Do you realise what's significant about the 21st of March 2021?

Well, while both of those were notable events in the past, 21st of March 2021 is when the next national census will take place. The last having taken place in 2011.

It is also the target date for our next parish survey. The last of those having taken place in 2013. Just like the national census, our local survey collects anonymous data from every household to help us understand how things are changing where we live.

As the national census assists local, regional and national government plans for the next 10 years in terms of housing, transport, broadband, etc, our survey in its own small way does the same for the Parish Council. Helping us to understand the changing demographic of our population, we can analyse the data by ward

allowing us to target our limited resources where they are most needed and where they can have the most impact. We also get to ask more local questions on things like our playgrounds and allotments, what we like about where we live and what we don't and what we think is important to maintain, protect & improve the quality of life for everyone who lives here.

An example of this is how our 2013 survey helped us identify speeding as a concern for the majority of parishioners hence the Council building up the number of mobile vehicle activated signs (MVAS) we have to deploy across the parish.

Hughenden Parish Council Chairman's Report Reflections on 2020

As we near the end of the year I am looking to provide you with a short reflective update on the activities of Hughenden Parish Council. I feel confident in saying that this time last year no one reading this article, could have foreseen the unprecedented events that would transpire in 2020.

I am pleased to say that despite lockdowns and other constraints the Council Office and our service partners have continued to deliver the high level of service that our residents expect. While the Office has remained closed to the public since the first lockdown, all activities including council meetings have continued in a virtual environment. Members of the public are encouraged to join these meetings.

It would be most helpful if residents contact the office using the email address clerk@hughendenpc.org.uk rather than by phone as the office is generally unmanned. All parish councillors have their own parish email address which is their firstname.familyname@hughendenpc. org.uk, messages to these addresses go directly to the councillors.

We have seen a substantial increase in communication regarding traffic, speeding and parking concerns. The Parish Council has no powers to respond to these concerns and we refer you to Thames Valley Police for breaches in abiding by road traffic laws and to Fixmystreet.com to report issues regarding the condition of the highway. HPC have invested in Motor Vehicle Activated Signs located throughout the parish to alert drivers as to their speeds, but these are manned by volunteers and the team is anxious for new people to get involved in order to continue this service.

Hedges remain a concern and with an extremely short season during which we may legally cut hedges and the vagaries of the weather, not all the hedges were cut in the early part of the year. Work started again in September and continues when weather and surface conditions allow. Of course HPC only owns a few hedges, we manage a further small number on behalf of Buckinghamshire

Council but the majority are owned by private landowners and we cannot legally cut these. We would ask everyone to inspect the other side of their hedges and cut them back so that they don't encroach into footpaths and roads.

While the Council have no covid lockdown responsibilities, after consultation with the local volunteer groups it was agreed that the Council would set up a virtual forum where information, ideas and best practices could be shared. This proved to be beneficial and has been re-established for this lockdown.

This was to have been an election year but due to the Covid restrictions these have been postponed until May 2021, Councilors were requested to continue for a further year, I am pleased to say that all the councilors serving at that time agreed to do so.

The co-option in July of further councilors now means that we are 3 short of the full complement of 15. Your Councilors have been active in a number of issues that impact on residents such as support of the objections to the development at Clappins Lane in the Naphill and Walters Ash ward.

One major project this year has been to survey all the trees on Council land to identify any required action to keep them in a healthy condition. As a result across the Parish this winter you will be seeing our qualified contractors undertaking the work to attend to the trees. There will be an ongoing program over a number of years.

I am writing this as we have just entered the second lockdown so would like to wish you the very best with a plea to adhere to the government regulations so that hopefully next year we will all be able to enjoy our parish.

We are all living in extraordinarily challenging times! As I know from the local residents who have contacted me, life is a struggle for so many people at the moment! I am sure we are all grateful to those who are helping and supporting us all, we are fortunate to be a part of such a great community.

The Buckinghamshire Council continues to release regular COVID information as to how we can best protect ourselves and so help to keep one another safe. I thank the Parish Council and the local residents' groups who also update residents on the current information for our area. My thanks too to our local schools who are doing a great job in making life as normal as possible for our children.

On the 10 November I attended a virtual West Buckinghamshire Area Planning Committee meeting along with my fellow councillor Steve Broadbent, Parish Councillor Rick Gould and the secretary of NAWARA, Gloria Leflaive. We were each allocated a 3 minute time slot to address the meeting with our objections to the proposed plans

for the Clappins Lane development. Our many objections were based on the planning policy, the traffic problems and the environmental issues this development would raise. Two of the planning committee supported our reports, but unfortunately the other members expressed the opinion that our area was part of 'The Area Development Plan' and as other such areas had been forced to accept far larger developments, we should not be exempt. A vote was taken and I am disappointed to report that the plans were approved. At this point I did state that in accepting these plans, an extraordinary precedent was being set for undermining the national policy on protecting the ANOB, which along with my associates, I found unacceptable and bewildering.



Friends of Naphill Common



Because of Covid restrictions, none of our regular FoNC activities are taking place at present. But we can still enjoy the attractions of our Common, whether walking, cycling or riding.

The idea of 'wilding' (or rewilding) has become popular over the last few years. It involves returning an area back to as near a natural ecology as it is possible to achieve. You may have seen the TV program, based on a recent book by Isabella Tree, about the 1400 hectare farm at Knepp in West Sussex, which was transformed from a desolate area stripped of almost all natural vegetation by years of intensive farming, into a nature reserve rich in plant and animal species. This was one of the very few wilding projects in Britain, although some countries on the Continent have been more ambitious. There may be some farms around our village that could be candidates.

People sometimes ask about the possibility of rewilding the Common. As far as we know there are no plans to do this, but it might be interesting to speculate about how it could be done. The first question is why it might be proposed, given that the Common is already a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) and a Special Area of Conservation (SAC) and the Friends of Naphill Common work to preserve and enhance its ecology. However,

rewilding is a much more ambitious approach which would return our 63 hectares to as near as possible to the wild state it would have enjoyed before human beings interfered with it.

Its fauna would include large herbivores such as cattle, wild ponies, red deer and pigs, foxes, badgers, wild cats, red squirrels, stoats and weasels, plus a wide variety of mice, voles, moles and shrews. Several reptiles would move in to join our slow worms, including smooth snakes and adders. We cannot retrieve the ancient species so the cattle would have to be longhorns or Kerrys (as the nearest modern equivalent), the ponies possibly Exmoor type and the pigs would be Tamworths. Unfortunately, without taking in some adjacent land, the area is too small for large numbers of animals and is certainly not large enough for wolves. The flora would become richer by gaining woodland and heathland herbs, including various orchids, helleborines and grasses, helped by the work of the pigs who would root up the soil. It might even enhance its already impressive range of fungi. The gorse and juniper might return and slowly a greater variety of trees and shrubs would become established.

The idea of wilding the Common may sound attractive (to some) but it is almost certainly unrealistic. Cattle grids on the roads would not be sufficient and the numerous houses that open onto the Common could hardly be expected to fence and gate their front gardens. Wire fencing all around the Common would be ugly and unpopular. The larger animals could be fitted with collars that respond to underground electric wires to deter them from crossing, but that would make them more like domestic beasts. Of course, we humans and our dogs would definitely have to stay out, so it would be a Common no more.

Growing Your Own

On being told that she shared 99% of her genes with a monkey, Queen Victoria is reported to have been "not amused". Had she been told that she shared 90% of her DNA with a cabbage she would probably have been livid. Had she been told that she shared 50% of her DNA with a toadstool she would probably have been apoplectic. What goes for queens goes for the residents of Walter's Ash and Naphill. Paul Goby's excellent montage of toadstools on the front cover of the November Gazette could be useful for you to select to which toadstool you would like to be related!

Toadstools are the fruiting bodies of mycorrhizal fungi, which grow in the soil and can be very large. For example, Honey Fungus is like black bootlaces which can grow out 40 feet from the tree root the fungus is devouring. In a handful of soil there are more species of soil micro-organism than there are people on the planet. Only about 10% of them have been identified and named. It is a vast unexplored world beneath our feet. Yet we are completely dependent upon soil micro-organisms for our existence. Without soil bacteria and mycorrhizal fungi round the roots of our fruit and vegetables nothing would grow, there would be no food, there would be no human race, no animals and Planet Earth would be a sandy and rocky desert devoid of life.

So we need to look after our soil micro-organisms. Ideally we should refrain from pouring onto the soil man-made chemicals such as fungicides, pesticides, all the other "cides" – and artificial fertilisers, since they all kill our friends. Our farmers should all adopt "no-till" methods so as to leave the soil structure as undisturbed as possible. In our gardens and on our allotments we should never dig and limit soil disturbance to hoeing and raking. Worms will do the digging for us, and so aerate the soil. I have just completed 21 years of nodig gardening and can report that my crops are just as good as before. Just think of all the hard work of digging avoided! I just apply a layer of well-rotted farmyard manure to each patch of my allotment every four years or so and grow crops in it. The manure keeps the weeds down for the first year and makes it much easier to uproot any weeds in subsequent years. So, make a New Year's Resolution to be kind to your soil and don't dig!

In the November 2020 Gazette I described my successes and failures for the excellent growing year 2020. I can now add two greenhouse crops. I have had an enormous crop of sweet peppers and my watercress plants are at least twice as big as those in the past. What a year!

We had a report from our Buckinghamshire Councillor, Carl Etholen and an update from our RAF representative.


It was noted that elections for Parish Council Councillors and Unitary Councillors are due to be held May 6th 2021.

Our next meeting will be Monday 11th January at 7pm, mostly likely by Zoom as all our meetings have been since the first lockdown in March.







It was with great sadness that we had to suspend Naphill Evening WI at our Annual Meeting on the 15th October. Under WI rules the group has to have a Secretary, President and Treasurer, and unfortunately no-one felt able to take on the job of Secretary. SO! We are now formally in suspension for three years during which time we might be able to find the personnel to reconvene.

Naphill Afternoon WI was formed in 1922 and one of its earliest Presidents was Mrs. Coningsby Disraeli! The war years were very busy. The Wi invested in a canning machine and during the fruit season hundreds of tins were filled and sealed adding both to members larders and helping the War effort. Evacuees from London were taken into members' homes and our local WI adopted a displaced family of five who had escaped from the Russian advance and fled into the Austrian Tyrol.

During the 50s and 60s the WI grew to over 100 members and drama took up much spare time. We entered Drama Festivals and won certificates and won the WI Drama Cup many times. We started the first Art Classes in the village and gave many exhibitions.

In the 70s and 80, the membership declined as many ladies who wanted to join the Wi could not attend during the day as they were out working. So the idea of an evening WI was conceived. The first meeting was in October 1983 with Valerie Pushman as President, and gradually the afternoon WI gave way to the Evening WI.

Over the years the WI has been a very important part of village life, supporting the village in all its major events. Taking part in the Annual Float competition at the Fete, making teas and lunches, and providing stalls at the Fete and the Christmas Fayre. It will be missed. In the current Covid world we are unable to make any immediate plans, but do hope that when the world returns to some kind of normality we will be able to reform in some way and attract some younger new members who can carry it forward.

In conclusion I would like to thank all of our members, past and present, who have given so much of their time to serving the WI and thus our village. You have done a great job over the last 98 years.




News from RAF High Wycombe

As I write this, we are currently in lockdown and tennis is 'off the menu'. So, I thought a bit of history about Naphill Club and the game itself wouldn't go amiss.

Tennis was the rising game just after the first world war and a group of enthusiasts formed the first Naphill Tennis Club in about 1921. The first grass court was made on a piece of land at Kate Cottage opposite the Black Lion. After the village hall was built the club moved to a grass court where the scout hut now stands and, in due course, moved to a hard court in the present position where two more hard courts were subsequently added.

How did the game of tennis begin?

Most historians believe that tennis originated in the monastic cloisters in northern France in the 12th century, but the ball was then struck with the palm of the hand hence the name jeu de paume. It was not until the 16th century that rackets came into use, and the game began to be called "tennis." It was popular in England and France, although the game was only played indoors where the ball could be hit off the wall. Henry VIII of England was a big fan of this game, which historians now refer to as Real (or Royal) Tennis.

The Davis Cup, an annual competition between men's national teams, dates back to 1900. The analogous competition for women's national teams, the Fed Cup, was founded as the Federation Cup in 1963 to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the founding of the International Tennis Federation, also known as the ITF.

In 1926, promoter C.C. Pyle created the first professional tennis tour with a group of American and French tennis players playing exhibition matches to paying audiences. The most notable of these early professionals were the American Vinnie Richards and

the Frenchwoman Suzanne Lenglen. Once a player turned pro he or she could not compete in the major (amateur) tournaments.

In 1968, commercial pressures and rumours of some amateurs taking money under the table led to the abandonment of this distinction, inaugurating the open era, in which all players could compete in all tournaments, and top players were able to make their living from tennis. With the beginning of the open era, the establishment of an international professional tennis circuit, and revenues from the sale of television rights, tennis's popularity has spread worldwide and the sport has shed its upper/middle-class English-speaking image.

Today, Naphill Tennis Club welcomes anyone who is interested in playing tennis and, over the last few years, we have upgraded our courts with 'Tiger Turf' all-weather surface which is much more comfortable to play on than the old hard courts. Although the courts are currently closed due to the lockdown, we hope to be open again very soon as tennis is one of the few sports you can play at a social distance. Our membership increased considerably during the summer for this reason! Vive le tennis!

Chiltern Hills Arboriculture – Festive Bodging

Bodging is a traditional woodturning technique, with deep historical links to High Wycombe. The term describes the labours of the itinerant craftsmen who turned Beech wood to make chair legs and other cylindrical parts of chairs. Back in the day the work was done close to where the trees were felled. The itinerant craftsmen who made the chair legs were known as a bodgers, generally paid on piece work. Allegedly the last living chair bodger in Wycombe, Samuel Rockalls' accounts book for 1908 shows he received 19 shillings, or 95p in todays money, for 144 units of plain legs including stretchers. With three stretchers to a set of four legs this amounted to 242 turnings in total. Another belief is that the term "bodger" was a corruption of badger. Similar to the behaviour of badgers, bodgers lived in the woods and rarely emerged until the evening.

It is also a colloquial term for making or fixing something "shodily". Apparently coined by the Australians. Given the history of quality furniture production in this area, I reckon this is a darned cheek,.... But don't tell my in-laws in Queensland!

Obviously, due to the nature of the CHA business, we have pretty good access to green logs and branch offcuts. This can be quite useful when one of your hobies is crafting 'stuff' out of wood. During the summer we knocked up some table tops for barbeques and garden picnics. Great for serving up the burger buns, coleslaw, and assorted bottles of chilled booze. But summer 'cook outs' are now a distant memory, and thoughts have turned to winter walks and Christmas decorations.

Don't get me wrong. I love trekking out in the woods for a couple of hours, whatever the state of the trails. But one of the bugbears of muddy walks is dragging the great outdoors.... err.... indoors. So I came up with the idea of "bodging up" my very own outdoor boot changing bench for the front porch. Take one decent sized Lime tree log. Slice with a chainsaw. Trim four legs to length and prepare the ends with a coring bit.


Add some wood glue, a cordial introduction to the belt sander, and a generous coat of Briwax. Proper bodging Naphill style...



Helping Our Butterflies

Many of us welcome the sight of butterflies flitting through our gardens from April to October. These beautiful insects are, to most, a familiar sight. For me, the first harbinger of spring is the first Orange Tip or Brimstone. Each year the seeds of Garlic Mustard get sown in semi shaded parts of the garden. This encourages Orange Tips which have overwintered to visit and lay their eggs on their favourite food plant. Caterpillars emerge about two weeks later to feed on the leaves and seed pods of this shade loving biennial. When it comes to encouraging more butterflies into our gardens it's easy to think about plants that look pretty and provide nectar for the adults, such as Buddleja, Lavender, Sedums and Asters. Yes, these plants provide a nectar pitstop but we should be thinking about the life cycle of these insects, then we can turn our gardens from a pitstop to a home.

Brimstones are one of our longest lived butterflies, emerging as an adult in July. Come September it will seek a place to hibernate through late autumn and winter, often choosing a thick growth of Ivy. Without sheltered places they would be open to predation from birds and mice. Emerging in April, they then lay eggs in May and June to start the cycle again. Brimstones are not the only butterflies to overwinter as adults. Red Admirals, Peacocks and Small Tortoiseshells also spend many months in hibernation. these also use Ivy as well as your garden shed. Ivy also provides a home for the Holly Blue. These blue gems have two broods a year. Females of the spring lay their eggs on the developing buds of the Holly

berries. However, the summer brood lays it's eggs on the developing buds of Ivy berries. So by letting Ivy grow up an old tree or fence to flower and bear fruit you could support several species of butterfly. the flowers provide nectar for bees and hoverflies as well as butterflies and the berries are a source of food for Blackbirds and Thrushes. If you are not a lover of Ivy why not grow a Hop on a fence or pergola to encourage a Comma to lays it's eggs and provide food for it's caterpillars. this shade tolerant climber can provide shelter and nesting potential for Robins, Dunnocks, Thrushes and Blackbirds.

If like me, you tried to make a mini wildflower meadow and ended up with just long grass (not enough sun) keep the strimmer in the shed until spring. Longer grassy areas could be home to the chrysalis of some of the eight or nine species that lay their eggs on grasses. These include Speckled Wood, Meadow Brown, Ringlet, Gatekeeper, Large Skipper and Marbled White. These overwinter as caterpillars or chrysalis in tussocks of longer grass. So by making small changes in the way we manage our gardens we could make a large impact on the wildlife in them.

2020 seems to have been a good year for butterflies. I recorded eighteen species this year (record is twenty one). Most notable was the length of time Brimstones were around. First recorded on the 17th March, last seen 23rd October.

Traditional lunch, presents being exchanged and opened after the Queen's speech, sitting around a log fire. This year would be a very different Christmas.

So we had a think. If Charlotte could not be with us for a family Christmas, how about we took our family Christmas to Charlotte?

Now, I do love a good logistics problem. This really gave me something to get my teeth into. Just how to you transport Christmas? The presents were no problem – we just let Santa have the address where Charlotte was living. The rest.......

We carefully organised food that could be part cooked and finished off in the oven. We gathered together crackers, table settings, festive table linen, candles, gifts, even our special Johnson Bros Christmas china. All was carefully boxed up, a spare key acquired and we set off.

I do love a good logistics problem, and I aced it! Clockwork! We even found a film of a real time log fire on the TV that turned the screen into a virtual fireplace with crackling log sounds and Christmas carol accompaniment (well – maybe that was a bit cheesy). Charlotte came home from a difficult day on the ward to a house that was warm, welcoming, full of the scents and sounds of Christmas and her family.

We ate our meal together, her partner joining us for dessert and cheese. We located the presents Santa had left for us under the tree and enjoyed opening them together. We sipped mulled wine and talked – together. It was a very different Christmas, but probably one of the best we'd ever had. It was certainly one of the most memorable.

Christmas will be very different this year. For some there will be an aching void where a loved one had once sat and will sit no more. For others there will be the heartache of separation from loved ones. For many there will be the disquiet of things not being 'normal'..... but there has been much talk of 'new normal'. This year could be an opportunity to try something different, experiment a little, go countrycore or city chic. Perhaps in time, Christmas 2020 will become known as the 'Covid Christmas' and thought of as the Christmas of innovation and new opportunities; when Christmas became simpler yet more creative, returning to the spiritual root of its festivity.

NEAT ways to burn more calories over Christmas and beyond - My Christmas Challenge for you!

One thing that is for sure this Christmas, is that there will be many extra opportunities to increase our calorie intake, with tempting delicacies wherever we look. It is also highly likely that we will indulge and enjoy a few of those treats, and why not!!

The good news is, that if we want to enjoy the occasional treat, then we can do so, if we think about increasing our physical activity levels accordingly. It is always a question of balancing calories in and calories burned.

One way to do this is via exercising, however there is another important element of energy consumption, & that is Non-Exercise Activity Thermogenesis or "NEAT", which, despite sounding a bit scary, simply refers to the calories that we burn through activities that aren't part of formal exercise. By consciously making small changes throughout the day, it is possible to burn an extra 200 calories daily. Here are some ideas on how to do this




- 1. Stand up more Next time you take a phone call stand up / walk around for it instead of sitting down.
- 2. Increase your step count most of us now have step counters built into our watches / smartphones. Actively seek out opportunities to increase your steps. Why not turn it into a competition as a family, or group of friends, to see who can increase their steps the most?

- 3. Squat on the floor to watch TV instead of slouching on the sofa - squatting will promote flexibility and help improve posture.
- 4. Whilst waiting for the kettle to boil, repeat coming up onto tiptoes and slowly lower the heels to the floor (good for ankle stability) or try and balance on one leg at a time, using your core to stabilise you.
- 5. Move more whilst sitting down, rotate the ankles and wrists, or give the neck and shoulders a relaxing roll.

Every little really does help, and the body is amazingly clever in adapting to the demands placed on it, so challenge yourself to see what little good little habits you can practice over the festive period, and beyond. I would love to hear how you get on!




