things settle down for a year.

It will also give FONC more time to prepare for the next phase. We not only need to mark those trees we do not want felled but, this time, we also need to mark the area of the ancient enclosure or "farmstead". It is essential that no heavy machinery damages the boundary ditches or the surface of the area they enclose. This ancient feature has never been properly surveyed or excavated. What objects have been found by casual searching, on site or in the adjacent Dew Pond, range from flint tools to evidence of iron smelting, plus fragments of pottery, some probably Roman. So, until we can persuade professional archaeologists that it is worth serious study, it remains a mystery which must be protected.

By the time this Gazette appears our Fungus Walk with the Bucks Fungus Group will have passed. It will have culminated at Dew Pond where the collapsed Great Beech was showing several outgrowths of the very rare Lion's Mane fungus Hericium erinaceum. The Great Beech collapsed in 2015. It was probably the oldest beech on the Common, but precisely how old is very difficult to discover. The main trunk was hollow, so counting growth rings is not possible. It had a girth of 18 feet (i.e. 216 inches or 5.5 metres), measured at breast height, but the rule-of-thumb that the age is equal to the number of inches does not apply with ancient trees that were pollarded, probably several times, during their life. Like most of the old beech trees on the Common, the Great Beech had been pollarded at about 10ft (3m) from the ground. This was done to provide new branches suitable for firewood etc. Fortunately, the largest of the branches that were present when the tree collapsed was not hollow, although rot made counting rings difficult. (Thanks go to Jeff Leeks for his help.) The best estimate is 242 rings, which means that the tree was pollarded in 1773. It must have been a mature tree at that time, so perhaps it started life in Tudor times, around 1600. The Common has several other ancient beech trees, but another collapsed earlier this year.

Our walks continue as usual. The short walks generally involve the Common and they are between 2-3 miles, led by Chris Miller starting at 10.30am from the Village Hall on the first Wednesday of each month. The longer walks are led by Ron Collins and are about 5 miles, generally some distance from Naphill. Join Ron on the third Monday of each month;

meeting at the Village Hall at 9.25am for a prompt start at 9:30am. Members and non-members are equally welcome. These are the usual arrangements, but as there is sometimes a need to make changes it would be wise to consult our website, posters or the two leaders to confirm the details.

There will be an additional walk on Monday 26th November (also starting at 9:30 from the Village Hall), when we will once again be raising money for the 'Children in Need' charity by asking all walkers to donate a minimum of £5 per person. Last month, we were contacted by a BBC researcher for their annual fund-raising 'Children in Need' programme, who wanted to know who could grant them permission to film on the Common. The request was passed on to the West Wycombe Estate, and Sir Edward Dashwood was happy to give his consent. Banoffee Cupcakes Recipe

makes 12 - 16 cakes



Cake Ingredients

80g soft unsalted butter 280g caster sugar

240g plain flour

1tbsp baking powder

Pinch of salt

240ml whole milk

1/2 tsp vanilla essence

2 large eggs

1 large banana

Method

- 1. Preheat your oven to 190C (170C Fan). Fill a muffin tin with muffin size cupcake cases.
- 2. Beat the butter, sugar and flour, baking powder and salt together until they look like breadcrumbs.
- 3. Mix the milk, vanilla essence and eggs together and then pour gradually into your bowl and mix well until you've a smooth batter.
- 4. Divide the mixture between your cupcake cases I use an ice-cream scoop!
- 5. Mash up your banana and pop one teaspoon into each cupcake case using a toothpick mix into the cake mixture carefully. You can, of course, add your mashed-up banana into your final mixture before you divvy up but this way you know each cake will get the same amount of banana!
- 6. Bake for 18-20 minutes you'll know they're done when the sponge springs back up!
- 7. Leave to completely cool before you try to decorate!

Always taste test one to ensure that you're happy with the quality ;-)

Topping Ingredients

500g Icing Sugar

160g soft unsalted butter

50ml whole milk

½ tsp vanilla essence

1 large dollop of dulce de leche (and extra to drizzle) (Tinned Condensed Caramel is Fine)

Banana Chips or Fresh Banana

Method

- Mix the Icing Sugar with the butter until fully combined
- 2. Mix the Milk with the vanilla essence then pour into your mixing bowl
- 3. Beat on high for at least 8-10 minutes (it's worth it!) until your butter icing is lovely and pale.
- 4. Spoon in your dulce de leche and taste add more if you want a richer icing!
- 5. Using your favourite nozzle (or just spread on) decorate each cupcake generously.
- 6. Drizzle extra dulce de leche over each cake and garnish with a slice of banana!

Obviously taste test one again and then share with family and friends ... Enjoy!

I also make wooden photo cubes, children's artwork display plaques, stick figure families and family trees, and I take custom orders too. I am so excited to be part of the Craft Coop family and I look forward to meeting all of you in the new shop now open in the Eden Center in High Wycombe. Please stop by and say hello!



Craft Coop is a social enterprise company which supports local craft businesses. We started in Maidenhead in 2011 as a pop up shop, and our main shop is still there. We have also had pop ups in Wokingham and Marlow. The shop provides a platform for local craftspeople to sell their products. At least 80% of the artists represented in the shop are from the Wycombe area, with the remaining artists coming from neighbouring areas. The shop provides a unique shopping experience for the local community, giving customers the chance to "buy local," and the Eden shop will offer handcrafted jewellery, glass, ceramic, and wood products, textiles, candles and soap, prints and paintings, and mosaic kits - among many other unique items.

From Hughenden Vicarage

He was born on 8 January 1894 in Poland, to a German Father – Julius, a weaver by trade, and mother Maria, who was a midwife – he had four brothers.

Strongly influenced during his childhood after seeing a vision of the Virgin Mary, he and his elder brother Francis joined the Conventual Franciscans holy order, being ordained a priest in 1918.

When World War 2 was declared, he was living in the monastery at Niepokalanów, which during the war became amongst other things a temporary hospital, a place to provide refuge for 2,000 fleeing Jews, as well as a publishing house for religious works.

He was arrested by the Nazis on 17 February 1941,

as the Germans closed down the monastery, and he, together with four others were imprisoned.

Prisoner number 16670 was transferred to Auschwitz Concentration Camp on 28 May, where he continued his faithful witness to the other prisoners, despite numerous beatings and ill-treatment at the hands of his captors.

Two months later, three prisoners escaped from the camp, and so the deputy camp commander picked 10 men at random, to be starved to death as punishment in an underground bunker. One of the selected men – Franciszek Gajowniczek cried out "My wife! My children!", at which point this brave man volunteered to take his place, as he had no dependents himself.

Maximillian Kolbe, as the man was called, continued to witness to the love of Christ as he and his fellow captors were slowly starved to death. He was the last to die.

The man whose life Kolbe saved survived the war, and lived to the ripe old age of 93 – often giving thanks for the gift of life, and paying tribute to the sacrifice of this unassuming Franciscan priest.

On Sunday 11 November 2018, across our nation, and in our Church, we will be gathered together for a solemn act of remembrance for all those who have lost their lives in war. When we observe two minutes of silence at 11am, it will be 100 years to the minute since the cessation of World War One. Sadly, the past century has not always been one of peace and goodwill to all humanity.

When the names of those who died in conflict, who lived in our parish are read out, one cannot help but be moved by their remarkable and inspirational act of sacrifice and love for the common good.

All those who want to become followers of Jesus Christ are not asked to dress like him, eat the same food as him, take long walks up mountains, and wander from town to town telling others about the kingdom of God. However, all those who profess faith in Jesus Christ are called to lay down their own lives, to pick up their crosses daily, and to follow in his footsteps. Those footsteps are characterised by a lifestyle of compassion, love and putting the well-being of others before ourselves.

Friends, let us be still for a moment on 11/11 at 11am, to thank God for those who paid the ultimate price, and I invite you to join me in praying for peace in our town, in our nation, and in our world.

May we be inspired by the example of Maximillian Kolbe, but may another such martyr never need to pay such a cost again.

Remembering in November

5th May 2011. That is the day when the horrors suffered by those who fought in WWI ceased to be living memory. Claude Choules died in Australia, the last known surviving veteran of the first world war. Even as I typed those words, I was overwhelmed by a feeling I have no words for. 'First' is an ordinal word – it implies there is more to follow.

This month marks the 100th anniversary of the end of 'the War to End All Wars'. All around our country are war memorials bearing the fading names of those who paid the ultimate price in service of their country. A cursory glance at the century old list of protagonists makes

chilling reading. Russia, the Ottoman Empire, Serbia, America, the Austro-Hungarian Empire, the British Empire. Many of these names are now consigned to the pages of history books, but names are identifying labels and can change.

Russia, Ukraine, Georgia, Syria, Iran, Baghdad, Israel, the labels have changed, but the territory they refer to hasn't. 100 years on, unresolved tensions still exist in many of the regions that drank the blood of countless fallen warriors.

Many of us will have seen the graphic reports from the war torn areas of our world which beg the question 'Have we learnt the lessons of history?' Actually, I think the answer is 'Yes' but as every teacher knows, once you have taught one lesson, there is always another to be learnt, but in preparing for the new lesson, the previous one is always revisited. We MUST continue to tell the stories, continue to remember, continue to remind ourselves of what humanity is capable of in every sense. Those stories tell of degradation, deprivation, horror and the squandering of human lives and precious resources. But they also tell of heroism, self sacrifice, generosity, altruism, determination and the triumph of the human spirit over the most overwhelming of circumstances.

In the New Testament, Jesus counsels:

'you will hear of wars and uprisings For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom' (Luke 21:9-10).

Jesus' words are not meant to be a tick list of events that will herald the end of the world and the return of the Messiah. Rather it is a comment on the human condition. No one wants war, no one seeks it, yet it happens – this is one of the awful results of what the Bible calls sin. These things will happen and go on happening right up to when Christ returns.

Because peace is so elusive and all human efforts to achieve it seem destined to fail does not mean we should not seek it. Jesus calls peacemakers 'blessed' (Matthew 5:9). Christians are called to work toward and pray for peace, something we should never cease from doing. It seems a difficult, unending task, but each of us can play a part – a house is not made up of a single brick, neither is an ocean made up of one raindrop - many small parts go into making a larger whole. Christians also know that ultimate peace lies with Christ and true world peace will only become a reality at his return. When this will be "no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father" (Mark 13:32). Not knowing should not stop us from playing our part in bringing about that vision. Those we will be honouring at our Remembrance Day services gave their lives in every sense of the word to bring about a better world we will remember them and those who still fight for our peace and security today.

Lest we forget.


