





Chairman's Report

A committee meeting of the village hall was held on the 3rd February. There were 10 trustees present. At the start of the meeting a minute's silence was held in memory of Judy Whitehouse.

A new floor polisher has been bought at a cost of £800. The previous one had lasted over 25 years. The cooker also needs replacing and that will be a similar price.

The committee are having problems with HMRC due to the paperwork involved in claiming gift aid. Phone calls have helped to clarify the position but it could be an ongoing process!

The committee have decided that the broadband provider will be changed to Gigaclear, this will be a two year contract and hopefully it will help solve the problems that we have with the village hall's wi-fi system.

With a Bank holiday declared for the 80th anniversary of VE Day, the village hall will be running "Celebrations on the Crick" on the 5th May from 12 until 4, with 40's style music and hopefully dressing up in 40's style. Weather permitting

it will be held on the Crick. In the event of inclement weather it will be held in the hall. We hope that the village will join in by putting up red, white and blue bunting and union flags all around the village. At this stage of organising the event we hope to have children's entertainment and family competitions. Please see the Gazette and other media for more information as it becomes available.

The preparations for Napfest are well under way. It will be a 3 day event over the weekend of the 13 to 15 June. Many entertainments have been booked including bands, go karts and traditional children's games.

This year the Fireworks event will be held on the 8th November.



I'm delighted to report that my regular appeals for new blood have not gone in vain, and that following the departure of Peggy Ewart, after many years of dedicated service, we have welcomed Veronica Adsetts to our committee. AGM

Those who braved the somewhat inclement weather were rewarded with a fascinating presentation by Susie and Andrew Howard of Beech Dean Ice Cream, explaining the highs and lows of building their business from selling ices at the farm door to a multi-million pound enterprise. We are doubly grateful to Beech Dean both for their entertaining and informative talk and for a generous donation to our funds.

Common

As I write, Valentine's Day is fast approaching, when birds traditionally start nesting. There are (despite the cold, damp weather) plenty of signs of spring to be seen and heard. As well as snowdrops and crocuses in gardens, aconites and their small yellow flowers are coming out in the woods. Song Thrushes are calling, usually from the top of the tallest tree, and Great Tits have begun making their territorial call of TEACH-er TEACH-er. Spotted woodpeckers are drumming in the trees – the Great Spotted Woodpecker usually drums for no more than a second, so if you hear drumming going on for several seconds it may be the increasingly rare Lesser Spotted Woodpecker. Both these species have similar markings (mainly black and white with

red patches), but the Great is as big as a blackbird-size, whereas the Lesser is sparrow-sized.

Although it's just outside the boundary of the Common, you may have noticed that Vincent's Meadow and Pond (also know as Pickup's Pond) have been receiving attention from the Chiltern Rangers and volunteers, both local and from further afield. The work is at the behest of the Parish Council as part of their management plan for the several open spaces that they own within the parish.

Walks

Our monthly walks – a shorter walk (about an hour) led by Chris Miller at 10:30am on the first Wednesday of each month; and a longer walk (roughly 2 hours) led by Ron Collins at 9:25am on the third Monday – continue to be popular.

The parish council set its budget for 2025/26 at its last meeting and the corresponding request for precept from Buckinghamshire Council. Rising costs have meant budget increases. We have several asset maintenance jobs that need to be done in the next 18 months, and we need to keep our reserves at an appropriate level.

We have found a new contractor for grass cutting in the 30mph zone of the parish, who will start at the end of March.

The empty National Trust properties in Bradenham village are a concern and we are now awaiting a reply from the Housing and Planning Minister, Matthew Pennycook MP, to the letter our MP Greg Smith wrote to him on our behalf expressing our concerns.

The track to the cricket club in Bradenham is in a terrible state and our Chairman has written to the National Trust this time urging them to do some repairs as soon as possible.

Gordon the Birdman - Bird Watch

What an awful start to the year it has been. Cold, wet and continuous grey skies, the only thing getting me out of bed are the dogs (making me) and the birds. It has been a good few years since so many have been recorded in the garden with twenty-three species seen during the RSPB birdwatch, with three of special note: Regular visitors but not seen during the permitted hour, male Bullfinch, a pair of overwintering Blackcaps and two male Greenfinches, these being the first recorded since October 2021. Locally there are regular sightings of Little Egret and Common Snipe by the pumping station beyond Hughenden Village Hall, a Great White Egret near Funges Meadow and a Black Necked Grebe amongst four Little Grebes on The Dyke.


Nuthatch

It is at this time of year that raptors start pair bonding for the coming breeding season. Knowing preferred habitat of different species will narrow down options for which raptors are most likely to be seen, with the size of woodland varying between species. Goshawk and Honey Buzzard prefer large unbroken woodland, whereas Kite and Buzzard are more comfortable in mixed habitat, while Sparrow Hawk will nest in smaller areas of wood or even in suburban areas. In contrast Harriers are birds of open habitat with Marsh Harriers preferring large areas of reed bed and Hen Harrier open moorland, though they have been seen at Otmoor.

Red Kite

Goshawk, Buzzard, Sparrow Hawk and Red Kite are most active late February through to April, with Harriers April to early May. Raptors show a variety of flight behaviour involving more active, unusual flying patterns, rather than the soaring, gliding flight that many raptors use to conserve energy when hunting. Most raptors share several similarities, circling on high before going into a stoop then a fast ascent, but where Goshawks and Sparrow Hawks both fluff out their undertail coverts, Red Kites, Buzzards and Harriers will roll and loop with close passes between birds with talons locking, where birds will tumble for considerable distances before letting go. Harriers also perform food passes as part of their courtship.

January has come and gone - and it was certainly a busy one. In Westminster, I have been leading for the Opposition on the Employment Rights Bill Committee, scrutinising this far-reaching legislation line by line.

The Government's figures show that this Bill will cost businesses over £5 billion a year. I am concerned that this bill is failing to back businesses and drive real economic growth.

Closer to home, the closure of Hampden Row's Outreach Post Office is a deeply disappointing decision that will leave many residents without a vital local service. The Post Office claims "lack of customers" as the reason, but this fails to acknowledge the essential role it plays for those who rely on it - particularly older residents and those without easy access to alternative services.

I refuse to accept this closure without challenge. I will be raising this issue directly with the Post Office, urging them to reconsider and explore ways to keep this service running. Growing Your Own



The photo is an attention-getter as a reminder that it is March and it is time to get going in your garden or on your allotment. So I wanted to emphasise, right from the start, that there is no need to dig. Simply go for a "prowl with a trowel" and take out any deep-rooted weeds such as dandelions and docks. Then a little light hoeing, a raking off of the weeds and it is done, ready for seed sowing or planting out small plants., If you are taking over an overgrown allotment or have decided to turn part of your garden into a productive plot, then purchase a large sheet of black plastic, cover the plot, then put bricks or soil round the edges and wait for 9 months when all weeds will be dead. Then rake off the dead vegetation and start sowing and planting-out.

But why should we avoid digging? The reason is to preserve the soil structure. There are billions of soil microorganisms which help the crops and we do not want to disturb them - in particular mycorrhizal fungi which bring water and nutrients to the roots of the plants in exchange for surplus carbohydrates. If we dig we chop up the mycorrhizal fungi – and since their rate of growth is only about 6 inches per year it can take a long time for soil health to be restored.

According to official statistics, two-thirds of England's land is agricultural, with 38 % being arable land and 29% grassland. That 38% of arable land enables us to produce 18% of our fruit and 50% of our vegetables. Including

meat production, we produce only about half our food, so it is important that we do not take farmland out of production. Yet, that is what we are doing already with rewilding and other attempts to produce environmental and climate benefits. For the latter, the government have just said that by 2050 we need to take out of production another 9% of farmland. Yet our population is increasing rapidly – another 5 million in the next 7 years is the current estimate. The only way of feeding them is to import more and more of our food - and leaving ourselves more and more vulnerable to food price shocks and actual shortages. I should point out an inconsistency in the logic of "the powers that be". If we take an acre of carrots out of food production for rewilding then that acre of carrots will have to be grown in foreign lands where an acre of wild land will have to be ploughed up to grow carrots. Thus, the net effect on reducing carbon emissions will be zero – one will cancel out the other. Also, the 5 million new people mentioned above will need houses and all the associated infrastructure such as roads, railways, hospitals, schools, shops etc, leading to more loss of farmland. Chaos!! Therefore, keep your head down and grow your own!



Church News

Our new Children and Families Minister, Chris Coyston, is now fully installed and completed the family move to Princes Risborough at the end of January, just in time to throw himself into leading his first Family Service on 2nd February (Candlemas).

The usual St Michael's Family Service celebration of birthdays for young and old was adhered to, and the worship band was extended with Chris's guitar and singing from the Coyston family as well as longer serving members of the band. Chris is also taking part in the weekly Tiny Tots sessions and is organising a Pancake Party on 4th March from 4.30-6pm at Church House. (£1 per child, further details from Church Website). Pancake day (Shrove Tuesday) is of course the last day before Lent, when rich foods were generally used up before the days of fasting up until Easter, of which more next month.

With the vacating of Church House on the retirement of our verger, Arthur Johnson, discussions are taking place as to the best use of the facilities and resources that have now become available. This may mean a reorganising of space for use by our younger members: such as the Pancake Party.

With the improving weather (at least I think it is improving) we can see the churchyard springing back to life. As I write, the snowdrops are blooming and of course they spread a little further each year in their bid to cover the churchyard. The Eco group has worked hard to make 'God's Acre' even more welcoming to wildlife and there is a record of sightings inside the church for visitors to add their observations. We have many wild flowers as well as the planted species, trees young and old – and very old, but we also have a variety of insects and visitors from bigger species: birds in great variety (encouraged by our new bird boxes) and as morning and evening visitors may observe, rabbit families.

Churchyards throughout the UK cover an immense acreage of largely undisturbed and uncultivated land. Whether tended or rewilded they provide a haven for rare lichens, fungi and often part of a churchyard (not, I think, ours) can hold the last remnant of a local wildflower meadow.

Churchyards are a true haven for old trees, particularly the oldest trees in Britain, the ancient and veteran yews. Individual yew trees may predate Christianity, with some trees believed to be several thousand years old. (We do have an ancient yew, which can be observed to of the path

up to Church House, (see photograph below) There are about 800 ancient and veteran yews in the churchyards of England and Wales, which make up three-quarters of the British population. No other country has such a magnificent collection of these trees.

On Shrove Tuesday 4th March, our new Children & Families Minister, Chris, is organising a pancake party at Hughenden Church. Families with young children are invited to come along from 4.30-6pm, for lots of fun and games, a short celebration, followed by loads of pancakes with your favourite toppings!

Christians have marked the last day before Lent for centuries, seeing it as an opportunity for one final feast, before entering the solemn season of Lent. Traditionally families gather up all their most indulgent food and eat it with pancakes. In many countries Mardi Gras [meaning fat Tuesday] is carnival time.

The festivities are often accompanied by a time of

penitence in church, the ringing of Church bells, and the burning of last year's palm crosses, in preparation for the next day – Ash Wednesday, when we hold our first Holy Communion service of Lent, which is accompanied by ashing.

With the welcoming of that following dawn, comes the first day of Lent, which has been observed by Christians for centuries - a time for confession and inner self-examination.

In Matthew chapter four, we read:

Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He fasted forty days and forty nights.

Lent has its origins in this time of personal reflection which Jesus spent in the desert. He ate no food during that remarkable retreat, spending extended periods in prayer and reflection.

Despite being tempted by the devil to give into his hunger pangs, put God to the test by throwing himself off the highest point of the temple, and worshipping the devil, he fought back with scripture, the devil fled, and Jesus emerged out of the desert triumphant, full of faith and determination, ready to begin that journey which would lead from fishermen and tax collectors, to Pharisees and Roman Governors, as he fulfilled his mission on earth, to become the one perfect sacrifice, for the sins of the whole world.

Valerie and I first met Ann and Don (her late husband) in 1962 at Mosely Lodge Farm, where Muriel Piercy sought to introduce newcomers into Naphill society. It was a convivial group which didn't break up until our host had to retire to bed for an early rise to milk the cows.

It was the start of a long friendship which lasted till the present day. Ann was very proud of the fact that she came from Lancashire having been born in Bolton in somewhat poor circumstances, a fact she never forgot. She had a grammar school education and would have progressed to University but was severely handicapped by poor eyesight, a problem she had for her entire adult life. She learnt Braille early in her life as blindness from a detached retina was always a real threat.

Nevertheless, Ann led a full life entering into Naphill's very full social life. Much to her surprise and delight she found herself pregnant and to save her sight was advised to have an abortion, advice which she chose to ignore. The birth of Adam was achieved without the onset of blindness but the risk of a second child was too great a threat and the decision to adopt was taken, soon afterwards Jamie was added to the family.

Valerie who had founded the playgroup with the late Sally Harvey, enrolled Ann when Adam was three, and she became a helper. Ann joined several village organisations including the Women's Institute Drama Group and was a very successful actress, taking part in several plays. She was also a successful hostess and had many dinner parties, usually limited to two or three guests because of the limitations of size of the dining table.

In 1974, husband Don who was a Meteorologist working at air command, was posted to Cyprus and being an accompanied three year appointment, the family were very exited at the prospect and a farewell party was given at the Village Hall. Unfortunately at this time Cyprus was suffering from a political upheaval and Don's accompanied posting was cancelled. Ann who had made many preparations for leaving, had to cancel them. Don served two years away and Ann and family stayed in Redcot.

Not from the Vicarage Shippy-Mc Shipface and friends

My husband and I have been enjoying our semi nomadic lives in Gibraltar for nearly three years now. Consequently, we have got to know many seafarers and their vessels. These vessels, which regularly come and go, all have unique identities and I have come to regard them almost as friends.

For example, there's regular visitor 'Henneke Rambow', a huge German container ship. The first time I'met'her, I had gone to the kitchen to make a cup of tea and my entire field of view was filled with her bow. I watched the cargo handling teams load her with containers and the precision, care and co-ordination with which they worked lent the teams an almost balletic quality; it was beautiful to watch. Now, whenever she moors up alongside our kitchen window, it feels like a friend has come to call.

Recently, 'Deep Blue' arrived at the major repair yard. She is a pipe layer and something to behold. Over 200 metres in length, her highly specialist superstructure makes her look more like a floating fairground than a ship. There is a huge wheel for carrying pipes, that looks exactly like a Ferris wheel. Next to it stands something like a helter skelter and below that something resembling the paddle of a Mississippi steamer. I can't help but wonder at the physics that must have gone into her design, keeping her stable with all the superstructure that enables her to do the job she was made for.

Today, I was vaguely aware of the sound of bowthrusters thrumming through our flat and there is a new 'friend' at my kitchen window. 'Che' is a charter superyacht; when she was made, she was the second largest of her class in the world. This is an unusual vessel to see on our 'patch' as the super-yachts tend to moor in their own designated area or across the harbour from us to refuel. I'll be keeping an eye out for her from now on.

Watching the vessels come and go, I am aware how each is unique and has been specifically designed for a task. Our resident vessels 'Dragon Fish' and 'Oil Fish' are miniature tankers designed to take fuel oil out to vessels moored offshore (an operation known as bunkering). Their sister vessels 'Fly Fish' and 'Lion Fish' are designed to ferry crew and cargo to and from offshore vessels, along with 'Blythe Panther', 'Strider' and 'Phillippa Anne'. Each is designed for a specific task, which cannot be successfully accomplished by any other vessel.

In his letters, St Paul often reminds his readers how everyone has been created by God and is unique. He stresses how each person has their own place and tasks that cannot be filled or done by anyone else. Using the analogy of the human body, he makes a point – if the body were all nose, how could it eat? As I watch our ships, I celebrate and delight in their diversity and uniqueness. God created each of us unique, and the Creator celebrates and delights in the diversity and uniqueness that is within each of us too.

Local Tales - Things change

The way that we amuse ourselves changes rapidly. Being of an age I watch Television, read a book or a newspaper, check for emails on my computer, talk to friends and family on the telephone. What else should you do? Well, I become aware that I'm showing my age. Two of my younger family are teachers and they describe how some children, given a book, will talk to it and stroke a page to turn it, as they would a mobile phone. Perhaps they are right and the book is becoming obsolete. All will be on our mobile phone.

It is a shock to realise just how recent literacy is for the mass of the population. It is within the lifetime of the oldest of us. Are we heading for generations that will admire books in museums but not libraries? Will everyone grow to feel that the whole world is where they are? Even now if you visit a café you find that many, if not most, of the customers are elsewhere on their phones. We are citizens of the world in our hand. This, of course, is very new.

My great-great grandparents started a school at Loosely Row in the late eighteen hundreds and taught boys their letters and girls lace making. They record that very few villagers could read or write. People, if they received correspondence, would bring it to them to be read and ask them to reply. During the first world war, this often meant informing of the death of loved ones.

Until the end of the first world war, village communities were self-contained in many ways. Most found work locally. Around Naphill, the work may have been seasonal, men might fell timber in the winter and do farmwork in the summer. Others might dig clay in the winter and make bricks when frost had passed. As the furniture industry developed in High Wycombe, some, like the bodgers might make parts and cart them to the town. This was the beginning of change.

I remember my father, a Naphill man, reminiscing about when he met my mother and was asked, was she local. No, he replied, she was from Speen. In the age of the choice for the many of walking or cycling then Speen was a good step away. Most rural communities centred around the school, the village shop, the church and the pub if there was one. Local fairs and fetes brought the communities together and made many matches. Although those times seemed very parochial, my father suggested that people were not so narrow-minded as might be thought. It was not unusual for couples to set up together and even start a family before they married. They had to find a cottage and these were often tied to a job. Men had to find a farmer or landowner who needed a workman and if a vacancy became available the couple gained a home – just as long as the job lasted. This might mean moving from home to distant places. Girls could get farming jobs like tending chickens and many experienced domestic service from their early teens that took them to foreign parts. My mother was taken by a family to Stoke Poges. The world was widening and the signs were that outlooks were changing.

My grandfather recalled as a boy working for an old man doing carting work – using a horse and cart to carry goods. One day he said to my grandfather, "we've got a job to do boy, fetch the horse!". The man had two horses, Gramp asked which one. "the old one of course – wear out the old one first!" was the reply. "Well you fetch it!" my grandfather replied. He didn't mention the reaction.

The OCT scan provides the Optometrist with a high resolution, cross-sectional image of the ocular tissues at the back of the eye. This information enables them to evaluate the eye to make management and treatment decisions.

The scanning technique uses light waves to achieve high resolution pictures which the ophthalmologist can review at a later date, and they keep on file for you.

OCT imaging can be particularly useful in detecting and monitoring multiple macula conditions such as age-related macular degeneration and diabetic macular oedema. This technology allows them to explore treatment options more efficiently and effectively.

Slit Lamp camera



Not usually seen outside a hospital setting, this allows them to capture a high-resolution image of the front of the eye, lids and lashes as seen through the microscope lens.

This incredible device is very rare in any setting in the UK, so they love to shout about it. The MYAH allows them to measure, diagnose and monitor dry eye conditions very accurately. To diagnose the root cause of a condition, and there can be a few, means that they are also able to effectively treat it. There are eight of these in the Uk and they have FOUR!!

With all of this and their staff, they are truly able to take a preventative approach to eye care. I also tried some of their more advances ways to help keep your eyes healthy.

NuLids Treatment

This is an advanced treatment designed to improve lid and lash hygiene. It's non-invasive and uses a gentle oscillating motion to remove bacteria, debris, and oil from the eyelids and lashes, promoting healthy growth and function. It feels weird but not painful and my eyes have felt better for it.

In talking to Daniel it becomes apparent he has a real passion to help his communities to understand the need for modern eye care and how we can look after our eyes and help prevent future problems, and I know, as a photographer, I value my eyes.

! found the use of the latest equipment and their skilled opticians to be a step above other practices that I have been to, and everything was very well explained and easy to understand, which always helps in eyecare. Worth a visit, I think even just to meet them and talk through what they can do.

I asked Daniel to tell me about his career and aims for the future and below is what he had to say.

Daniel Jackson - A Little bit about me

My career currently spans a mind-boggling 25 years and most would describe it as fairly unique. I come from less than nothing, and as a youngster could easily have taken the wrong path. I worked hard to earn my degree as a Dispensing Optician while learning my craft under the watchful eye of the Queen's optician. Things like that do not really happen to people like me. I went on to manage some of the most prestigious practices in London, (among which was one of the oldest opticians in the world, and another where I designed glasses for the rich and famous). In my free time I volunteered at St Thomas hospital where I assisted patients with severe health conditions and very poor or no vision.

A little over 4 years ago, I purchased my first practice in Kent. The day after lock-down was lifted we opened our

doors to a flood of those in need. I had been planning the event for many years, daydreaming about what it would be like to steer my own destiny. With the help of my fantastic team, together we aimed to provide preventative health care delivered by specialists in a comfortable and friendly environment. Above all else, we wanted to make our services affordable and accessible to as many people as possible. Proudly, we made an impression on the local community with our approach, setting me and the company on a course from which there is no turning back.

The practice at Walters Ash was my second. We purchased it in August 2022 almost exactly 2 years after the first. It has taken some time to get things where I want them to be. We have refitted and made the place feel homely – we still have a bit to do to finish off but happy with the progress. Building on the foundations, we have taken our time to update the equipment in the two consulting rooms, ultimately ensuring we offer the best of everything we can. In the middle of 2024, we opened a dedicated dry eye suite, the most advanced in the area. And this year we will be introducing AI technology which, after a couple of visits, actually starts predicting changes to various eye health conditions. I am aiming high - there will not be a more advanced clinic in all of Buckinghamshire.





Chardonnay – the world's greatest white grape that is grown the world over and offers something wonderful whether you want to spend a tenner or a ton.

However, as with many things that are ubiquitous and loved by many, Chardonnay is a grape that many enjoy having a pop at. This is for one of two reasons. Firstly, they like to be a little left of centre and make sure everyone knows they're too cool to go along with the mainstream – the wine equivalents of those who mock all 'Swifties' whilst wearing their t-shirts of the latest hip indie band, yet secretly hum 'Karma' all day! Secondly, they actually just don't like it. My better half is very much in the latter camp; it doesn't matter how many different styles I try to trick her with, as soon as a drop comes within a centimetre of her mouth she senses what it is and displays both sounds and facial expressions that make clear her displeasure!

If you're one of those who thinks they don't like Chardonnay, I would strongly urge you to reconsider. There are so many different styles of Chardonnay out there, which makes it the most varied grape you could find. Not liking Chardonnay is like saying you don't like music. Sure, there are some who actually just don't, but most just dislike certain styles. If you Classical is your thing, then maybe a refined Burgundy from the Côte de Beaune, with impeccable balance and depth that brings everything together in a beautiful symphony. Prefer something a little crisper and more minimalist, yet still classical of undeniable artistic merit, like the string quartet who played so beautifully at whatshisnames wedding last year? Try a Chablis. If you're more into unashamed pop bangers who embrace their cheesiness, find a midpriced option from Australia or California. An Indie hipster who has never been as happy as when first hearing Bloc Party's 'Silent Alarm' album? Get yourself something from Marlborough or Hawkes Bay in NZ or the Limari Valley in Chile.

There are many things that affect what a Chardonnay actually tastes like. Without getting too technical (partly to avoid boring you, and partly to avoid overreaching the extent of my 'expertise''!), there are two areas that impact what the wine is like; geography and winemaking. The former includes

the terroir and the climate – grapes from warm climates will be heavier, higher in alcohol and more of a tropical fruit bomb, those from cooler climates will be higher in acidity and more down the apple and citrus fruit line.

Winemaking also has a huge impact depending on the use of OML – Oak, Malolactic Fermentation (MLF) and Lees:

- Oak Aging: Infuses Chardonnay with flavours like vanilla, caramel, toasted coconut, or spices such as cinnamon and clove. Also effects the texture, adding a rounder, fuller body to Chardonnay, giving it a luscious, velvety mouthfeel. It's like upgrading from skim milk to cream.
- MLF: Despite sounding like a science experiment gone awry, it's a very common and intentional winemaking process. During MLF, sharp malic acid (think green apples) is converted into softer lactic acid (think milk or cream). The result? A smoother, creamier texture and softer acidity in the wine. In Chardonnay, MLF often adds buttery, creamy flavours that people either love or loathe. It's what gives some Chardonnays that rich, velvety mouthfeel, and notes of buttered popcorn or custard. But not all Chardonnays go through MLF—cooler styles like Chablis often skip it, keeping the wine bright, zesty, and taut.
- Lees aging is the winemaking equivalent of slow cooking—it adds depth, texture, and complexity to Chardonnay by letting the wine rest on its spent yeast cells, or "lees," after fermentation. The lees are essentially the dead yeast cells and other particles that settle to the bottom of the tank or barrel during fermentation. Instead of immediately filtering them out, winemakers can choose to let the wine hang out with these lees for weeks, months, or even longer. This adds texture, body and savoury flavours like brioche, toast or almonds.

I'm not sure your life coach would agree, but I would recommend your New Years' Resolution be to try more Chardonnay, unless you really, actually don't like music...




