

Chairman's Report

This month's committee meeting of the village hall was held on 7th. April. It was a short meeting as we had the AGM immediately after at 8.00pm. The routine items were discussed along with this year's events. The VE day celebration, 5th May, is being organised by Claire and Moira and they are hoping for good weather! The next event is Classics on the Crick 8th June, and the village hall run the bar for this event. The following weekend is Napfest, starting with an outdoor cinema on Friday 13th June. The fete will be held on Saturday afternoon, followed by an evening of live music. Sunday brings the football presentation event. The fireworks will be on 8th November and finally the Christmas Fayre on 30th November.

The AGM of the Village Hall was held at 8.00pm that evening with just one member of the public present. Here follows my speech for the AGM:

"This year 2024 has been quite a good year for the village hall. There have not been any real problems to speak of and the committee was able to commit to spending funds to update the playground and decorate the hall. The playground was the largest cost this year as the slide and the swings needed replacing and the fence around the playground was also renewed. This cost £25000, but we did apply for and receive a grant of £5160.00 towards this from Hughenden Parish Council. The work was done by a local company, Simpatico services and they have done a good job. There is still some more work to do in this area to keep it in a good condition.

The main hall, the kitchen and the entrance hall have been redecorated and are in good order throughout and a new buffer/polisher was purchased as the previous one, after more than 20 years' service stopped working. The committee looks at all of the hall and playing fields and continues to maintain the hall to a good order and keep the playing fields maintained. The cost of grass and hedge cutting leaves little change from £5000. There are still many improvements that will be done, including the pathway going to the men's club, the kissing gate on the main road, the fence in front of the Christmas tree and the hedge opposite the Wheel that refuses to grow.

The use of the hall went down slightly as we lost the ballet dancing classes but these slots were taken up

by other hirers that seem to be mainly keep fit in one form or other, so year on year we seem to have the hall used slightly more than last year.

The fundraising efforts continued this year with the fireworks and the Christmas Fayre but the Fete was not held. The sums raised were just over £30000.00 and I congratulate all of the committees that organised these events and also the volunteers that all helped. Without the fundraising events the village hall would struggle to survive. With regards to this year, the Fete/Napfest is being planned for the 13/14/15 of June with a new committee running the event.

There have been a few problems this year that have arisen due to social media comments about the RAF that made the village hall's relationship with the RAF in danger of collapse. As the village hall chairman I apologise for the distress that was caused to the officers of the RAF by these comments. I have made it clear to the committee that these social media posts can cause issues that are amplified and exaggerated to such an extent that the posts are not only untrue but can cause untold damage to any relationships with our partners and supporters.

This year has seen Dennis and June Lynch leave the committee and move to the Chalfonts and I thank them for their help on the committee. We appear to have a smaller committee at the moment but we still need a secretary and someone to make sure that the hall is in good order. If you are interested in volunteering to help please get in touch with me via the website.

And lastly I would like to thank all of the committee members for their help and support in running the village hall, we have a great amenity for the village and your help keeps it going."

The village hall committee still has a vacancy for a secretary. Surely somebody in the village could spare a couple of hours a month to help run the hall. Please contact me via the village hall website for more details. chairman@naphillvillagehall.org.uk

It's been a busy period recently with key developments in Westminster and Mid Buckinghamshire.

A highlight was joining Kemi Badenoch to launch the national local election campaign in Buckinghamshire.

I have continued standing up for local farmers against Labour's proposed Family Farm Tax, supporting the latest rally in London to defend British agriculture and food security.

On housing, I've raised concerns about new EPC regulations. While energy efficiency is important, the rules must be fair and not place extra financial pressure on landlords or tenants during the cost of living crisis.

I am also backing the Save the Local Pub campaign. Pubs are vital parts of our communities, and we need policies to help them survive rising costs.

I also met with the Rail Minister to discuss HS2, East West Rail and Chiltern Railways, and will keep pushing for action on local issues including mitigation.

After struggling for three years, the Parish Council is finally at its budgeted, permanent headcount of 2.8 Full-Time Equivalents. We now have Kate Rogers, as Chief Officer (incorporating the role of Clerk), Marilyn as part-time Burials and Allotments Officer, Reginia as part-time Administrative Assistant, together with Jason, the Deputy Clerk and Services Manager. We hope that over the next few years they will become a stable and well-functioning Parish Council team.

We have completed the tendering for Open Spaces maintenance, that also covers allotments, the Garden of Rest, roadside hedge trimming and verge cutting (largely 30mph stretches) which is devolved to the Parish Council by Bucks Council. The outcome has not yet been publicly announced, but it was a competitive process, with eight companies bidding, and we were able to select bids that were significantly below the figure budgeted.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Tuesday May 6th at 7.30pm at Great Kingshill Village Hall. The focus this year is on road safety. Cllr Steve Broadbent will give an overview of Bucks Council's perspectives, priorities and initiatives. An HPC Councillor will cover current traffic issues, namely speeding, traffic volumes, parking and congestion around the Parish, potential solutions and next steps.

In the last week we caught 31 speeders in the parish, 202 In the month and 1780 in the year.


Local Tales. Gran's Hat

It is amazing to me the types and number of occupations that Naphill residents had in the past when the population was far fewer. The community was, of course, very isolated until the 1930's and in an isolated community I suspect that the number of jobs available was determined by the number of things that need doing for it to survive. When communication is improved as it has been since the second world war, residents can use buses or their own transport, their telephone and now the internet to work miles from the village. So that now, for many, the reason to live in the village is just historical or personal and not for a job of work. This has lessened the need to belong to a particular community.

When these hills first became occupied and a straggling village in medieval times, the occupants needed each other to survive – for the community to survive. This interdependence continues in some respect, even today with shops etc, but was very evident within the accounts of some recalling the nineteen twenties and thirties. My father, recounting his early days, described some of the characters who made up village life and the sort of work they did. Then the village had three public houses. The publicans all had other occupations. The one at the Black Lion was a butcher, at the Wheel the landlord had a workshop where he and others made tennis racquets to be sold in Lilywhites in London, the publican at the Oak (then in Oak Row) carried goods about the village on a donkey. Men could turn their hands to various jobs: plough, cut hair or thatch a roof, grow vegetables or mend shoes and so on. We even had our own undertaker - all necessary for an isolated community to survive. For few in the village was it a prosperous living and all were vulnerable to crop failures, to mass epidemics, exceptional weather and the whim of landowners, etc.

Women had to multi-task. Besides keeping a home and rearing children, they might care for the sick and elderly, take in washing, fetch water, pick and preserve fruit, do cleaning for others and tending animals, helping with the harvest and if housebound, earning pence making lace or beading – (elaborate patterns of small beads and sequins to be stitched onto dresses). Some also practised straw platting for hat making, outsourced from the industry in Luton and so on. At their end, for men and women, incapacity or old age could mean the Workhouse.

My grandmother, who largely taught herself to read and write, acted as the local midwife in the village and was highly regarded. She was widowed with a young



family in 1917. Like most villagers she attended one of the chapels in the village. My father recorded that on one occasion she wore a new hat to a service, only to find that a woman in the congregation was wearing an identical one. My grandmother never wore the hat again. The other woman was a 'stone picker' – a woman who made a living collecting stones from farmer's fields – a very lowly occupation

Women from earliest times seem to have an inferior status to men and been paid less, if at all. They had to find a husband or one of the few livings that single women could choose: perhaps in the church, nursing or housekeeping. Most might agree that it is a lot better now but still with a way to go. Inequality amongst the young may be reversing in some areas.

Even now, it is a contentious subject but for the sake of agreement, I am reminded of the adage that: 'men should make all the important decisions in life and women the less important ones, but women should decide which decisions are important and which are less important'.

Gordon the Birdman - Red Kites

Red kites were once abundant across the UK but were persecuted almost to extinction, so much so that by the 1950s only eight pairs and three solo males remained in central Wales. In the mid 1990s breeding birds from Europe were released locally from which an abundant population has been established. Overall, this reintroduction programme has been deemed a success with further introductions in northern England and Scotland.

Today, Red Kites are a common sight in the skies over the Chilterns and Oxfordshire. It is thought that the initial establishment of these populations was facilitated by the provision of extra food by local residents in their gardens. However, as the number of Red Kites continues to increase, supplementary feeding can quickly become counter-productive and we risk turning this conservation success into a nuisance species. Human – wildlife conflicts arise when humans and wildlife live in close proximity to one another and when interactions between them

are perceived to have negative consequences. Such conflicts can be difficult to resolve and usually it is the wildlife that comes off second best.

Over recent years, isolated incidences between humans and Red Kites have increased in the Chilterns leading to local mitigation measures. Reports include food being taken from barbecues, sandwiches from picnics and pet rabbits disappearing. These incidents usually occur during the breeding season when adult birds are looking for extra food as Red Kite populations continue to grow and spread into new areas like East Anglia and the Midlands. A plan is needed to mitigate and ideally avoid a wider human – wildlife conflict that could undermine this conservation success story.

Also in attendance were Squadron Leader Gilmore as well as the RAF High Wycombe Station Commander, Wing Commander Dennis.








Friends of Naphill Common

Naphill Common is the largest fully wooded common in the Chilterns, with an area of about 70 hectares (170 acres), lying between the villages of Naphill and Bradenham. Most of the Common belongs to the West Wycombe Estate, but a small portion is owned by the National Trust's Bradenham Estate. It contains many rare species and is a Site of Special Scientific Interest, as well as being part of the Chilterns Special Area of Conservation, and National Landscape (as Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty are now called).

Up to a century ago, it was grazed and so was open heathland containing a number of veteran trees, but today it is heavily wooded, mostly with self-seeded beech. These trees have grown too dense, so the Estate has a rolling plan to reduce their number to the recommended (by the Forestry Commission) 100 broadleaf trees per hectare. The Common was formerly described as a "juniper forest", but today only four specimens survive, so we've taken cuttings and have planted nine saplings, eight of which are thriving.





Nature

The Common has six 'dew ponds', natural depressions that fill with rainwater, which they retain, being lined with the clay that forms the upper few metres of the soil. Such ponds naturally dry out during the summer (some completely) and refill during the winter and the flora and fauna that inhabit them have adapted to this changing environment. The water is very pure and is a habitat for many species, including the Great Crested Newt.

The Common is home to over 80 species of birds, over 120 species of insects, over 200 species of plants and 400 species of fungi (all enumerated on our website), several of them locally and even nationally, rare.

Archaeology

The Common has a bank and ditch feature forming a D-shaped enclosure, typical of a 2,000-year-old Romano-British Farmstead, which would have contained a wooden roundhouse. There is a dew pond nearby, which would have been a useful water source.

At the 'bottom' (Bradenham end) of the Common are the mysterious 'Clumps' a series of ring-shaped banks on which were planted specimen trees, most not found elsewhere on the Common. It seems most likely that these were Victorian decorative features, added to enhance the grounds of Bradenham Manor.

Of more recent origin are the tank tracks, traces of which are still visible along the Common edge. During WW2 the former Broom & Wade factory in the centre of High Wycombe manufactured Churchill tanks which were (off) road tested on the Common.





The Friends of Naphill Common was set up in 2008, with aims:

- To conserve and enhance the natural, historic and cultural heritage of the Common.
- To promote the understanding and enjoyment of the Common.
- To encourage community involvement in caring for and use of the Common.

We are the largest subscription organisation in Naphill, with nearly 100 members paying our £10 pa subscription (a real bargain). Our regular activities include two guided walks each month and two working parties each week, which keep footpaths open and maintain the ponds (during winter, once the amphibians have left) which would otherwise fill up and gradually vanish. There are also annual events such as bat walks, fungus walks, 'minibeast safaris' (for children of all ages) and history walks, all of which are free and open to all.

Years 2, 5 and 6 had a special workshop from the NSPCC in their classrooms. They discovered how Childline has helped many children to speak about their worries and concerns. Childline is free and open any time of the day or night, and you can contact them on email, on their website, on a landline or on a phone. Remember if you have an issue, then don't be afraid to talk to Childline.

Year 5 recently took part in a first aid training course in which they learnt very important skills. If for example,

someone falls, they were shown how to put a person in the recovery position. They also were shown how to bandage a wound and help a person when they're in shock. One of the other important things they were taught is 'DRS ABC' which stands for: Danger, Response, Shout, Airway, Breathe and Cuts.

Just before Easter, some children had the opportunity to take part in 'Bikeability'. When Year 5 had their first aid training course they learnt the first aid ABC, but the Bikeability instructors taught them the bike ABC, which is Air pressure in tyres, Brakes front and back and Chain. It is very crucial that you check your ABC before travelling on your bike! The children started on the school playground and then once they had their confidence, they biked on Main Road. They also practised using the correct hand signals. Now, because of all their training, they are much safer on their bikes!



World Laughter Day - 4th May – Celebrating the benefits of a good laugh.

Sunday 4th May is World Laughter Day. We all know it's good for us to laugh, but do we know why?

Laughter as 'best medicine'

Charlie Chaplin was spot on when he said, 'A day without laughter is a day wasted'. Laughter is powerful medicine. It decreases stress as the brain releases endorphins or 'happy hormones' which flood our bodies. This strengthens our immune system, diminishing pain, and protecting us from the damaging effects of stress.

Laughter even protects the heart as it improves the function of blood vessels and increases blood flow, which can help protect us against cardiovascular problems.. A good belly laugh will leave your muscles relaxed for up to 45 minutes afterwards. It also burns calories. Laughing for 10 minutes a day can burn approximately 40 calories alone — which could be enough to lose 3-4 pounds a year.

Almost nothing works faster to bring your mind and body back into balance than a good laugh. With so much power to heal, the ability to laugh easily and frequently is a wonderful resource for dealing with problems, enhancing your relationships, and supporting your physical and emotional health.

GSOH?

It's not surprising that one of the most desirable traits in a partner is a 'good sense of humour'. If someone can make us laugh, they make us happy. They are usually the same people who don't take themselves too seriously and laugh at themselves too. Someone who laughs easily will usually find themselves very popular.

Laugh and the world laughs with you.

Laughter is contagious. Hearing someone else laughing primes the premotor cortical region of the brain and makes us laugh too. Hence the reason TV sitcoms use laugher tracks.

Don't know whether to laugh or cry?

Have you wondered how it's possible to laugh and cry at the same time? By crying, the body attempts to return to a regular level of functioning. There is evidence to suggest the same part of the brain controls both crying and laughing. During laughter, muscles in the diaphragm, abdomen and face are expanding and

contracting. This is why your face aches and belly hurts after a good 'belly' laugh.

Seeing the funny side

Shared laughter is one of the most effective tools for keeping relationships fresh and exciting. Laughter injects joy and companionship so brilliantly connects us to other people, making us feel good about ourselves and less alone. It is usually a shared sense of humour that helps us make friends in the first place.

Laughter helps us to open up, creating opportunities for us to share our feelings and laugh in the face of difficulty. If you bring humour into your thoughts, it helps to override the inner critic which many people suffer from. If we can remain playful, we find ourselves much more able to cope.

As children we laugh hundreds of times a day. Babies begin smiling during the first weeks of life and laugh out loud within months of being born.

5 ways to see the funny side of life

- 1. Spend time with playful people. They're the ones who easily find the humour and absurdity in everyday events.
- 2. Watch a funny movie or listen to a fun podcast instead of the News.
- Don't take yourself too seriously and laugh at your mistakes. Instead of feeling embarrassed or defensive, embrace your imperfections.
- 4. Find your inner child. Hang out with children they are experts on playing, taking life lightly and laughing at ordinary things.
- 5. Smile. Smiling is also contagious. Smile at people in the street, the person serving you a coffee, whoever. Notice the positive effect on them and you.

From the Vicarage

The costs of war are immense, especially to those who pay the ultimate price with the loss of their lives.

2025 marks the 80th anniversary of the end of the Second World War.

Thursday 8 May is Victory in Europe Day (VE Day). This is the day the German forces surrendered to the Allied powers.

Friday 15 August is Victory over Japan Day (VJ Day). This is the day Japan surrendered, in effect bringing World War two to an end.

In King Charles' Easter message, he praised all the humanitarian workers who provide aid during times of war and disasters. In his message on the meaning of Easter, the King spoke of the "paradox of human life" in which the heroism of humanitarian workers is contrasted with terrible scenes of suffering in war.

A new Humanitarian Medal has been launched, honouring those who risk their own lives to help others in emergencies and war zones, and the King hailed their selflessness and compassion.

On 8th May, our bellringers at Hughenden Church will join countless bell towers across the land in ringing their bells for half an hour, by way of celebration, to mark this anniversary.

We cannot fail to be moved when images of war and human suffering appear on our television screens – whether it depicts the war in Ukraine, Gaza, Israel, the West Bank or Lebanon, Sudan, or other lands, near and far.

Peace often comes at a great cost, and we should never take that sacrifice for granted, nor forget it.

Sacrifice is at the heart of the message of the Christian Gospel. Our loving heavenly father, sending his Son to earth, to fulfil the prophecies that promised a messiah, a saviour, who would die on a cross, though without sin, to draw all people to himself.

The hope that is found in putting our trust in Jesus Christ, promises new life, sins forgiven, and an invitation to follow in the footsteps of Jesus. That is the ultimate sacrifice which, as a Christian, I will be forever thankful for.

Growing Your Own

Well, what surprising weather! At the time of writing in April it is still blue, blue skies every day, all day. If I recall correctly, this unprecedented period started towards the end of February. March 2025 was the sunniest March in England since records began in 1910, with the country experiencing 59% more sunshine than its long-term average. With the east coast having periods of cloud from the North Sea in March, there must have been even much more sunshine in Naphill and Walter's Ash. By the time this edition of the Gazette is published we could be having torrential rain, but we shall look upon the period of continuous sunshine with envy. Why could we not have such weather in summer I hear you cry!

However, the timing of the sunny spell did not bring the garden many benefits, since few of our vegetables, fruit trees and fruit bushes were in leaf to benefit from the sun's rays. My overwintering garlic were well up, onion sets were just up and the poirée (silver chard) were revelling in the warmth, but that was about it. It was far too early for planting out or sowing vegetables which could have been cut down by frost. We can get severe frosts right up until the end of May. I can remember snow in Naphill and Walter's Ash twice on the first of June. Nevertheless, I tried an experiment this year since I am anxious for my first crop of climbing French beans. I sowed some before the end of February in the airing cupboard where they germinated in a week. Then to a sunny windowsill to grow on. I had sown

three seeds to a 3-inch pot, and they nearly all germinated. Near the end of March they went into the greenhouse to acclimatise to colder conditions, then into their final place in the vegetable plot, protected by fleece against frosts, in early April. Fingers crossed!

A year ago farmers could not plant out their potatoes since the soil was just mud. What a contrast this year!2023 and 2024 were years of what felt like almost continuous light rain and overcast skies. Global warming is making it more and more difficult - we simply do not know what this growing season will bring. I must tell you about my favourite vegetable, poirée, mentioned above. It is my favourite since it gives a good crop in late summer and autumn, followed by a further crop in spring. Winter 2024/2025 was exceptionally mild, the poirée kept growing and I kept cropping. In mid-January the leaves and stems were becoming manky, but by the end of March the new growth appeared and I started cropping again - much earlier than usual. So I was nearly able to take crops all through the winter. I did cover them with fleece during frosty periods, but the effects of the very mild winter climate were amazing. Global warming does have some benefits.



Holidays are important for our wellbeing. The root of the word lies in 'holy day' – historically days when people took

a break from work to observe religious feasts or go on pilgrimages. At its core, the holiday is a time to refresh and recharge our physical and spiritual batteries.

The holiday industry exists to ensure we have all we need to enjoy this time of refreshment, indeed, some places would not survive economically without income from tourism. Gibraltar obtains 30% of its income from tourism, welcoming a staggering 8 million tourists each year to its 2.6 square miles (I checked several sources as I could not believe these numbers). Of course, they do not all come at once, the vast majority coming just for the day, either as day trippers from Spain or as cruise ship passengers. That's an incredible average of 22,000/day, which seems a lot except that a large cruise ship can have 5,000 passengers and up to 3 cruise ships can call in one day.

It is delightful watching visitors enjoying the culture and sites of Gib. The busy hubbub along Main Street and in Casemates Square gives the town area a wonderful vibrancy. I always try to do my bit to welcome visitors, often stopping by families or groups and offering to take a picture of them all together with someone's phone. I can now confidently give directions to most places if stopped and asked, having even taken to carrying a couple of



freebie tourist maps in my handbag – the reaction I get when I produce one and give it to a disoriented tourist is priceless.

Of course, this all depends on having time to stop and help. I usually ensure I have plenty of time when heading out, but some days, I'm in a rush. It

can then be a bit of a challenge to view our visitors in such a positive light. There's tightly packed groups of people who saunter up Main Street, spread across its entire width, totally unaware that anyone else needs to be travelling in the same direction and ignorant of the fact that service vehicles need to use the street too. A polite 'Excuse me' can sometimes be met with looks of great disdain. Then there's the 'phone zombies' – people so engrossed in their phones that they are oblivious to everything else. They are wearing ear pieces so don't hear the 'Excuse me' – I've actually had to pat someone on the arm to point out that a service vehicle was right behind them (they didn't half jump when they saw the truck!)

Most of the time, it's really great to live in a place that people actually want to visit and have a little part in making them feel welcome. The Bible talks a lot about welcoming strangers, asking us to reflect on occasions when we were strangers ourselves.

Hold that thought when you are out and about this holiday season.

Will the real Oliver Twist please stand up!

Was there a real Oliver? Yes there might well

have been! There are some scholars who think that the novel may have been inspired by the story of Robert Blincoe. He was born around 1792. By 1796 he was an orphan living in the St Pancras Workhouse. At the age of 6 he was sent to work as a chimney boy but his Master returned him to the workhouse.

Eventually he was apprenticed in a cotton mill in Nottingham, learning how to make hosiery. He lived in a dormitory and was fed on porridge and black bread.

There was a happy ending, as eventually he owned his own cotton business, was married and had three children. He died of bronchitis in 1860. His story was serialised in a newspaper in 1822 and republished in 1830 - Dickens published Oliver Twist in 1837.
