

A trustee committee meeting was held on 7 October. Among items discussed was the financial situation. Recently the trustees have commissioned work to the playground and decorating of the hall. This expenditure means that the village hall has just over the amount that is required for our reserves. With this in mind no other major expenditure will be undertaken until the funds have been replenished.

One of the long-term hirers of the hall, Frazer Morgan dancing has regretfully closed due to lack of children taking up dancing lessons, they were the longest running hirer, going back to the 1970s.

The Fireworks event will be held on Saturday 2nd. November from 5pm. There will be a Christmas Fayre in the hall on Sunday 1st. December from 1.00 pm, many stalls will selling gifts for Christmas.

Next year a group of people are going to hold a Fete type event on 13/14/15 June. According to Jason they are hoping to hold an outdoor cinema, traditional children's races, and a music event.

There is also another group who would like to use the hall and the crick for fundraising events during the year, a bingo night has been suggested along with a magic night and even a film night in the hall. So, next year the village could have multiple entertainment events!

Now on a completely different note, I reminded the Trustee committee members of their responsibility in reference to not bringing the village hall trustees into disrepute. There was an occasion this last year when a social media post was picked up and was then $expanded \, by \, people \, who \, did \, not \, know \, the full facts. This$ unauthorised media content very nearly led to one of the village hall's main long term partners withdrawing all assistance from the village hall and village events. This could have had disastrous effect on the village hall fundraising. We rely on all of the organisations and businesses that support the village hall and the village and clearly through unauthorised comments we offended one of our mainstay supporters. The village hall is thankful that we continue to have the support of all our organisations and business partners.

Remembrance Sunday Service, Naphill Village Hall 10th November at 2.30pm





The Innovative Composter

I am always trying out something new. This time my innovation concerns compost. I have two large vertical compost bins in the garden and they take kitchen vegetable and fruit waste, lawn clippings, soft debris from the flower borders and end-of-season vegetable plants. Since about half our food is imported, my compost contains pineapples from Costa Rica, bananas from everywhere, oranges from Spain, etc, etc. Since soil micro-organisms are very small (over a billion SPECIES in a handful of soil), this means that these foreign peelings are covered with micro-organisms, thus micro-organisms from all over the planet are in my compost. I hope they get on with the locals. Perhaps invasive species of micro-organisms along with invasive muntjac deer, grey squirrels, etc?

When a compost bin is full I tip partly-rotted material into the bottom of the other compost bin then use the well-rotted compost for all sorts of purposes in the garden. However, when the old bin is nearly empty I jealously guard the very-well rotted compost at the bottom, all black, crumbly yet damp, the crème de la crème, the "Real McCoy", which is at least two years old. And its use? This year, when planting out vegetable plants, I have tried an experiment. I have dug a hole deeper than normal for the plant, then put in a trowel-full of the Real McCoy, then the plant, then soil round the plant. On the greenhouse staging, rather than using growbags I buy five 60-litre bags of multi-purpose compost, open the tops, mix-in small yellow fertiliser granules then plant my cucumbers and peppers. However, the 60-litre bags just contain an inert growing medium such as peat or coir plus a tiny amount of fertiliser to get plants growing. I doubt whether the 60-litre bags contain soil micro-organisms which are essential for bringing trace elements to the roots of the plants. So this year, when I put in a trowelfull of Real McCoy then put the plant in it, I was sure that the plant would benefit immediately from the trace elements but also that the micro-organisms would spread throughout the 60-litre bag.

What have been the results of the first season of my experiment? In the greenhouse the cucumbers, peppers and tomatoes have been the best ever. In the vegetable garden the newly planted strawberry plants were much bigger than the old ones and produced much, much larger strawberries. I had better crops of elephant garlic, maincrop onions, poirée (silver chard), beetroot, leeks, dwarf French beans and climbing French beans (although the crops of beans were late because of the overcast, cool and wet season). The sweetcorn was a disaster with plants 18 inches high instead of the usual 7 feet, but I think that was a result of the overcast, cool and wet season). So, all in all, my experiment with the Real McCoy was a great success and that is how I shall be growing my crops next year.

November? How can that possibly be the case? Though, as you may have noticed there is a definite chill in the air, as well as a deal of rain, but the real sign is the slow turn of our Chiltern beech trees to all shades of gold and copper.







Over eighty years may separate them, but for one ex-RAF Corporal and a group of schoolchildren, age really is no barrier to lasting friendships.

A chance glance at an article in the RAF News about a nursery changing to become RAFA Kidz prompted eighty-seven-year-old Brian Hanks from Lincolnshire to write to his granddaughter (who works at the Medmenham branch of RAFA Kidz). The letter was read out to the enthralled children at the nursery. Little did anyone know that a pen pal relationship between Brian, who has ten grandchildren of his own and the school children would quickly develop.

"The children wrote a letter back to Brian asking him about his time in the RAF, whether he flew aircraft, his hobbies and any favourite colours," said Amanda Brown, Manager of RAFA Kidz. "His letters are displayed on our wall with his responses." During his time in the RAF, Brian worked as a Ground Radar Fitter. He later worked in Germany on a flight station and oversaw the installation of missiles on UK aircraft. There was quite a revelation for his granddaughters when they found out that, unbeknown to them that their grandfather had also worked as an engineer on the iconic Concord!

In an age of email, texting and Skype, the children favour an age-old form of communication; "They requested that Brian post them a letter back as they love going to the post box to send their replies," said Amanda. The school is hoping to send letters to their veteran pen pal every couple of months.

In July Brian was invited down to Medmenham to meet the excited children in person. Due to his deafness the children wrote down their questions for him to answer. Showing sepia pictures of himself in uniform to his little fans together with the hat that he wore encouraged the children to dress up in RAF, navy and army uniforms from their dressing-up box.

"Brian was exceptionally good with the children. He loved that people wanted to talk to him about his Air Force days. He really interacted with everyone and would ask questions back. Although they sat crossed legged in a circle, they all got closer to him as his stories became more animated," said a delighted Amanda.

Before departing the jovial ex-Corporal was given a thank you card made by the children together with some chocolates. So keen were the little fiveyear-olds for him to stay that they clung to his leg as he left!

Many thanks, Brian for taking the time and trouble to educate our youngsters on times gone by.

RAF High Wycombe Local pilot gains silver-edged wings



Brownie leader, RAF High Wycombe employee and allround village stalwart Ruth Daly had a lot to smile about recently when she saw her eldest daughter Natalie graduate from RAF Cranwell as a fully-fledged RAF pilot.

For decades many a child has dreamed of being a pilot, more so since the 'Top Gun' phenomenon of the 1980s. In reality few are chosen to undertake the arduous task of pilot training. Due to a combination of lack of training aircraft and trainers, the normal three-year course has taken nearly six to complete. The dedication and resilience to become a pilot has been immense, but for Ruth, she is still surprised by Nat's choice of career.

"As a youngster Natalie did ballet, girl guides and music. One day she said she wanted to join the air cadets. We couldn't work it out! She didn't know anyone, but after attending Beaconsfield Air Cadets two evenings a week she was hooked. It really inspired and motivated her," said Ruth and husband Paul.

Natalie studied Politics & Economics at university and quickly joined the Air Squadron. On attending RAF Cranwell and completing aptitude tests to discover what branch would suit, Natalie passed the tests for pilot training and the rest as they say is history.

The young Flight Lieutenant has now completed her elementary flying training and phase two multi-engine

basic training on a Phenom aircraft. Each pilot is allocated to a particular aircraft known as a 'platform.' This could be a C17 or a Voyager. For Natalie she will be at RAF Brize Norton to learn to fly an A400. Once qualified the plucky pilot will be doing anything from flying personnel around the world to humanitarian missions.

And Ruth's thoughts on her daughter's graduation? "Paul & I are really proud that she had stuck at it. It has been a rocky road. There have been times when she has really doubted herself. But she has made it."

Flight Lieutenant Daly will be the second woman ever to qualify to fly an A400.

During the recent graduation ceremony at RAF Cranwell a pair of double Air Force wings badge was pinned to the lapel of each graduating pilot, along with a tradition that dates back to the Second World War: Each officer is given an authentic silver six pence which is sewn into the back of the badge. The coin is a symbol of good luck.

Congratulations to Flight Lieutenant Daly and may you have many happy hours up in the air!

A Message from our MP - Greg Smith

After a short recess over the party conference period, Parliament is sitting once again and I already have a packed Parliamentary agenda ahead.

As well as attending the Conservative Party Conference, I was able to use the time away from Westminster to focus on constituency work, including several local events, visits, and my regular pub surgery drop-ins which are always very popular with constituents.

Since returning to Parliament after recess, in my role as Shadow Roads Minister, I questioned the Secretary of State for Transport on the Government's commitment to road repairs. Last month I also responded to the Government Consultation on Proposed Reforms to the National

Planning Policy Framework. The Government appear to want to build indiscriminately all over our countryside and have been consulting on changes to planning to enable just that.

As your Member of Parliament, it was my promise during the election to always stand-up against assaults on our countryside, including vital farmland, and I won't stop defending Mid Bucks from those who would like to build over Bucks' landscape.

Bonfire Night & Beyond

It's that time of year again...whether you love them or hate them, firework season is upon us. This can be very exciting for many people, young or old, but spare a thought for our pets, who may find this time of year incredibly distressing. This, coupled with Halloween and potential visitors trick or treating, can be very frightening.

Here are some more common signs that your dog might be fearful or stressed during fireworks:

- Whining or barking: your dog may voice their distress through whining, whimpering, barking, growling or crying
- Clinginess: they may seek comfort by jumping up, staying close, or by seeking attention
- Excessive panting or drooling: anxiety can lead to increased panting, drooling or lip-licking
- · Holding their tail down between their legs
- Hiding: they might try to find a safe or secluded spot to hide, like under furniture
- Trying to escape: in extreme cases, your dog may attempt to escape to get away from the noise
- Trembling or shaking: your dog may visibly shake or tremble when fireworks are going off

There are a few things you can do to help your dog avoid any unnecessary stress in the run up to fireworks:

- Walk your dog during daylight hours if your usual routine involves a walk after dark, replace it with simple games, or treats indoors, so that your dog has some mental enrichment to replace the physical exercise.
- Classic FM have dedicated calming music programmes for pets during November.
- Provide toys and treats, such as kongs/lick mats to keep your dog occupied when the fireworks start and wherever possible, stay with your dog, doing usual activities, without making a big deal of the noises. If your dog can see that you are not reacting, this can help to decrease their anxiety.
- Create a safe space, this can be as simple as putting
 a blanket over a table, so that your dog can hide
 under it. If your dog is used to sleeping in a crate, put
 blankets over the top and on the inside.

 Keep the curtains and windows closed to muffle firework sounds and flashes.

By gradually desensitising your dog to loud noises over a period of time, you can teach them to associate these sounds with something positive, instead of something to be scared of.

Why not go to an organised firework display instead of hosting a party at home? You'll be supporting your local community, socialising with friends and neighbours and potentially keeping pets free from stress!

Gordon the Bird Man

There is no better place to be than on the foreshore of The Wash at Snettisham on a clear afternoon in late autumn and winter. Snettisham sits on a small ten mile stretch of the north Norfolk coast which faces west, the only area of the east coast to do so. If you consult the tide tables and choose a clear day you will witness the sight of about 85,00 birds being driven towards you by an incoming tide. First to rise are the waders whirling in unison over the water before moving overhead to roost on the banks of the lagoons situated just behind the shingle rise. First heard, then seen are countless skeins of Geese flying in vee formation overhead to land in the stubble fields further inland, all of this against a backdrop of the reds and golds of the setting sun, absolute magic.

The Wash is our largest estuary covering some 12,000 acres and supports around half a million wildfowl and 250,000 waders over winter. It can do this for two reasons, six rivers and a few streams discharge fresh water containing nutrients and minerals into

The Wash, mixing with salt water sustains billions of invertebrates. Secondly, each group of birds have their own feeding strategy. On the foreshore are Turnstones and small Plovers searching the high tide line for small invertebrates like Sandhoppers. Further down are Sanderlings dodging incoming waves like clockwork toys seeking what the latest wave has uncovered. Next are Avocets with their sideways movement sifting through the top layer of mud for shrimp. A little deeper, probing for small worms and molluscs are Dunlin, Knot, various Sandpipers and Shanks. Deeper still, searching for Oysters, Mussels and crustaceans are Oystercatchers and Godwits who can prize them open with their chisel shaped bills. Deepest are the 25cm bills of Curlew probing for Rag and Lugworms, while above the mud are the wildfowl feeding on the Eel Grass beds.

One of the great sights of the birding world and it's almost on our doorstep.

Christians have always tried to live their lives with gratitude, creating and embracing moments of joy in order to live in a way that celebrates their faith. It's a good attitude to have; as autumn dies and winter creeps in, perhaps you can find moments of joy and a bit of hygge to lighten the darkening days.






October News Reports

Kindness works wonder to break down social barriers. It's one of the most wonderful ways we can show someone how much we care about them. Studies show that performing acts of kindness is a powerful tool against the symptoms of depression and anxiety and can promote overall well-being.



What's the chemical reaction of kindness?

Acts of kindness:

- release endorphins those feel-good chemicals in the brain, which work to elevate our mood and reduce physical pain.
- reduce stress by lowering levels of cortisol, the body's stress hormone, so being compassionate and helping others creates a sense of calm and reduces anxiety.

 release oxytocin, the hormone responsible for love and bonding, dilates the blood vessels, improving heart health and lowering blood pressure.

The Need to Belong

- Helping others can provide a powerful sense of purpose and belonging which is a powerful boost for our self-esteem.
- It shifts the focus away from our personal difficulties.
- Kindness strengthens social bonds, creating more meaningful relationships, building trust and cooperation.
- Regular acts of kindness in a community or workplace creates an environment where people feel connected and valued.

Kindness in Hypnotherapy

What can be even more powerful is that kindness to others often encourages us to be kinder to ourselves. As the 'summer' disappears as if it never even came, the rain continues to batter and beat our souls into submission, and the dark nights and mornings creep upon us like a silent predator, devouring the warmth and light, many of us will turn to the only antidote – a bottle of red. Therefore, I thought I'd pen some ramblings about a white grape...!

There was a time when the white shelves of any supermarket wine section were pretty much filled with a few Marlborough Sauvignon Blancs, some retro styled chunky Chardonnays and 84 different Pinot Grigios. However, nowadays there is a wider and more eclectic range of options that are easily accessible and so it is a great time to branch out and try something slightly less mainstream.

Do you enjoy the light, tangy and fresh nature of a good old Pinot Grigio? Is the Pope a Catholic? Does a bear do its business in the woods? In many ways it is one of the perfect socialising wines as it tastes nice and refreshing but doesn't need too much thought and introspection whilst supping it. But let's face it – putting a bottle in the fridge for later hardly creates a deep stirring of excitement and anticipation. Therefore, I'd urge you to pick up a bottle of Grüner Veltliner.

Grüner Veltliner sounds wonderfully, almost ridiculously, Germanic. I can't decide whether it's more like a grape variety or a harsh-syllabled pet name for an Austrian's darling lover. However, it is definitely a grape and one that is synonymous with the world of Austrian wine. As the old saying goes – 'Love and Marriage... goes together like a Grüner Veltliner and an Austrian Oenophile.'

What to expect? Acidity and plenty of it. Flavours of lime, grapefruit, apples, a little nuttiness, white pepper and spice. It tends to be lithe, athletic and dryly focused. However, the spicy undertones make it an intriguing and alluring sip, offering something a little different.

What's that you say? That sounds interesting and all that, but you struggle to understand what a wine is really like unless someone describes it in the form of a long, meandering and quite bizarre metaphor? No problem...

I'm pretty sure if Grüner Veltliner were made human, you'd see them on the slopes of Zell am Ziller. You'd be skiing along sloppily, happily and without full attention, when out of nowhere this beautiful Austrian flies from behind you and swerves out of your way as you hog the slope, unaware that she was flying effortlessly down at Olympic pace until you almost

caused a whole heap of mess and offer further proof to reputation of Brits abroad and our inability to not be pillocks wherever we go.



The Grüner would 100% stop and slide over, shouting all sorts of angry German words at your face, before realising you're a British moron and quickly transitioning to perfect English to admonish you like the foolish, errant school boy you now feel as tall as.

Without pausing for breath, she swooshes away down the mountain quicker than you can say 'lch mochte ein weiner schnitzel, bitte.' You pause, dumbfounded and shaken by the whole experience.
